However, councillor Akbar hoped to be voice for the oppressed in Palestine amid the ongoing war, but comments that the Labour Party had other intentions, and he faced an up hill battle right from the onset.
"Sadly the Wakefield Labour Group decided

to play petty political games and voted against it," stated councillor Akbar.

"Cllr Sharp seconded my motion and spoke about her families experiences

including how her grandfather was shot by the IDF.



The World Court ordered Israel on Friday 29th January, to prevent acts of genocide against the Palestinians and do more to help civilians, although it stopped short of ordering a ceasefire as requested by South Africa.

South Africa brought the case to the International Court of Justice (ICJ) earlier this month, asking it to grant emergency measures to halt the fighting, which has killed more than 26,000 Palestinians. It accused Israel of state-led

genocide in its offensive, begun after Hamas militants stormed into Israel killing 1,200 and kidnapping more than 240. Israel sought to have the case thrown out.

than 240. Israel sought to have the case thrown out. In Friday's ruling, the judges said Israel must take all measures within its power to prevent its troops from committing genocide, punish and must take steps to improve the humanitarian situation.

While the ICJ did not order a ceasefire, it said it to avoid civilian casualties

would not throw out the genocide case, ruling that the Palestinians appeared to be a protected group under the 1948 Genocide Convention. It did not decide the merits of the genocide allegations.

Israel has called South Africa's allegations false and "grossly distorted", and said it makes the utmost efforts to avoid civilian casualties.

Shipley Market Square revitalisation unveiled

The heart of Shipley is set to undergo a massive transformation with the ambitious redevelopment of its market square.

A planning application for the project has been submitted, led by Bradford Council's Landscape, Design and Conservation Team, which will revitalise the market square, under the Shipley Streets for People initiative.

This new design will create a

This new design will create a contemporary and adaptable space, suitable for events and pop-up market stalls. An all-weather canopy means the square will be able to host yearround events, ensuring a vibrant atmosphere regardless of the weather.

The existing permanent market stalls will be removed with the regular

Shipley markets taking place under the canopy and along the pedestrianised promenade. Rain gardens – shallow planted areas which receive rain run-off - and comfortable seating areas have been strategically integrated, enhancing both the visual appeal and functionality of the square, creating an inviting space for families and visitors to Shipley to gather and spend time.

inviting space for families and visitors to Shipley to gather and spend time. The redevelopment of the market square has been supported by £1m funding from the West Yorkshire Combined Authority and £3m from the Government-funded Shipley Towns Fund

Removing the old market stalls will improve the look of the town centre but also make it feel safer and more welcoming, particularly at night. The garden has been funded through Bradford District Care NHS Foundation Trust's iCare innovation development programme and created by staff to enhance patient care.


Beth Chesworth, Occupational

Beth created a sensory and edible garden to develop and deliver a therapeutic horticultural programme. Nature-based activities are known to provide stress relief and relaxation for people, as well as improve physical health and functioning. An aim of the therapeutic horticultural programme is to engage patients of different ages, interests and abilities with nature-based activities to meet a therapeutic goal

Beth Chesworth, Occupational Therapist said: "The edible garden is packed with plenty of fruit and vegetables. Patients can take the time to grow these to support their mental health and wellbeing, benefitting from being in nature and taking pride in cultivating their own plants. Patients and staff have credited the horticultural groups with improving mood and inspiring others to engage in more nature-based activities in the future."

The iCare programme aims to help staff make innovative ideas, with growth prospects, happen and support them to create value and impact in Trust services and beyond.

The challenge of making an informed choice —Authentic

When it comes to making food choices, effort is always made to go for the best based on an informed decision.

This article is a humble effort to enhance consumer awareness on the Halal Certification process so that they are aware of the difference between self-proclaimed halal and certified halal.

Certification plays a decisive role in buying choices as it inspires consumer's trust and confidence because of the transparency and verifiability of the process. There are different halal standards, that are a prerequisite of access for clients and manufacturers who want to trade in a specific country to meet its demand

and grasp the market.

A product certified by a competent and well-established halal certification body is accepted globally without any need for further

investigation or verification.
Product approval is a very sensitive process that requires focussed and indepth analysis which is only possible under a competent and experienced technical team.

Halal certification bodies have a well-structured and highly organised system for product approval which is first step towards halal certification.

Product submissions as well as supporting documents are reviewed and scrutinised by highly qualified, trained and experienced food technologists. Halal certification is the basis for making and maintaining a halal claim.

