## Honouring his legacy

## Mr Farouk Butt - the South Leeds hero who touched the hearts of thousands, leaves legacy behind

dedicated his life to working for Leeds communities for over three decades, sadly passed away following his short battle with cancer.

Mohammed Farouk Butt, Chairman of Hamara Centre, passed away peacefully at his home on 17th February. Mr Butt came from Pakistan as

seven-year-old child, with his family in the 1950's and settled in the Holbeck area of Leeds. At school he would be found actively engaging in sports, and even successfully clinching the much-contended position of captain for his school rugby team,

despite being the only south

Asian male there.

At one point Mr Butt was studying to become a doctor, he loved to read books, and his mother would often find he'd fallen asleep at his desk during

his late night study sessions.

Having chosen to start a career in the building trade during the 80s Mr Butt at one point had his own wood yard, where he sold reclaimed timber.

But it was his vision of helping deprived south Asian communities that led him into the charity sector.

What we now know as the Hamara Centre in Beeston, was senior members of the Asian community, and was called South Leeds Elderly Group (SLEG). They were based in a small office with only three staff.

At this time he also held a job at Heathrow airport, and upon finishing his shift, is said to have made his first stop at the Hamara Centre every time before heading to and returning from his shift in London.

He realised over time, the Asian community-especially the elderly found it difficult to have access to seek help, such as filling out forms as many of this generation did not speak, read or

write English. Therefore, SLEG became a safe haven for the elderly.

Over-time Mr Butt realised there was a higher demand for accessible community services, and he successfully secured one million pounds to build large centre to cater for the whole community. This is when Hamara was set-up, and at one point there was over 70 staff working at Hamara.

The centre became renowned for holding firm to delivering numerous proliferous programmes to both the young and elderly, both Asian and non-

More recently, Mr Butt's biggest challenge was overhauling Cockburn Sports hall for which the Hamara Centre had acquired a lease.

His dream was to demolish the old hall and build a new sports hall with training rooms in replacement.

After numerous challenges over four years, making tweaks to push successfully push planning approval of the new state of the art building, as fate would have it, it was finally approved on a day after his death.

Mr Butt is survived by his loving wife, two boys and two

He was different, he was always thinking about inclusion and diversity. Hamara centre trained people and helped them to gain education and employment.

There were many challenges and obstacles to overcome, Mr Farook embraced these challenges and turned it to a very successful community centre. We had no place to run the project, with very limited resources, but it was he who always believed that one day we will have a place which will be for everybody. He proved it,

Islamic Relief UK partnered with Leeds United Foundation and Give a Gift to distribute 500 essential food packs to vulnerable people in Leeds including the homeless, asylum seekers, refugees and women who have suffered domestic abuse.

The NCA's Serious Crime Analysis Section (SCAS), which supports police investigations into serious sexual assaults committed by strangers, released the new figures showing that the number of female victims of online dating-related sexual assaults aged 19 and under has increased since 2016.

SCAS reviewed data from 671 sexual assault cases reported to the NCA, which occurred between 1 April 2003 and 21 March 2021 following a first face-to-face meeting, after initial contact via an online dating website or app.

dating website or app.

These update the findings of a 2016 report, which examined the 163 cases identified between April 2003 and July 2015.

The new data shows that while the levels of this type of offending has remained fairly stable since 2015, the proportion of reports from female victims aged 19 and under rose from 12% to 22%, with the proportion of male victims in this bracket rising from 25% to 31%.

The largest proportion of both male and female victims were still aged 20-29, accounting for 40% of cases

The victims in 83% of the 671 cases were female, 17% were male; a slight change from the previous report with a 2% increase in the proportion of male victims

Only offending on SCAS databases has been analysed. It doesn't include unreported incidents or offences which police forces have not sent to the NCA to be examined.

Louise Vesely-Shore, Principal Analyst in the National Crime Agency's SCAS team, said: "Although there hasn't been an overall increase in these offences since our initial report in 2016, it is notable that this form of crime continued during the pandemic, despite the substantial restrictions on people's lives.

"A sexual assault victim is never at fault and we do not want the circumstances in which these attacks take place to cause anyone to doubt that. We want victims to feel confident reporting it to the police."

The NCA published its findings alongside separate research collated by the BBC for its documentary, 'Dating's Dangerous Secrets'. This showed that 37% of dating app users have reported someone for inappropriate behaviour, 63% have felt uncomfortable on a date initiated via a dating app and 33% have experienced either harassment or abuse on such dates.

## **Dating Online?**Play it safe when you

### Play it safe when you meet face-to-face

The following safety advice was previously developed by the NCA along with Get Safe Online for users of online dating websites.

- Plan it. Say it. Do it.
- It's your date. Agree on what you both want from it before you meet up. Don't feel pressured to meet before you're ready or for any longer than you're comfortable with – a short first date is fine.
- Meet in public. Stay in public.
- The safest plan is to meet somewhere public and stay somewhere public. Make your own way there and back and don't feel pressured to go home with your date. If you feel ready to move to a private environment, make sure your expectations match your date's.
- Get to know the person, not the profile.
- The way people interact online isn't always the same face-to-face. Don't be offended if your date is more guarded when meeting in person or if things don't progress as fast face-to-face.
- Not going well? Make your excuses and leave
- Don't feel bad about cutting a date short if you're not keen. You don't owe the other person anything, no matter how long you've been chatting or what's been suggested
- If you're raped or sexually assaulted on your date, help is available.
- No matter what the circumstances, sexual activity against your will is a crime.
   Police and charities are here to help and support you.

