New play highlights the sorely neglected role that ethnic minorities played in the war effort



Noor Inayat Khan, also known as Nora Inayat-Khan and Nora Baker, was exceptional woman who worked for the 'S.O.E' (Special Operations Executive) tasked with espionage, sabotage and reconnaissance during World War Two.

tasked with espionage, sabotage and reconnaissance during World War Two.

As a wireless operator Noor's life expectancy is six weeks. Under the codename 'Madeline' she is flown by moonlight to occupied France with a bicycle, briefcase and a pistol. But with the Gestapo on her trail, and the net closing in, her life is in great danger.

Atkins trained Madeline and sent her to her position as a wireless operator in France.

But now the war is over she is haunted by what happened to the 'Indian princess' and intent on uncovering the truth.

Highlighting the sorely neglected role that ethnic minorities played in the war effort, 'S.O.E' aims to right a wrong and celebrate the contribution of these incredibly brave individuals. The national tour runs until Saturday, 27th

August – finishing with a run at the Edinburgh Festival.

"Minorities such as Noor have been sponged out of history quite deliberately," said the play's writer, Deborah Clair. "We've got to reverse and challenge that and I believe it is our duty to remember them."

As well as playing the role of Vera Atkins Deborah runs Clair Obscur – a female led-theatre company dedicated to placing inspiring women of the past centre-stage.

Their last play, 'A Necessary Woman', based on the suffragette Emily Davison, drew sell-out crowds to venues across the country and received coverage on national TV and radio.

S.O.E is directed by Dominique Gerrard and stars Natasha Jayahendry, Deborah Clair and Tim Marriot. It is produced by Deborah Clair and Nicholas Collett.

Noor's Early Life

Noor Inayat Khan,the eldest of four children, was born on 1st January 1914, in Moscow, and had two siblings.

siblings.
Her father, Inayat Khan, was born in Baroda, Bombay Presidency, and came from a family of Indian Muslims with hereditary nobles and classical musicians among both sides of his ancestors. His great-great-grandfather was the ruler of Mysore, Tipu Sultan. Her mother, Pirani Ameena Begum (born Ora Ray Baker), was an American from New Mexico, who met Inayat Khan during his travels in the United States.

In 1914, shortly before the outbreak of the First World War, the family left Russia for London, and lived in Bloomsbury. Noor attended nursery in Notting Hill. In 1920, the family moved to France, settling in Suresnes near Paris.

After the outbreak of the

After the outbreak of the Second World War, when France was invaded by German troops, the family fled to Bordeaux and then by sea to England, landing at Falmouth in Cornwall, on 22 June 1940.

Although Noor was deeply

influenced by pacifist ideals, she and her brother Vilayat decided they wanted to help defeat Nazi tyranny.

In November 1940, Noor joined the Women's Auxiliary Air Force (WAAF) and, as an Aircraftwoman 2nd Class, was sent to be trained as a wireless operator.


Later, Noor Inayat Khan was recruited to join F (France) Section of the Special Operations Executive: and in early February 1943 she was posted to the Air Ministry, Directorate of Air Intelligence, seconded to First Aid Nursing Yeomanry (FANY). She was sent to Wanborough Manor, near Guildford in Surrey, after which she was ordered to Avlesburv, in Buckinghamshire, for special training as a wireless operator in occupied territory.
After being captured by

After being captured by the Germans, she was executed on 13th September 1944.

Noor Inayat Khan was posthumously awarded the George Cross in 1949, and she was awarded a French Croix de Guerre with a silver star (avec étoile de vermeil).

government doesn't update its energy support package before winter, MPs have warned. A number of measures were unveiled earlier this year aimed at helping people pay their bills, as

prices rocketed due to a massive rise in wholesale energy costs. Most households will receive at

least £400, with more for people in vulnerable groups such as pensioners, the disabled, and those on low incomes.

But this was when the energy price cap went up by 54% to £1,791 for an household and average predicted to rise to around £2,800 in October.

The latest estimate is that October's rise will see the price cap reach £3,244 and the business, energy and industrial strategy committee said this would mean more help is needed.

The committee's chairman Darren

again, the energy crisis is racing ahead of the government.

"To prevent millions from dropping into unmanageable debt, it's imperative that the support package is updated and implemented before October, when the squeeze will become a full-on throttling of household finances and further tip the economy towards recession.

The committee has been hearing from experts, ministers, and industry insiders for months, and Mr Jones said the message was: "If you think things are bad now, you've not seen anything yet."

"This winter is going to be

"This winter is going to be extremely difficult for family finances, and it's therefore critical that public funds are better targeted to those who need it the most," he added.

The committee suggested that the energy price cap be axed in favour of

discounted tariff for the most vulnerable.

The committee of MPs also said that £94 will have to be added to bills to cover the costs of dozens of suppliers failing in little over a year.

It accused the regulator Ofgem of 'incompetence over many years" in allowing poorly-run companies to set up business as energy suppliers.

"Ofgem failed to use its existing

powers and didn't bring action against energy suppliers even when it was clear that they should have done," the committee said.