In this lieu, self-proclaimed halal food is not only a challenge for the food industry but a big threat for consumers' health too as it comes without any authenticity or verifiability.

One may find a number of some self-proclaimed halal products simply bearing an inscription of The Arabic word that neither stands for any halal

certification body nor represents any traceability or any authenticable process of ensuring halal standards.

On the other, halal certification bodies put more financial and human resources to ensure product authenticity which is almost impossible in the case of selfproclaimed products.

They have designed a detailed process of reviewing and approving product documents, verifying sites through surveillance audits to evaluate the halal control point (HCP) and ensuring that product and manufacturing processes fulfill the requirements of halal standards.

The halal products approved by Halal certification bodies depict specific logos/ symbols that are identifiable and traceable. These bodies ensure halal authenticity from farm to fork and provide detailed records from raw materials to finished products.

Throughout the process, due consideration is given to ensure that product labelling does not create any

confusion in the Muslim community. Labels are scrutinised and approved to put on products that are approved by a halal certification body before

releasing a product to the market. Halal information is not just in the English language but is bilingual or even multilingual to ascertain the traceability of the products in every possible manner and help consumers understand the label in a better way.

Hidden ingredients such as processing aids, anti-caking agents, carriers, and incidental ingredients from various sources present another serious problem for Muslim consumers.

Magnesium or calcium stearates are used in the manufacturing of candy and chewing gum without mentioning the origin of the stearates.

Halal certification of the product, proper halal markings, and logos can clarify the doubt for consumers as it requires clear labelling of the source of the ingredients like gelatine, lecithin, mono & diglycerides, etc.

The animal source ingredients such

as oils, fats, meat derivatives, or extracts like gelatine and rennet also need to be declared. A product with a halal-certified logo makes life easier for consumers to make prudent choices while purchasing products from the market.

The Halal-certified foods are monitored and certified from farm to form. The food supply chain and its related equipment are regularly examined, verified, and validated through halal audits. This exercise is conducted to eliminate any risk of haram (non-halal) contamination.

Summing it up, one can safely say that simply labelling a product does not make it halal. Under any circumstances, the claim must be supported by some verifiable facts, and Halal Certification by an authorised body such as the Halal Food Authority, is the best answer to all the questions that may come to a consumer's mind before making a prudent choice.

CANCER: If something doesn't feel right, speak to your GP practice

Cancer Research UK analysis shows one in two people will develop cancer in their lifetime, with around 375,400 cases diagnosed each year.

Cancer is when cells divide in

an uncontrollable way, and if left untreated, these abnormal cells can spread to other parts of the body.

Symptoms can be caused by a wide range of things and most of the time they won't be due to cancer. But if it is cancer, early diagnosis can save lives and increase survival and so it's worth getting unusual or persistent changes checked out.



"I know my early diagnosis and treatment is the reason why I'm still here."

49-year-old Shamilla Mirza found a pea-shaped lump in her breast, so booked an appointment with her GP who referred her to the breast clinic at North Manchester General Hospital for tests.

The mother-of-two was shocked to be diagnosed with breast cancer

but says the support of her family gave her the strength to face the

Shamilla had a mastectomy (an operation where breast tissue is removed) and breast reconstruction, followed by chemotherapy treatment. On reflection she says: "I cannot thank the NHS or my family enough for giving me the courage to deal with cancer. I know my early diagnosis and treatment is the reason why I'm still here for my family, particularly my sons Zakir

In 2019, Shamilla unveiled a special park bench in Manchester marking her recovery from cancer. It salutes the scientists, doctors and nurses who are making gamechanging progress in tackling the

The inscription on her bench reads: "Shamilla Mirza loved sitting here... and still does thanks to advances in cancer research.

Contact your GP practice if something in your body doesn't feel right or you experience any of these symptoms. Some symptoms can be harder to notice:

- Breathlessness
- Frequent infections
- Unexplained heavy, drenching night sweats
- Unexplained weight loss
- An unusual lump anywhere on the body, like in the neck or armpit
- Unexpected or unexplained bruising or bleeding
- Difficulty swallowing
- Mouth ulcers that don't heal
- · White or red patches in the mouth and throat
- Blood in your pee
- · Blood in your poo, which may look red or

For three weeks or more:

- · A cough or a change to an existing cough
- Changes in the voice such as hoarseness
- Tummy trouble, such as discomfort or bloating
- · Feeling tired and unwell and not sure why
- Heartburn or indigestion
- · Changes to your bowel habits, such as diarrhoea or constipation, or unusual, pale or greasy poo
- Unexplained pain or discomfort

It may be nothing serious, but finding cancer early makes it more treatable.