Reasons why readers, young and old, choose to get their Covid-19 jabs

hile we are well on the way to moving out of the pandemic, while the UK Government rolling back restrictions and ending Plan B measures, the infection rate of Covid-19 is still high.

Uptake of the vaccine has been very high across the UK with people booking their additional booster jabs, however there are some people who are still apprehensive about getting the jab which is

understandable given the amount of misinformation out there.

Two doses of the vaccine are still the best way of protecting you against Covid-19 and it's variants, with booster jabs giving you around 90% protection shortly after administration.

We know that there are many reasons people are doubtful about getting the vaccine, so we wanted to speak to people from our community to find out what convinced them to get the vaccine.

Every adult in the country now needs to get a Covid-19 booster vaccine, because two doses does not give you enough protection against catching Omicron.

From the outset the evidence has been clear: Black, Asian and minority ethnic groups had higher rates of infection, serious disease, and deaths from Covid-19.

## "My entire family and I are fully vaccinated... this is the best way of protecting ourselves"



24-year-old Information Analyst Shivali was still studying her Master's degree when she got her first Covid-19 jab. She knew instantly that this was the best way of protecting her self and her family.

"I am a very family-orientated person, and not being able to see

family members outside of my home really hit me hard during the first lockdown," says Shivali.

"At the time I felt helpless, but eventually started to make use of the spare time I had to try to help myself and others around me keep a positive mindset.

"It's been brilliant to see everyone in our communities coming together and making a concerted effort to ensure everyone understands the importance of vaccinations and has access to correct information," she adds.

"I got the vaccination whilst I was still studying, and took it as soon as I could, without hesitation.

"My entire family and I are fully vaccinated because we understand that this is the best way of protecting ourselves from more serious implications of Covid-19, and restoring some kind of normality to life.

"Without the vaccinations I know I'd be more prone to catching the virus and passing it on. Many of my older family members have conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure, I didn't want to cause them any more health problems.

"It's crucial that we all get the vaccine to protect ourselves and our loved ones. No one wants this pandemic to last any longer, the sooner we are vaccinated the sooner we can get out of it"

### Around 96.3% of pregnant women with asymptomatic Covid-19 were unvaccinated

Dregnant women who have not yet had their first, second, third or booster dose of a Covid-19 vaccine are being urged to get their jab as soon as possible.

Data from the UK Obstetric Surveillance System shows 96.3% of pregnant women admitted to hospital with Covid-19 symptoms between May and October 2021 were unvaccinated, a third of which (33%) requiring respiratory support. Around 1 in 5 women who are hospitalised with the virus need to be delivered preterm to help them recover and 1 in 5 of their babies need care in the

Geetanjali Singh, an optician, who has recently given birth to her second baby and has been fully vaccinated said: "I gave birth to a healthy baby boy just before Christmas. I am so grateful that the guidance on pregnancy and the Covid-19 vaccine changed last year.

"Plus my husband contracted Covid whilst I was pregnant, so being vaccinated gave me peace of mind that I and my baby had some protection.

"My advice to any pregnant people unsure about having the vaccine is

speak to your midwife or health professional and make an informed choice.'

The vaccine is the best way to protect you and your baby. Being pregnant can put you at greater risk of getting seriously ill with Covid. which increases the chances of your baby being born prematurely, or even being stillborn. If you're pregnant, get vaccinated or boosted now. Go to nhs.uk/ covidvaccination



### Covid-19 Vaccine and Pregnancy

## North with highest at-risk gamblers

Launch of new addiction clinics' as figure show 2.2 million people have gambling addiction

The other five NHS gambling addiction clinics in London, Leeds, Manchester, Sunderland and a national children and young person's pilot clinic will inform the rollout of further gambling clinics when the services are evaluated later this year.

The north of England has the highest prevalence of at-risk gamblers, with 4.4% of adults in the North West and 4.9% in the North East being at the most risk of addiction addiction.

Between April and December last year, 668 people with the most severe gambling addiction issues were referred to NHS gambling clinics – up from 575 during the same period in 2020 – a 16.2% increase.

The news comes alongside a letter from NHS mental health chief Claire Murdoch to Gamble Aware, confirming that the NHS will be fully funding its own gambling services from April - bringing the support in

line with other NHS services.

The decision follows feedback from patients and clinicians opposing the conflict of interest from the

gambling industry, which generates profits of over £14 billion a year in the UK, in funding treatment for addiction.

Research published by Public Health England (now the UK Health Security Agency) last September also estimated around 0.5% of the adult population, around 2.2 million people, are likely to have some form

of gambling addiction.
NHS mental health director Claire Murdoch said: "Gambling addiction is a cruel mental health condition that can devastate people's lives our pilot clinics are already having a lasting impact in helping people to take back vital control of their lives.

"The opening of two new gambling clinics in May, as a part of our £2. billion investment into mental health services, will mean we can help even more people with the most serious

gambling problems.

"It is also absolutely right that the NHS now funds these clinics independently, recognising the harmful effects this addiction can be a solution." have on the nation's mental health, that predatory tactics from gambling companies are part of the problem, not the solution

Health Minister, Gillian Keegan said: "The detrimental impacts of harmful gambling are stark and widespread – it affects people's savings, relationships and health.