ELAIYA: against

Currently there's no matching donor on the bone marrow register so mum and dad are doing everything they can to raise awareness





The family of a 18-month-old girl with leukaemia are appealing to the British Pakistani community to help save her life.

Little Elaiya Hameed has acute myeloid

leukaemia - a rare cancer of white blood cells that can be cured by finding a stem cell donor of a similar heritage.

Described as a child with the most endearing, loving and warm personality, Elaiya is being treated at Queen's Medical Centre in Nottingham, and has been given just three to five weeks to receive a transplant to save her life. Someone from

Pakistani heritage could save her life.

Speaking to Asian Express, parents Summan and Muzahir say: "So far Elaiya has completed her first round of intense chemotherapy and has started her second round on Monday 18th July.

"She has coped really well, every single day she amazes us with her strength. She wakes up with a big smile on her face everyday no matter what health challenges she may face in the day."

Elaiya's cancer can be cured by peripheral blood stem cell collection (PBSC), transfusion or bone marrow donation.

The toddler had been a happy child, started showing signs of extreme fatigue, high temperature and abdominal distention in April 1000 Happers to the basis to Pictual Children. 2022. Her parents took her in to Bristol Children's Hospital for tests. Blood test results showed that her platelet levels were low and that it would take three to six months for her condition to improve.

Elaiya's platelet levels were increasing, so it was a shock when, in early May, she was unwell once again, feeling lethargic with a high temperature. Further tests were taken, then, devastatingly, the family was told that Elaiya has leukaemia.

Parents Summan and Muzahir say that their lives have come a halt since Elaiya was diagnosed.
"You never think it will be you," Summan says.

"Our life was almost too good to be true.



Amazing friends and family and two beautiful, healthy children - and there was nothing that could change that in our minds.

"But in the click of a finger, overnight, it felt like the world turned upside down for us," she adds.

"I was in my final year of dentistry and had my last set of exams in June.
"However Elaiya's diagnosis meant I was

unable to sit these exams as I couldn't leave her bedside and nor could I focus.
"Our lives currently revolve around Elaiya and

her needs, we had to relocate to another city and are spending everyday by her side.'

Mum and dad say they're now on a mission to raise awareness among the Pakistani and South Asian community because Elaiya is more likely to find a successful match from someone of the same ethnic origin.

"We're turning to people from the Pakistani community to step forward to see if they are a

"She is our angel child, we don't believe she has what she has. We look at her and think 'is this real?"

"I would like to emphasise how simple the process really is and how it is not invasive at all.

"It doesn't take much of your time and if you are somebody's match, it is as simple as giving

"There is such a shortage of Pakistani donors worldwide and I wouldn't want to wish this upon anyone to be in the position we are with 'no

"Due to the severity and aggressiveness of Elaiya's leukaemia, it is a race against time and

we will not be able to delay the transplant.

"So if we do not have a match by early September they will use me as I am a 50% match. This isn't good as it reduces the chance of a successful transplant, which is already low."

Muzahir, Elaiya's dad adds: "There is a

universal shortage of ethnic minority donors.





Illegal websites selling powerful drugs

An investigation has found dozens of illegal websites posing as pharmacies and selling powerful prescription drugs in the UK.

The pills, which treat conditions including chronic pain, anxiety and insomnia are addictive and most are banned as either Class A or Class C drugs without a doctor's prescription.

They include drugs commonly sold under the brand names of Xanax, Valium and Ambien.

Hundreds of pills can be ordered at a time, with discounts offered for bulk-buying and special promotions sent out by email.

The government regulator of medicines is warning that the drugs sold on these sites "can seriously damage your health"

Many pills are not what they claimed to be, a shocking amount are

also mislabelled.

One packet of tablets sold as sleeping pills was actually determined to be from a completely different family of drugs, Benzodiazepines, which are addictive and have completely different effects and

The websites are designed to look as legitimate as possible in order to reassure customers, but offer potentially dangerous quantities of strong medication with no questions asked. Anybody of any age can easily access the sites by conducting a simple internet search.
Almost all medications arrive in

plain brown envelopes and do not contain any instructions, as well as not including warnings about the risk of overdose or potentially dangerous interactions with other drugs or medical conditions.
The Medicines and Healthcare

products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) is responsible for investigating pharmacies and prescription drugs being sold in the UK. Alison Cave, MHRA Chief Officer

for Safety and Surveillance, said: "We take all reports of illegal websites seriously. All the sites highlighted to us by ITV are being reviewed and we will take appropriate action once investigations are complete."

"We would encourage the public to seek advice from our #fakemeds website and, if they are still unsure whether a website is legal, to avoid purchasing from it and report any suspicious offers, or side effects experienced from taking these medicines, to our Yellow Card scheme - the UK's system for recording adverse incidents with medicines and medical devices

Learners are given their own tablets so that they can access online resources and receive support from QED Foundation staff if they move elsewhere in the UK.

Multi-million p cash courier conspiracy dismantled The group are likely to have made in excess of £12 million from the money smuggled

RINGLEADER: Abdullah Mohammed Ali Bin Beyat Alfalasi

The ringleader of a money laundering group which smuggled tens of millions of pounds of criminal cash out of the UK has been jailed for nine years.