If you reach out to your GP and they have concerns about cancer, they may ask you to do some tests, like go for a chest X-ray or complete a home test kit that looks for hidden traces of blood in your poo, or refer you to a specialist.

A new toolkit to increase supervised toothbrushing for younger children aims to address health equalities caused by tooth decay.

Researchers from the University of Sheffield, University of Leeds and Bradford Improvement Academy, have developed free online resources for NHS organisations, local government, schools, nurseries and parents, as part of the BRUSH project to better support existing and new toothbrushing programmes.

A quarter of five-year-olds in England have tooth decay, this can rise up to 50 per cent in deprived areas of the country. The burden of tooth decay is significant, causing pain, as well as affecting what children eat, their speech, sleep, quality of life and attendance at nursery or school.

Treatment of decay is the most common reason why

young children are admitted to hospital (33,000 each year), costing the NHS over £50 million annually.

Co-lead of the study, Professor Zoe Marshman, Professor in Dental Public Health at the University of Sheffield, said: "One of the key ways to prevent tooth decay is toothbrushing with a fluoride toothpaste. Toothbrushing programmes in pursaries and early years at Toothbrushing programmes in nurseries and early years at school are really important to complement toothbrushing

"We already know supervised toothbrushing programmes for young children are effective in reducing tooth decay, and easy for nurseries/schools to run. However, the uptake and maintenance of these programmes has been fragmented.

"The new toolkit will make it receives."

The new toolkit will make it easier for new toothbrushing programmes to be set up, meaning more children will be able to benefit from the programmes so

less children suffer from tooth decay and its consequences."
The BRUSH project was funded and supported by the NIHR Applied Research Collaboration South West Peninsula (PenARC) and conducted by researchers from the University of Sheffield and University of Leeds.

"The toolkit is a central one-stop-shop sharing best practice and containing new materials we have developed to give organisations setting up these programmes, nurseries, schools, parents and children the relevant information and recourses easily."

Formance fraud Couple tricked victims into sending them hundreds and thousands of pounds

A couple who tricked victims into sending hundreds of thousands of pounds in a romance fraud and laundered cash from others have been sentenced.

Ibrahim Moro, 33, from Bromley, and Rebecca Patrick, 32, from Croydon, targeted older and vulnerable victims on online dating sites before gaining their trust and asking for thousands of pounds.

NCA investigators found one victim, an elderly man from Australia, had believed he was in a relationship with Patrick.

The couple gained the trust of their

victim, first asking for small amounts stating it would be used to buy Patrick warmer clothes for winter. The victim was then told Patrick was entitled to 78kg of gold in Ghana and had to pay for it to be released, but that when it was she would move to Australia and live with him.

The victim went on to transfer 250,000 Australian dollars, almost £138,000 at the time it was sent, to the fraudsters. He also sent Patrick a new phone and multiple other smaller amounts of money over a year-long period.

Moro and Patrick received hundreds of thousands of pounds more from a number of other victims which they laundered through their bank accounts.

Investigators recovered emails from one victim who believed they were in a romantic relationship with a man they met online but who didn't actually exist.

By July 2016, she received a request for money and was later persuaded to send £18,000 after fraudsters told her they were having problems with insurance.

Another victim was tricked into sending money to a man she thought was a German widower living in Ascot, buying gold, silver and diamonds for clients. They started a friendship and although she never met him, she regarded him as 'a close friend and confidant'.

In March 2016, she was told he was overseas and had bought some precious stones, but was unable to leave the country until he had paid taxes on them. The victim was asked to pay the amount and was told 'if you don't loan me the money, that means you don't care about

me'

The victim said she felt under pressure and paid £2,500. The transfers were made to Patrick's account with the full amount withdrawn in cash by the defendant days later.

Financial records also showed an American victim transferring more than £8,000 to Moro in April 2014. Moro transferred £5,500 out days later to two other accounts before withdrawing £1,400 in cash.

Hundreds of thousands of pounds taken from victims is also believed to have been sent straight to Moro's bank accounts in Ghana.