"I am committed to protecting people harmed by gambling, including through supporting treatment and recovery at the specialist NHS gambling addiction clinics as part of the NHS Long-term Plan investment of £15 million to expend these specialist services." expand these specialist services.

"The new gambling clinics will help ensure more people can access

the help they need to tackle their gambling addiction."

Later this year the NHS will launch a new Gambling Harm Network and Clinical Reference Group, which will bring expertise together and enable clinical teams to share best practices for helping to

treat gambling addiction.
Gambling addiction if it takes hold can destroy lives. Nick Firth, aged 31 from West Yorkshire, struggled with a gambling addiction for 12 years. Feeling ashamed to admit he had a problem, the addiction also took over his life to the extent he would beg, borrow, and steal money to fund it,

straining relationships with family and friends.

Nick finally reached out for help from NHS gambling services during the peak of his addiction in January last year, when he felt suicide was the only way out. With his own NHS support worker, Nick underwent group cognitive behavioural therapy to help treat his addiction and as a

result, hasn't gambled since.
Nick said: "Gambling addiction took over my life to the extent I was suicidal and relationships with my family and friends had broken down.

"The team at the NHS gambling addiction service have helped completely turn my life around, engaging with NHS services is one of the best things I've ever done it's helped me get control of my life back and I'm rebuilding trust with my family and friends, once again having happy and healthy relationships with people close to

me.
"Anybody out there who is struggling with addiction should know they are not alone, while there is no quick fix, there is help out there that can help treat your addiction and seeking help is the best thing you can do to help yourself get better.'

In January 2020, NHS mental health director Claire Murdoch wrote to gambling companies outlining actions they should take to improve the odds for people struggling with addiction.
Other than the restriction of bets bv taken credit implemented when the Gambling Commission outlawed the practice, the gambling industry continues to offer customers VIP packages and streams live sports, all of which can be potentially harmful to those struggling with addiction.

## "Jinn is something that I've grown up being told stories about as a child," says prize-winning author Aneesa Marufu

**Manchester-based Aneesa Marufu** has been inspired by both her South Asian-British heritage and her experiences as a second generation immigrant. She wanted to write a book for teens that discusses - in a fantasy setting - ideas of identity, belonging, an immigrant experience and much more beyond.

Her debut book, 'The Balloon

Thief', is an epic journey (both literal and metaphorical) in one girls' story; to find a safe place in the world, to find acceptance and companionship, and to triumph in a personal and societal battle to establish her own identity.

It is also a story that opens up a

discussion of terrorism, extremism and racism, drawn from Aneesa's own experiences with Islamophobia, and transposed to this fantasy world.

Inspired by both classic literature, which draw on myths and fairy tales from other cultures, Aneesa is keen to share the inspiration her heritage

has provided.

From Islamic folklore, superstitions, to real figures and mythology, 'The Balloon Thief' carefully interweaves these ideas seamlessly.

And, as a young mother, balancing two young children with the demands of being a first time author, Aneesa also wants to have the conversations that move the book world along. She's on a mission to help facilitate a diverse range of backgrounds, and all the elements that make up an individual's identity, in all different kinds of books, across different genres.

Aneesa is keen to talk on all kinds of topics, she says: "My hope with this book is to show that the world is not so black and white, that people are often the product of their environment and life experiences. In short, hate breeds hate, however I hope to show that love and friendship can and do prevail."


### Questioning identity and second generation British Pakistani experiences

"I think growing up, I experienced my fair share of racism that led me to questioning my identity.

"Being a second generation British Pakistani, I often found myself feeling not Asian enough to please my parents and grandparents, yet not British enough to fit in with my peers. This left me almost stuck inbetween two very different worlds and not really knowing where I belonged.

"I wanted this book to be a place where I could explore my own cultural identity, as well as the themes of terrorism and extremism, and to break down cultural stigma and stereotypes, whilst also showing through the character of Khadija. Her race is an element of her identity, it is not the entirety of who

House prices have risen at the fastest annual pace in

17 years, amid "robust" demand and low supply.

Building society Nationwide said prices rose by 11.2% year-on-year and by 0.8% between December and

Affordability is already a key issue with house prices rising much faster than wages throughout the pandemic. A deposit now constitutes a record percentage of a

first-time buyer's salary.

"A 10% deposit on a typical first-time buyer home is now equivalent to 56% of total gross annual earnings, a record high," said the building society's chief economist, Robert Gardner.

"Similarly, a typical mortgage payment as a share of take-home pay is now above the long-run average, despite mortgage rates remaining close to all-time lows."

The average price of a property in the UK was £255,556 last month - up from £254,822 in December - as demand remained "robust," Mr Gardner said.

"Mortgage approvals for house purchase have continued to run slightly above pre-pandemic levels, despite the surge in activity in 2021 as a result of the stamp duty holiday, which encouraged buyers to bring forward their transactions to avoid additional tax.

"Indeed, the total number of property transactions in 2021 was the highest since 2007 and around 25% higher than in 2019, before the pandemic struck.

At the same time, the stock of homes on estate agents' books has remained extremely low, which is contributing to the continued robust pace of house price growth.'

Property becomes

less affordable

However, it's predicted the increase in house prices will

slow this year as property becomes less affordable.