NCA investigators were able to link Moro to the email account used to defraud the Australian victim and could also show that the addresses Moro and Patrick provided to their victims were the same addresses they gave to their banking providers.

Both defendants denied the offences, with Moro claiming the money that had gone into his account was from a clothing business he had set up in Ghana. Patrick claimed she had given Moro access to her accounts to send money to his family in Ghana.


They were convicted following a five day trial at Croydon Crown Court in November. Both were sentenced at the same court on 23rd January. Moro was sentenced to five-and-a-half years in prison and Patrick received an 18-month prison sentence, suspended for 18-months.

The Judge also ordered all money restrained in the investigation to be returned to victims.



What is the Knife An

27-foot tall sculpture made from over 100,000 seized blades come to Leeds to start conversations about knife crime

The touring Knife Angel sculpture is coming to Leeds in February, to send a powerful message and spark conversations about knife crime in

It will be placed outside the Royal Armouries Museum as part of an intensification month on knife crime which launches on 1st February.

The Knife Angel, standing 27ft tall and made from over 100,000 seized blades, was created by the British Ironwork Centre to highlight the negative effects of violent behaviour and the need for change. Featuring messages from families of victims of knife crime it also acts as a striking memorial designed to celebrate those lives who have been lost.

As part of the city's continued response to serious youth violence a free programme of learning opportunities will be running throughout the month. To engage and educate young people, secondary schools have been given the opportunity to book in for specialist learning sessions at the Royal Armouries Museum, supported by the West Yorkshire Violence Reduction Partnership.

By day, Muhammad Shahid works on the helpdesk at Yorkshire Building Society but after his shift ends, he is likely to be found in a laboratory where he researches new cancer treatments.

Dr Muhammad Shahid - he gained his PhD in Breast Cancer Therapeutics last year - is part of a team that has developed a new treatment for breast cancer, one which has fewer side effects, although clinical trials are still to take place

In addition, he was responsible for developing a more ethical method of research, by removing the need for animal testing

His achievements are all the more impressive due to a significant number of other commitments, not least of which is that his seven-

year-old son has a chronic lung condition, which often means he has to attend hospital on a weekly basis.

Commenting on his PhD award and recent research, the father-of-two (he also has a daughter, 12), said: "I always wanted to do something that made a contribution to society, especially in the field of center Howay it has been a structed to work full time to field of cancer. However, it has been a struggle to work full time to support my family and find the time for scientific research. Some days, I would only get three or four hours' sleep.

"The University of Bradford has been so supportive throughout

my studies, I could not have done this without them. I am immensely grateful for the support and scientific guidance provided by my supervisors, especially Dr Kantamneni and Dr Mohammad Isreb. Their expertise, support and encouragement played a pivotal role in my success and served as a constant source of motivation."

Part of the support offered was to ensure Muhammad had access to the University of Bradford laboratories, and academic support, whenever he needed it.



His project has contributed to the field by exploring new treatment strategies for breast cancer, a step closer to improving the lives of cancer patients.

Dr Sriharsha Kantamneni, who supervised Muhammad's PhD, said: "We said to him we will work around his life to accommodate him, so we arranged for him to access the lab whenever it suited him - this flexible approach was part of our support. Muhammad came to me in December 2019 - the following February, the country went into full lockdown. He has had to deal with a lot in order to achieve his PhD and make the breakthroughs in research, which are remarkable. His project has contributed to the field by exploring new treatment strategies for breast cancer, a step closer

to improving the lives of cancer patients."

In his extensive research, Muhammad focused on investigating the anti-angiogenic and anti-cancer effects of Mebendazole (currently used as an anti-parasite drug). Combining this drug with established chemotherapies such as Paclitaxel and Doxorubicin, he successfully reduced the required dosage concentration for he successfully reduced the required dosage concentration for effective therapy. Doing so mitigates the side effects associated with chemotherapy but also contributes to reducing the overall cost of cancer treatments.

Another significant breakthrough in his work was the inhibition

of a critical protein called Ran, a highly expressed factor in cancer patients that promotes cancer progression and drug resistance. Muhammad's efforts to understand and counteract this protein signalling could pave the way for more effective treatment

approaches.
Expanding his research, Muhammad screened over 54 genes in search of new targets for Mebendazole and Ran as a potential cancer treatment.