Mr Gardner said the outlook for the housing market "remains uncertain", but house price growth had "outstripped earnings growth by a wide margin since the pandemic struck

He added that with interest rates expected to rise in the coming months affordability could be hit further.


The Bank of England raised its key interest rate to

0.25% in December, and it is expected to make further increases this year.

Mr Gardner said reduced affordability would be likely to dampen market activity and house price growth this year "especially since household finances are also coming under pressure from sharp increases in the cost of living"-with inflation hitting 5.4% in December, its fastest pace since 1992, and set to rise further in the coming months as energy prices go up.



NHS offers a range of counselling and guided self-help for anxiety, depression, and other common mental health problems

A new NHS campaign is encouraging people struggling with their mental health to seek confidential help from NHS talking therapies.

Research shows that nearly half of South Asians put off seeking professional help and the NHS is "You won't be wasting anyone's time; encouraging them to make use of a range of free services available for anxiety, depression, and other common mental health problems – either by selfreferral or by contacting their GP.

The NHS offers a range of talking therapies, such as cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT), counselling and guided

Support is offered in a number of ways, including in-person and video consultations, telephone and interactive text messaging, a self-help workbook with therapist support, online courses,

and one-to-one or group therapy.

Harmeet, who was helped by NHS
Talking Therapies, said: "When I was
down, I didn't think any kind of therapy

"But just talking about my problems and knowing someone was listening instantly provided some relief. Don't think you're not worthy of help or that it won't work – just give it a try, I'm glad

"NHS therapy pulled me out of the dark hole I found myself in.

"By reaching out for help, especially to someone who is independent and totally non-judgmental, I was able to share what felt heavy and release the weight I had been carrying.

I can't shout about it enough my mental health is better than ever before.

Mental Health Therapist Ummar said: "People often think their problems aren't



Rashmi, who is guardian to her disabled brother who has Autism, established pioneering dance company 'Step Change Studios' to support disabled people to dance. She is also a disability advocate, having worked in social care, and a Board Member of Sport England, where she is the organisation's first Board Champion for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion.

Rashmi said: "I cannot describe how special this day has been. I am still processing receiving an MBE from The Princes Royal, and sharing conversation about inclusive dance. I am both proud and humbled by this recognition.

"I have long championed the positive impact of physical activity on our wellbeing and have seen the direct benefits to my brother's quality of life. But there remain far too many barriers to participation. Both through Step Change Studios and my wider advocacy work I have tried to contribute to removing some of those barriers.

"Dance is such a creative, fun way for people to connect, to feel good, and to be active. Many of the people we support experience loneliness, and can find it challenging to access activities that are welcoming and inclusive. The joy that people feel when they come together on a dance floor, and are able to realise their potential is extremely satisfying for everyone involved."

The arts have also provided a platform for Rashmi to highlight wider issues that impact disabled people, and also carers. She recently undertook an initiative supported by Arts Council England to highlight the lived experience of carers, producing podcasts and a series a dance films exploring carers' lives. She is also leading a project supporting people of South Asian heritage with sight loss to be active through dance.

Previously, Rashmi conceived and edited an award-winning photographic book highlighting the role of support workers in lives of people they support, and has contributed to a book highlighting the disproportionate number of people with learning disabilities in the criminal justice system.



### Kim Leaderbeater MP recognition of the State of |

In a debate in Parliament yesterday on the recognition of the State of Palestine, Kim Leadbeater MP said: 'This is a timely debate.

"While our attention is - quite rightly focused on events in Ukraine, an immediate crisis in one part of the world should not prevent us from addressing a long-running injustice elsewhere. As we wrestle with what we can do to defend the people of Ukraine, it would be a dereliction of duty to consign the people of Palestine to the 'too difficult' pile.

"And as we speak of the need to friend of peace. uphold international law, respect legally-recognised frontiers protect territorial integrity, we should remember that these principles are universal. We cannot pick and choose

where to apply them.
"So while we demand that our adversaries adhere to these principles, we should also be ready to remind our friends that they should do so too. And I speak as someone who sees no contradiction in being a friend of Israel and a friend of Palestine. To do so is to be a friend of humanity and a

'The treatment of the Palestinians is a stain on the conscience of the world. They have every right to conclude that for decades they have been subjected to a relentless campaign of oppression, subjugation of their basic human rights and the illegal occupation of their lands. The consequences of this history of injustice are felt day in day out as the people of Palestine go about their

"To take just one example – and there are many more – how can it be

right that in such a small geographic area a woman giving birth in the Occupied Territories is nine times more likely to die than a woman in Israel?

"For me, the suffering of human beings – families, young children, the old and the sick – should always be at the forefront of our minds. For many of those people, abstract principles like sovereignty and self-determination probably don't mean very much. But that doesn't mean they aren't important.

"Do I believe the recognition of the State of Palestine alongside the State of Israel would end their suffering overnight? No, of course not. But is it an essential and overdue step on the road to a peaceful settlement that would start to put these historic injustices right? Yes it is.

"By recognising the State of Palestine we would be offering its people the hope of a better future, one in which they are entitled to the same rights and respect as their neighbours. It may be a symbolic act but, as Professor Yossi Mekelberg of Chatham House says, "the power of symbolism cannot and should not be underestimated...there evidence overwhelming

international recognition of Palestine would serve the causes of peace, justice and international law.'