Additionally, in collaboration with Al-Ahliyya Amman University in Jordan, he successfully replaced the traditional animal model with an innovative 'in ova' model. This alternative method proved to be less invasive, more cost-effective, and ethically superior, allowing for greater advancements in cancer

Under the expert guidance of Professor Mohamed El Tanani (from the University of Bradford) and Dr Abraheem Aldeeb (from Al-Ahliyya Amman University), he reached significant milestones.

Muhammad, who is originally from Pakistan, and holds a bachelor's in biology and two Master's in zoology and cancer pharmacology, said: "The University of Bradford holds a special place in my heart, as it provided me with access to state-of-the-art facilities at the Institute of Cancer Therapeutics and the School of Pharmacy and Medical Sciences. These invaluable resources

Pharmacy and Medical Sciences. These invaluable resources enabled me to carry out this project with precision and excellence."

Dr Kantamneni added: "Muhammad's research will undoubtedly make a significant impact on breast cancer therapeutics, offering hope to countless patients worldwide. We celebrate his achievements, unwavering determination, resilience and dedication to advancing cancer research and treatment. We eagerly anticipate the bright future that lies ahead for this exceptional researcher" exceptional researcher.
















Packing tips





Out-hacking the hackers



A total of 39 per cent of UK businesses reported suffering a cyber-attack

Cybersecurity at the School of Computer Science, AI and Electronics is handing the tools students need to beat the hackers at their own game as part of a computer course at the University of Bradford.

A total of 39 per cent of UK businesses reported suffering a cyber-attack in 2022. Meanwhile, cybercrime costs UK firms an average of £4,200 in 2022.

Dr Amna Qureshi, Assistant Professor in Cybersecurity at the School of Computer Science, AI and Electronics of the University of Bradford, who teaches the ethical hacking module, says companies often get caught out by hackers through misconfigured security settings, weak passwords, unpatched software, and unsecured network connections.

Ethical hacking, which is a module in the university's MSc Cyber Security course, is when ethical hackers carry out risk assessments and test computer systems for security-related issues on behalf of companies or organisations. Their work is to outsmart the malicious hackers.

Ethical hackers must follow a strict code

of ethics when they carry out their work. This includes being prohibited from sharing how they breached a computer system's security measures with anyone outside of whom they are working for or

After they have finished their work, they must delete all traces of their hacking work to make sure malicious hackers cannot see ow they achieved it.

During the University of Bradford's module, students are taught how to gather information, scan, test, and hack so they will be able to secure systems effectively.

The module offers a background in

ethical hacking, scanning networks, system hacking, n engineering, alware analysis, social session hijacking, and malware

The statistics on the cost and impact of ybercrime in the UK show the need for

ethical hacking and courses that teach it.
But to protect the work of the students on the course at Bradford, we will not be giving away how they keep one step ahead of the malicious hackers.

Dr Amna Qureshi said: "Ethical hacking is becoming a growth industry. After Covid-19, everything is online, and there are so many cyber attacks. There are so many scams out there. Organisations' employees need to be made aware of their cyber security policies.

"Ethical hacking is the practice of intentionally probing computer systems and networks to identify security weaknesses, vulnerabilities, and potential

threats. It is similar to hacking; it's just that ethical hackers have permissions - that's the difference. The black hat hackers (or malicious attackers) find these vulnerabilities and exploit these vulnerabilities for personal gain.

"It's non-stop. New techniques are being

developed by hackers every day.

"There is nothing that is perfectly secure. There could be some insecure links. Hackers exploit weak links. The first step for ethical hackers is the collection of information about companies in order to identify potential vulnerabilities and develop an attacking strategy.

"Ethical hacking is very important. This

is the first point organisations can protect their infrastructure from hackers. Ethical hackers can help organisations identify and fix security vulnerabilities in their systems and networks. The demand for ethical hackers is expected to grow in the coming years. As organisations become more aware of the risks of cyberattacks, they are increasingly investing in ethical hacking

The students enjoy this module a lot as it involves penetration testing. In the simulated environments, they get to work on vulnerable applications and exploit the identified vulnerabilities. A lot of students are into cyber security.'

The UK is enforcing new rules as part of a global effort to clamp down on tax dodgers

A new clampdown on online sales earnings by HMRC could see almost one is six British workers paying more tax.

From this January, the UK is enforcing new rules as part of a global effort to clamp down on tax dodgers by the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD).

Firms including Vinted, Airbnb and eBay are obliged to collect and share details of transactions with the tax authorities.