"If we believe, as we do, that there must be a negotiated, diplomatic settlement to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict which ensures a safe and secure Israel, alongside a viable and sovereign Palestinian state, then we should take whatever steps we can to advance that process. Recognition of the State of Palestine would be a powerful demonstration of the right of both Palestinians and Israelis to enjoy security, dignity and human

rights.

"If we truly believe in the universal surfice and selfprinciples of justice and self-determination under international law it is a step we should take without

The higher education system in England will be made fairer for students and taxpayers thanks to major reforms announced by the government.

Student finance will be put on a more sustainable footing by ensuring more students are paying back their loan in full, and there will be a clampdown on poor-quality university courses that don't benefit graduates in the long-term.
Under the current system, more

people than ever are going to university but too often, students are racking up debt for low-quality courses that do not lead to a graduate job with a good wage. This means that some students never even start paying off their student loan. And currently, only a quarter of students who started full-time undergraduate degrees in 2020/21 are forecast to repay their loans in full.

The cost of student loans is increasing quickly. The value of outstanding loans at the end of March 2021 reached £161 billion and it is forecast to rise to half a trillion pounds by 2043.

The government is taking action to tackle the problem head-on, rather than passing the problem on to future generations, by setting out major changes to the way students will repay their loans, and creating a sustainable system which also guarantees access for all.

To make the system fairer for students, the student loan interest rate will be set at RPI+0% for new borrowers starting courses from 2023/24, meaning that graduates will no longer repay more than they borrowed in real terms. This meets a key manifesto commitment to address student loan interest rates in this parliament.

Combined with the continued tuition fee freeze announced earlier

this month, a student entering a three-year course in academic year 2023/24 could see their debt reduced by up to £11,500 at the point at which become eligible to repay.

Today the government has also announced the tuition fee cap will be frozen at £9,250 for a further two years - up to and including 2024/25, further reducing the real cost to

To make the system fairer for taxpayers, the repayment threshold the point at which graduates start repaying their student loan - for new borrowers starting courses from September 2023 will be set at £25,000 until 2026-27.

This still means that graduates will not start repaying until they have reached well over the current median non-graduate salary

This makes sure that someone benefitting from a university degree makes a fair contribution to its cost: for example, a graduate earning £28,000 would pay back £17 a month.

Graduate salaries are continuing to rise – in 2020, the average salary for a graduate aged 21-30 was £6,500 higher than for a non-graduate – so it is right we ask those who are benefitting financially from the investment the taxpayer has made in their higher education to contribute

towards it.

The student loan repayment term will also be extended to 40 years for new borrowers from September 2023, to ensure more students repay their loan in full, taking into account the fact that people are now working and earning for longer.







Four members of a Ghanaian cocaine smuggling group have been jailed for over 28 years.

The group attempted to import almost £3 million worth of the class A drug concealed in their luggage on flights from Ghana to the UK Julius Tetteh Puplampu, 56,

was intercepted by a National Crime Agency investigation officers at Heathrow Airport following his arrival from Accra on 19 August 2021.

A search of his suitcase showed a concealment at the base, which was found to contain six kilos of cocaine.

Puplampu was sentenced to six years and nine months at Isleworth Crown Court last week after pleading guilty to the drug importation offences

NCA investigators identified that Puplampu was in regular contact with compatriot Eric Appaih, 50, who tried to import 15 kilos of cocaine hidden in food boxes. Appiah was sentenced to six years imprisonment in June

Paplampu was also connected to Albert Gyamfi, 52, and Jennifer Agyemang,

They had been stopped by Border Force officers on arrival at Heathrow earlier in 2021, with 15 kilos of cocaine hidden in a concealment in Agyemang's suitcase – the same type of concealment used by Puplampu.

Gyamfi and Agyemang initially denied knowledge of each other, but evidence showed the pair rearranging

items in Agyemang's suitcase before checking in at Kotoka International Airport. In December 2021 they were sentenced at Isleworth Crown Court to nine years and six vears and nine months respectively.

Immigration Enforcement International supported the investigation by providing evidence of links between the conspirators and their modus operandi and revoking visas

to disrupt their activity.
Piers Phillips, Senior
Investigations Officer at the
NCA, said: "This investigation has prevented an international cocaine smuggling group from getting their drugs to the UK market and seen the perpetrators given significant prison sentences.


"Cocaine causes significant harm to our communities, often fuelling violence and exploitation. We will continue to work with domestic and international partners to disrupt the class A drugs trade and pursue offenders.

Kenneth Adu Amanfoh, Director General of Ghana's Narcotics Control Commission, said: "Other individuals in Ghana connected to this drugs supply group have recently been arrested and apprehended by Narcotics Control Commission. This is a result of the strong collaboration between Ghanaian and UK law enforcement partners to counter international drugs trafficking and associated immigration crimes.



Energy bills are to go up for rising bills.

Why has the price of gas risen? millions of people after the price cap was lifted by £693 a year.

The cap, which will apply from 1st April to 31st September, is rising by 54% to £1,971 a year, a record increase largely driven by wholesale gas prices.

With the cost of living rising on

many fronts it has made energy prices a key political as well as practical issue for millions of households.

The energy price cap sets the maximum figure that can be charged to customers on a variable dual-fuel rate for typical usage of gas and electricity for a six month period.

Introduced in 2019 it is based on a

number of factors including the wholesale cost of power in the previous six months.

Ofgem estimates that 22 million households are currently on variable rates, the number swelled by around 2 million customers whose suppliers have gone bust in the last year.

Last October the price cap rose 12% to £1,277 but analysts predict it will rise around 50% this time, adding as much as £700 to bills as a result of a sustained increase in wholesale gas

The price cap is not the maximum that anyone can be charged - customers with high energy usage will have higher bills - but rather reflects typical usage levels.

How are energy bills calculated?

The cap is calculated on the basis of

wholesale fuel prices plus a range of taxes and operating costs.

At the last price cap announcement, bills were broken down as follows: 36% wholesale costs; 25.35% network costs; 18.62% operating costs; 15.33% environmental & social costs; VAT 4.76%; 2.24% other costs; 0.93% supplier pre-tax profit margin.

A sustained increase in wholesale gas prices is the principal driver of

Natural gas is around four times the price it was a year ago thanks to a combination of the cold European winter last year that drained supplies; increased demand from Asia & China; and for gas-powered electricity generation that filled the energy gap when renewable sources were not available during a relatively calm summer.

The environmental and social costs include projects to help decarbonise energy supply such as improving insulation in customer homes.

There has been pressure from Conservative backbenchers to cut these so-called "green taxes" which are technically levied on electricity generation.

The social costs include schemes to help the most vulnerable customers including the Warm Homes Discount (WHD) which provides a rebate of around £140 to more than 1.5 million people on particular benefits.

What is the impact of rising prices?

More than 20 suppliers have gone bust in the last year because they could not honour the prices offered to customers while paying elevated wholesale prices.

Around two million customers were passed on to other suppliers who have effectively taken them on at a combined loss of around £2bn because the wholesale price of energy is higher than the current price cap.

These so-called Supplier of Last Resort (SOLR) costs are usually shared by all bill payers in the year they are incurred, but that would add around £100 in the next year.

What is the government doing to help?

Energy suppliers have been lobbying government to provide support for customers and address, been what they say, is a dysfunctional

market since it became clear that passing on rising prices unavoidable.

Talks have been ongoing for months but intensified in the last month with the Treasury taking control after initial negotiations with the Department of Business and Industrial Strategy.

The Treasury is understood to have worked up a £6bn loan scheme that would see around £200 passed on as a

rebate to all energy customers.

That would still leave an average increase of around £500 to all customers for the foreseeable future.

It is thought the money would be loaned to suppliers to pass on to customers. Suppliers would then repay the money from customer bills when gas prices fall by keeping bills higher to cover the cost.

The Government says it wants to target help at the most vulnerable and it is expected the WHD will rise at least in line with existing plans to increase its value to £150 and reach to

three million people.

Because the WHD is paid from customer bills, it's estimated those changes will add £24 to the average bill unless the Treasury intervenes.
Cutting the 5% VAT rate has all-but


been ruled out aby ministers and it is still unclear whether the green levies will be addressed, perhaps by moving their funding to general taxation.

Will prices come down?

Not any time soon. The gas markets suggest prices will remain elevated for several years, not least because gas is the key transition fuel for economies around the world trying to move from carbon-based power generation to renewables.

Based on current prices, analysts predict the next price cap review in October will see a further £400 increase, meaning government intervention may have to be sustained.

Divorce rates in the UK could surge by more than 50% in 2022 according to a specialist and twice-published author on the subject.

The UK's 'Divorce Day', the first Monday in January, has come and gone, and the figures made for shocking reading, with enquiries growing by over 67% compared to the same two weeks last year.

What's more, those numbers could get even higher, says James Brien from an online divorce company.

'New Divorce Law comes into effect on 6th April, which could see divorce rates soar, as no-fault divorce legislation will replace the current fault base system.

"Under the current system a divorce application must be supported by one of five facts. These are adultery, unreasonable behaviour, desertion, two years' separation and five years separation. Couple's divorcing under the new law will no longer need to rely on one of the 5 facts,'

Under the new regime, a 20 week "cooling off period" will be established, meaning that a divorce will take at least six months to complete. This will give couples time to ensure that they are making the right decision, and olenty of time to make sure financial issues can be resolved before the divorce is finalised.

Under the current system, if both parties are in agreement, it is possible to divorce in three to four months.

that the new divorce law will slow down the speed of divorce, more are likely to apply for divorce under the old system. Anyone wishing to take advantage of a fast divorce will have until 11:59pm on the 5th April 2022 to file for divorce.

James adds that divorce applications could surge because: Each year, two years is used in approximately 26% of all divorce cases. The new legislation means that couples

years.
"Every year approximately 15% of divorces rely on five years' of separation. Divorces could surge by 30,000 cases in 2022 because couples who have been separated for three and four years don't need to wait until year 5.



## Love Thy Neighbour

he Access to Neighbouring Land Act 1992 ("the Act") is a piece of legislation which allows property owner access onto his neighbour's land to enable him to carry out maintenance, repair or renewal works to his own land. If a neighbour is not prepared to allow such access, then an application can be made to the Court for an "Access Order" under the

The Court will grant an Access Order to the adjoining property where:
• The proposed works are reasonably

necessary for the preservation of the whole or any part of the Claimant's land;

• It is either impossible or substantially more difficult to carry out such works without access to the neighbouring land.