Under the new rules, the

digital platforms will routinely report the income sellers are getting through their site which apply to the sales of goods, such as second-hand clothes or threshold for earnings from these sales is set at £1,000 a year – above this, online sellers must register as self-employed and file a self-assessment tax return at the end of the financial year.

According to MoneyZine, one in six British workers is currently working in the gig

Dispute Resolution Is Not Optional

n what is being hailed as a landmark decision, the Court of Appeal recently confirmed in the case of Churchill v Merthyr Tidfil County Borough Council that the Court has the power to stay proceedings and order parties to engage in a non-court based dispute resolution process provided that it does not restrict a litigant's right to proceed to a judicial hearing and is proportionate to the aim of settling the dispute.

In that case, the Claimant brought a claim against the Council for the damage caused to his property by Japanese Knotweed from a neighbouring property which was owned by the Council. The Claimant was invited to engage in the Council's internal complaints procedure but refused and instead issued court proceedings. The Council applied for a stay of the proceedings on the basis that the matter should proceed through its complaints



proceedings was nevertheless dismissed because the Judge stated that he was bound by previous case law which held that: "to oblige truly unwilling parties to refer their disputes to mediation would be to impose an unacceptable obstruction on their right of access to the court". The Council appealed the

The Court of Appeal allowed the Council's appeal and ruled that the courts could stay proceedings to order parties to engage in non-court dispute resolution. The Appeal Judges found that an order for parties to explore forms of non-court dispute resolution would not be an unacceptable obstruction to their right of access to the Court. The Court did not set out any guidance as to how or at what stage in the proceedings this power should be exercised, instead it should be considered on a case-by-case

However, the Appeal Court did provide some guidance as to the factors to be considered in determining whether a party had acted unreasonably in refusing to engage in non-court dispute resolution. The Court would generally consider the circumstances of the case and the form of dispute resolution proposed to assess the benefit to the parties of a stay. This would include matters such as whether the parties were legally represented and the costs of the proposed dispute resolution process.

This decision shows judicial support for non-court based resolution by

establishing the principle that the Court can stay proceedings should parties fail to meaningfully engage in dispute resolution and it reinforces the importance of engaging in such a process at all stages of the litigation. Refusing to take part

in dispute resolution without good reason will be looked upon very dimly by the Court and is likely to result in costs sanctions against the objecting party.

UK still undecided on digital cash as privacy concerns persist

British authorities will not decide until next year at the earliest on whether to go ahead with a state-backed digital pound that would provide an alternative to

payments operated by banks and technology companies.

The Bank of England and Britain's finance ministry said they would continue preparatory work following a public consultation which drew 50,000 responses, many raising privacy concerns.

many raising privacy concerns.
"No final decision has been made to pursue a digital pound - also called a central bank digital currency," the BoE and

finance ministry said in a joint statement.

"The Bank and HM Treasury have progressed to the design phase of work on a digital pound and expect to decide whether to proceed to the build phase around the middle of the decade."

Other central banks, including the European Central Bank and the U.S. Federal Reserve, are also wrestling with privacy issues.

The European Union's legislation for underpinning a digital euro has been slowed by privacy concerns, prompting the bloc's financial services chief Mairead McGuinness to say last year that it was not

a "Big Brother project". Britain says a digital pound would be private but not anonymous, unlike physical cash.

As with existing bank accounts and credit card payments, authorities would be able to track transactions they suspect involve money laundering or finance

A digital pound would not replace cash, so the public would continue to have

"A digital pound would not replace cash, so the public would continue to have access to an anonymous payment option," the BoE and government said in their response to the consultation.

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak was an early supporter of the idea, calling on the BoE to start work on the project in 2021 when he was finance minister.

However, even if the project does get a go-ahead, it is unlikely to be operational until near the end of the decade.

Under the proposals, Britons would be able to hold electronic pounds - with the same value as physical cash - up to a limit of 10,000 to 20,000 pounds (\$12,700-\$25,400). Like cash, the money would not

Banks had lobbied for a lower limit of 3,000 to 5,000 pounds, fearing the project could lead to an outflow of money from standard bank accounts.

Last month, British lawmakers said the case for digital cash had not been made.

The use of physical cash is dwindling in Britain and the BoE has said a state-backed digital option could provide alternatives to existing bank payments or separate payment systems which large technology companies might develop. Legislation would be put in place to



researchers accounted for various potential confounding factors, including demographic (education, income, marital totals) behavioural (marital) status), behavioural (smoking, alcohol, caffeine intake, physical activity), psychosocial (stress, social connections), and medical (body mass index, various medical diagnoses, hormone therapy, snoring) aspects.

Understanding the glycemic index is crucial here. GI is a scale ranking foods from 0 to 100 based on their effect on

blood sugar levels post-consumption.
High-GI foods, which are rapidly digested and metabolised, causing blood sugar and insulin spikes, include processed grains (bread, pasta, baked goods, white rice) and foods with added sugars (sugary drinks, sweets).

Low-GI foods, which do not cause significant blood sugar and insulin spikes, include most fruits and vegetables, legumes, beans, nuts, seeds, and whole

Researchers hypothesise that high-GI foods may induce insomnia due to the rapid spike and subsequent crash in blood sugar levels.

The link between nutrition and various health aspects, including sleep, is well-established. Diet quality correlates with the risk of heart disease, strokes, dementia, depression, and cancer.



Ethnic minorities are unfairly assigned to the dance-off in Strictly Come Dancing, says Professor Keon West.

Now in its 21st series, Strictly Come Dancing is a staple in the TV calendar and one of the UK's most popular, and most diverse, shows. Yet its role has sparked fierce public debate.

The voting audience of Strictly Come Dancing regularly gives lower votes to pairs made up of BAME participants than the programme's professional judges do.

Data analysis of the show, reveals that despite achieving the judge's approval, BAME contestants invariably have to fight for survival in more bottom two dance-off contests than their non-BAME

Professor Keon West from Goldsmiths, University of London's paper 'Being asked to dance: Evidence of racial bias in audience voting behaviour on the television show Strictly Come Dancing' analysed data from the 2012 to 2021 series and found that the contestants most likely to be assigned to repeated dance-offs were racial minority celebrities who were paired with racial minority professional dancers and achieved high scores from the judges.

Professor West quantitatively analysed data from Seasons 10 (the one in which the dance-off was reinstated) to Season 19 of Strictly Come Dancing. The analyses looked at all the couples' appearances in the dance-off (the awful fate befalling the two least popular dancers) while taking into account their ethnicities and the scores they received from the judges.


The results were clear.

Professor West found that "the contestants who were most frequently assigned to the dance-off were racial minority celebrities coupled with racial minority professional dancers who obtained relatively high scores from the iudges

In other words, both professional dancers and celebrity contestants were penalised for their ethnic minority status, and this penalty was worse, not better if they danced well. The viewing public simply appeared to be less willing to vote for ethnic minorities.

Despite acknowledging that "the diversity on Strictly Come Dancing is a good thing", Professor West also cautioned that "diversity alone is not sufficient", and warned that "viewers who regularly see racial minorities excluded or rejected, even despite evidence of superior kill in a relevant domain, may come to see this treatment of racial minorities as normal or acceptable.







Drivers often cough up hundreds of pounds solving issues with their car after a failed MoT test - but thousands of savvy motorists are steering clear of hefty bills at the garage by using at-home diagnostic tools to scan their car for common faults that often lead to MoT failures.

That's according to vehicle diagnostic experts, OBDeleven, that discovered that the most common reasons for MoT failures, cited by the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA), are also among the most frequently detected issues identified by drivers using its pocket-sized diagnostic tool.

Data obtained from the DVSA

reveals that the most common MoT faults are defective lamps, reflectors and electrical equipment, accounting for one-in-four (26 per cent) of all defects spotted in 2022 to 2023.

However, last year, smart-thinking motorists used a simple plug-in tool to spot issues with their car's supply voltage on over 137,000 occasions in just a three-month period. Meanwhile, licence plate lamp and headlamp bulb issues were identified by drivers on over 12,000 and 10,000 occasions,

respectively.
Also, among the five most prevalent faults during MoT tests are issues with brakes, totalling 16 per cent of issues and tyres, which make up 12

per cent of MoT faults.

However, in 2023 there were over 21,000 instances of OBDeleven users pinpointing problems with their brake control modules, as well as over nearly 28,000 issues flagged with tyre pressure.

Juozapas Preikša, product

specialist at OBDeleven, commented: "Over one-in-four vehicles fail to pass a MoT test in the UK, so it's little wonder that test days are often a

daunting prospect for drivers. "However, motorists can be proactive in easing these concerns by scanning their vehicles for faults, at home, in advance of taking their vehicle to the garage.