In making an Access Order the Court has to consider whether:

• The adjoining owner would suffer interference or disturbance with the use and enjoyment of his land; and

• The adjoining owner would suffer hardship if an Access Order were to be granted.

Although the Act has been around for three decades there have been very few reported cases. The only reported High Court case is the recent case of Prime London Holdings 11 Limited v Thurloe Lodge Limited. That case provides useful guidance in respect of applications for Access Orders under

In that case, the parties to the dispute owned very expensive neighbouring houses in South Kensington. They fell out in September 2019 when the Claimant requested access to a passageway on the Defendant's land to render a wall on the Claimant's property but the Defendant refused. The Claimant applied for an Access Order under the Act and the Defendant opposed that application.

The Court rejected the Defendant's arguments about health and safety, insurance issues and temporary interruption to access to his property. The Judge was of the view that denying the Defendant access to its land for a few days was not unreasonable whereas if the Claimant was denied access then damp was likely to permeate to his property. However, in granting the Claimant access the Court awarded the Defendant compensation for the inconvenience caused to him. This was assessed at tens of thousands of pounds rather than the millions of pounds sought by the Defendant.

Whilst this case provides useful guidance for neighbours who need to make an application under the Act, the Judge was less than impressed by the conduct of the warring parties as he stated in his judgment: "If this case has

proven anything, it has proven that the Biblical precept to 'love thy neighbour' is one that owners of neighbouring properties would do well to abide by. The current action has involved great effort and cost to both parties in order to produce an outcome that, with only a modicum of goodwill, they might have been able to agree between them



Louise Care from OnePoll added: "The circle of life goes on and attributes, mannerisms are passed down through generations.





- **5.** Get your boiler serviced. Your boiler may seem like it is working fine but getting a boiler service could identify any looming threats and neutralise them before they become a problem, in the middle of night, on a cold February
- 6. TRV's (Thermostatic Radiator Valves). If you don't have them, get them . If you do have them, make sure they are on the right setting, they stop the room from overheating and keep it comfortable, they also stop your boiler burning more gas than it needs to.
- **7.** Do consider getting a new boiler!







In November many analysts predicted the cost of electric vehicles were set to plummet in the next few years. Then in December, the government cut down the grant for buyers of electric vehicles.

As electric cars become much

cheaper to make, so will they be cheaper to buy? In short, yes. Battery electric vehicle (EV)

prices have already fallen dramatically and are expected to reach parity with petrol or diesel cars between 2025 and 2027 - and

be cheaper soon after. The price drop is partly due to advancements in the batteries, as well as carmakers producing more mass market cars.

"International agreements on climate change mean car companies understand that there is a global transition to clean transport under way," said Ben Nelmes from New Automotive.

"They are racing to increase the number of electric models they are selling to secure a share of tomorrow's car market," he said.

Now that the auto industry is designing EVs from scratch rather than adapting existing design structures known as "platforms" - they are improving both performance and cost.

For now, the car industry is calling for increased incentives for buyers until EV prices match those of combustion engine cars. And, second-hand EVs are

about to hit the market

In 2019 many electric cars were bought up by commercial fleets taxi or car hire companies or those with company cars - after the government offered tax breaks for EVs.

These companies tend to sell off those vehicles after two to three years, so those are about to enter

the second-hand market.
And Britain loves to buy second-hand cars. Last year around 7.5 million used cars changed hands, compared with two million new ones

Around two-thirds of people in the UK have driveways, allowing them to charge an EV at home.

But it is "vital that local authorities play an active role in ensuring that chargers are rolled out in residential areas where houses do not have driveways, to enable equal access to the benefits of owning an EV," said Mr Nelmes.

Charging on long-distance journeys can still pose a challenge. The car industry is calling for government investment in infrastructure, meanwhile Shell has promised to install 50,000 charge points by 2050.

Starting with the powertrain, Aston Martin's engineering team set about realising the full potential of the DBX's 4.0-litre twin-turbocharged V8.

Led by Aston Martin's Head of Powertrain Engineering, Ralph Illenberger, the DBX707's engine now features ball bearing turbochargers and a bespoke engine calibration to liberate more power and torque.

Also new to Aston Martin's flagship high performance SUV is a 9-speed 'wet clutch' automatic transmission. Capable of managing much increased torque loadings, this high-performance transmission allows output of the 4.0-litre V8 to be lifted to an immense 707PS and 900Nm, increases of 157PS and 200Nm over the DBX (V8).

The adoption of the new wet clutch transmission brings further benefits. The feel of the shift is more immediate and direct, which gives the driver an increased sense of control and responsiveness, and a dramatic character change from the DBX (V8). Launch capability is also improved, which contributes towards the DBX707's 0-62mph time of 3.3 seconds.

Integral to the DBX707's suite of performance enhancements is the standard fitment of Carbon Ceramic Brakes. Measuring 420mm front and 390mm rear, these CCB discs are gripped by 6-piston calipers and result in a 40.5kg reduction in unsprung weight.

Wheels and tyres are 22in as standard, with an optional 23in alloy wheel offered in a choice of textured

Wheels and tyres are 22in as standard, with an optional 23in alloy wheel offered in a choice of textured black or satin black with diamond turned highlights. The adoption of a 23in wheel also brings dynamic benefits, with the larger diameter tyre offering improved steering response, better primary body control and improved lap times.

improved lap times.