"This equips drivers with

knowledge about their car which they would not previously have access to, and offers them the opportunity to conduct DIY repairs, should they feel confident doing so, or at least they can go to a garage armed with the information about the current status of their car.

Shortest reigning managers

29 days in charge of the League Two club, who find themselves stuck at the bottom of the table

Troy Deeney has been given the boot at Forest Green Rovers. The former Watford striker has been relieved of his managerial duties after just 29 days in charge of the League Two club, who find themselves stuck at the bottom of the table.

However, quick managerial changes are certainly not an issue exclusive to the lower leagues. In fact, there have been plenty of examples of managers getting the sack swiftly in the top flight too.

But who are the shortest-serving managers in the history of the Premier League? Betting.com has looked back on some of the shortest spells a football manager has ever had with a Premier League club.

League club.
With 14 permanent Premier League managers being sacked during the 2022/23 season, it was one of the least safe times to be a top flight gaffer.

safe times to be a top flight gaffer.

In fact three managers who were dismissed in 2022/23 all made the top ten in the shortest serving managers - Leeds' Javi Gracia and Sam Allardyce, plus Southampton's Nathan Jones.

Southampton's Nathan Jones.
Javi Gracia's 70 days at Elland Road makes him the third shortest-serving Premier League, but that's nothing on the man who immediately replaced him. Sam Allardyce's 25 day stint at Leeds United makes him the shortest-serving Premier League manager of all time.

Last season's situation was even bleaker for stand-in Spurs boss, Cristian Stellini who lasted just 31 days at the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium - taking charge of just four games in that time. Stellini is not ranked in this list, as his position was not permanent. Remarkably, the 31 days that Stellini spent as Spurs' caretaker is still even longer than Allardyce lasted at Leeds.

But Big Sam has forever taken one of the football's most unwanted titles away from Les Reed, who spent just 41 days in charge of Charlton Athletic, during the club's fateful 2006/07 season, which saw Charlton go through four different managers and be relegated in the process. After replacing Iain Dowie on 13 November 2006, Les Reed was relieved from his duties on Christmas Eve of the same year, with Alan Pardew

stepping in to replace him.

Charlton are not the only London-based club to have hastily got rid of managers in the past. Fulham's appointment of René Meulensteen in the 2013/14 season proved to be illadvised, as the Dutch coach, who had previously spent over a decade working under Sir Alex Ferguson at Manchester United was relieved from his duties at Craven Cottage after just 75 days.

Throughout Premier League history just 10 permanent managers have lasted for less than 100 days. Colin Todd of Derby County fell just short of that milestone in 2001/02, after he was sacked 98 days into his tenure as the Rams' manager. Terry Connor of Wolves also came close to the 100-day mark in 2011/12, but was unfortunately sacked after 91 days, following Wolves' relegation from the Premier League.

Other names to held shockingly short spells in charge of Premier League clubs include Frank de Boer, who was famously relieved of his duties by Crystal Palace just four games into the 2017/18 season, having only been appointed 77 days prior.

There's also Bob Bradley, the first of three Americans to hold a permanent managerial position in the Premier League and undoubtedly the least successful. The former USA head coach was appointed by Swansea City on 3 October 2016, and was sacked as quickly as 27 December 2016 - a spell of just 84 days

days.
Finally, Quique Sanchez Flores proved that going back to an old club is not always wise, after his second spell in charge of Watford was cut short. The Spaniard had enjoyed a successful time at Vicarage Road in 2015/16, but when he returned to replace

Javi Gracia in 2019/20 it proved to be a disaster, as he was sacked after just 85 days.

In May of 2018, Munguia won the WBO World Super Welterweight title, stopping Sadam 'World Kid' Ali, 26-1, four rounds in Verona, NY. He made five defenses, including defeating Liam 'Beefy' Smith, 26-1-1; Brandon 'Bad Boy' Cook, 20-1 in three rounds; Takeshi Inoue, 13-0-1; Dennis 'Hurricane' Hogan, 28-1-1 and

Patrick Allotey, 40-3 in four rounds. In February of 2018, Munguia won Munguia had three fights in 2022 his first title, stopping in three rounds



Argentina's Jose 'Puro' Carlos Paz, 21-6-1, for the vacant WBO Latino Super Welterweight title.

Hailing from Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico, Munguia has fought some thirty times in his home country, including his first twenty-five