Torque distribution front-to-rear remains fully automatic, with the ability to send up to 100% of the torque to the rear axle on demand. Careful calibration of the e-diff ensures the DBX707 has the cornering agility, sporting feel and dynamic character of a true sports car.

Key to the DBX707's exceptional handling is its air suspension system. Starting with the suspension, it features new damper valving and recalibration of dynamic spring volume switching to improve body control and steering response.

Combined with tighter management of heave (vertical movement over bumps and crests or in compressions), pitch (when the car dives under braking or squats under

acceleration) and body roll, DBX707 gives the driver easier ability to adjust the yaw of the car with natural pedal or steering inputs. Further detail changes have been made to the eARC (Electronic Active Roll Control) system, with revised parameters that heighten the sense of agility and improve the dynamic balance of the car.

To underline the DBX707's driver-focussed credentials there have also been some changes and enhancements to the Dynamic Drive modes. "Race Start" is available in GT Sport and Sport+ modes to maximise off-the-line acceleration and truly showcase the enhanced performance. Revised active logic in the all-wheel drive system transfer case achieves greater harmony and precise control between the driveline and the ESP system, for a more natural, sports car-like driving experience.

In keeping with its extensive engineering upgrades the exterior and interior of the DBX707 have received an equally thorough design makeover. The result is spectacular overtly sporting but with the style and attention to detail for which Aston Martin is rightly celebrated.

New front-end treatment sees the DBX receive a larger front grille and all-new design of DRL complete with new air intakes and brake cooling ducts, plus a new front splitter profile. The satin chrome grille - enlarged to

significantly increase cooling airflow to both the ultra-high performance V8 and new 9-speed transmission - features double vanes, the six horizontal bars now split to create more visual interest and make this range-topping model immediately identifiable.

Dark satin chrome window surrounds and new louvred bonnet blades co-ordinate perfectly with the front grille and gloss black splitter, continuing along the flanks with gloss black side sills, which now feature a deeper and more heavily sculpted profile to give the DBX707 a groundhugging stance. DBX707 also welcomes the addition of soft-close doors, further enhancing the SUV's luxury credentials.

Rear-end treatment is just as dramatic. Enhancing both aesthetic form and aerodynamic function a new lip spoiler has been added to the roof wing to reduce lift and increase high speed stability, with a significantly enlarged twin rear diffuser rising to meet the new large diameter quad exhaust system. Finished in satin black to compliment the gloss black treatment of the diffuser this new exhaust has been tuned to deliver a unique sound signature. Completing the rear-end changes a new rear bumper complete with integrated quarter panel vents accentuate the DBX707's muscular physique.

The sporting theme continues



inside with Sport seats fitted as standard. All seat options come with 16-way electric adjustment plus heating in front and rear as standard. There are three choices of interior environments.

As on the exterior, the DBX707's interior features a dark chrome finish to switchgear as standard. Bright

chrome and carbon fibre can be specified as an option. Piano Black veneer is standard with carbon fibre or bronze metal mesh veneer finishes available as an option.

DBX707 production is due to commence in Q1 of 2022, with first deliveries scheduled to begin during early Q2 2022.

#### **Protecting motorists**

### Crackdown on "cowboy" parking firms will cap most fines at £50 and provide new appeals system

Motoring groups welcome plans to tackle unfair charges and opaque terms and conditions that will see innocent mistakes, such as mistyping a vehicle's registration number, be excused from action.

Plans for a crackdown on "cowboy"

Plans for a crackdown on "cowboy" parking firms will cap many fines at £50

Motoring groups welcome plans and introduce a new code of conduct to better protect motorists, according to the government.

Ministers said that millions would benefit from an overhaul following years of complaints over unfair and extortionate charges.

The package of measures will see

the majority of fines issued by private operators cut by up to 50% - down from a current maximum £100 - across Britain.

It includes a ten-minute grace period before a late fine can be issued, and a requirement for parking firms to clearly display pricing and terms and conditions in a bid to end firms hiding behind "non-specific, pseudo-legal and aggressive language when pursuing motorists".

Innocent mistakes, such as mistyping a registration number into a ticket machine, will be excused while parking debt collectors will be banned from adding additional excess fees to the level of the parking charge, currently as much as £70.

A single parking appeals service will also be created to handle complaints.

The government said that those firms which breach the new code could even be barred from collecting fines. This would be done by blocking them from requesting Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) data on the identity of a vehicle's owner - but the statement added that this element would only kick in from the end of 2023.

Minister for Levelling Up, Neil O'Brien MP said: "Private firms issue roughly 22,000 parking tickets every day, often adopting a system of misleading and confusing signage, aggressive debt collection and unreasonable fees designed to extort money from motorists.

"The new Code Of Practice will set out a clear vision with the interests of safe motorists at its heart, while cracking down on the worst offenders who put other people in danger and hinder our emergency services from carrying out their duties."

The announcement was broadly welcomed by motoring organisations.

AA president Edmund King said:

AA president Edmund King said: "For too long, those caught by private parking firms simply pay the charge to get rid of it. Thankfully these days are numbered.


"Drivers should feel confident that having a single Code of Practice and a new Appeals Charter will give them confidence to appeal and be properly heard.

"We are also pleased that honest mistakes, like mistyping the car registration into the machine, will now be automatically cancelled."