Abdullah Mohammed Ali Bin

Abdullah Mohammed Ali Bin Beyat Alfalasi arranged travel for a network of couriers, who between them smuggled £104 million from the UK to Dubai between November 2019 and October 2020.

2019 and October 2020.

The 47-year-old Emirati national was arrested by National Crime Agency officers at a flat in Belgravia during a visit to the UK in December last year.

Four of Alfalasi's couriers have already been convicted as part of the NCA's operation, which has been supported by Border Force and the Dubai Police, and others remain under investigation.

The cash was believed to be profits from drug dealing, and the couriers would pack hundreds of thousands of pounds at a time into suitcases. They were each paid £3,000 - £8,000 per trip depending on how much cash they

were smuggling.

Overall, the group took at least 10 per cent cut from the money smuggled, so between them are likely to have made in excess of £12 million from the venture.

Alfalasi made multiple cash trips himself between Dubai and the UK, from November 2019 to March 2020.

His name appeared on letters bearing the name Omnivest Gold Trading LLC, which was used to cover cash declarations made by the couriers. His phone number was also connected to their flight bookings.

The network collected cash from criminal groups around the UK and took it to counting houses, usually rented apartments in Central London.

The wads of bank notes were then vacuum packed and separated into suitcases which would each contain around £500,000, weighing around 40 kilos. Each would be sprayed with coffee or air fresheners in an effort to prevent them being found by Border Force detection dogs.

The couriers flew business class due

NCA senior investigating officer

Ian Truby said: "This money
laundering network smuggled
astronomical sums of money out of
the UK, and is one of the largest we've
ever investigated.

"Cash is the lifeblood of organised crime groups, which they re-invest into activities such as drug trafficking which fuels violence and insecurity around the world.

"Disrupting the supply of such illicit cash is a priority for the NCA and our partners

"This investigation doesn't stop here though, as we will continue to target cash couriers and hit crime groups where it hurts – in the pocket."

groups where it hurts – in the pocket."
International money laundering networks use cash smuggling, cryptocurrencies, and banking systems to move billions of pounds of dirty money each year.

This cash can be derived from the drugs trade, fraud, other illegal commodities, and even associated with terrorism and conflicts around the world.

Christina Brown, Director of Border Force National Operational HQ, said: "Clamping down on the export of undeclared cash from the UK is vital in our fight against organised criminal gangs.

"These convictions are the result of hard work and dedication from Border Force and the NCA to tackle dirty money that funds corruption and destroys lives.

"Those involved can be proud of their work and particularly those officers that intercepted and stopped these despicable individuals."

John Werhun of the CPS said: "This is one of the largest money laundering cases the CPS has ever prosecuted to date.

"A colossal amount of dirty money, totalling £104million, was transported to Dubai under Alfalasi's instructions. "The evidence against Alfalasi was

"A colossal amount of dirty money, totalling £104million, was transported to Dubai under Alfalasi's instructions. The evidence against Alfalasi was overwhelming, with invoices, declaration documents and images of cash-filled suitcases, pointing to his culpability."

Alfalasi's couriers

Among Alfalasi's couriers were 55-year-old Nicola Esson, from Leeds, who was arrested following NCA raids in May 2021, and 29-year-old Muhammad Ilyas, from Slough, who was apprehended in February 2020.

Esson travelled from Heathrow to Dubai on three occasions in August and September 2020, checking in 19 suitcases with a combined weight of almost half a tonne. She returned a few days after each trip with the same baggage items, which weighed significantly less each time.

Ilyas was arrested by NCA officers at Heathrow Airport after arriving on a flight from Dubai. He had checked in four suitcases at the airport ten days earlier, one of which had gone missing, and declared almost £1.5 million in cash to Dubai Customs. The missing suitcase was subsequently found by Border Force officers, and contained £431,360 in cash.

Esson, Ilyas and Alfalasi pleaded guilty to money laundering charges at Isleworth Crown Court on 18 May, 27 May and 27 June respectively. Alfalasi was sentenced at the same court today (28 July), with the remaining two due to be sentenced at a later date.

Two other couriers linked to the same network have already been jailed following investigations by the NCA.

Tara Hanlon, 31, from Leeds, was detained by Border Force at Heathrow in October 2020 as she attempted to leave the country with suitcases containing almost £2 million. She later admitted smuggling another £3.5 million out of the UK in other trips, and was sentenced to 34 months imprisonment in July 2021.

Czech national Zdenek Kamaryt, 39, was also stopped at Heathrow in November 2020. He was attempting to board a flight to Dubai carrying £1.4 million. Kamaryt pleaded guilty to 3 counts of money laundering and was sentenced to 34 months imprisonment in March last year.

"This money laundering network smuggled astronomical sums of money out of the UK, and is one of the largest we've ever investigated. Cash is the lifeblood of organised crime groups, which they re-invest into activities such as drug trafficking which fuels violence and insecurity around the world."





Patients with long-lasting symptoms from Covid will have access to more convenient tests and checks closer to home, under new NHS measures announced.

Specialist clinics, dedicated to long Covid, will now be able to send people for tests at local one stop shops and mobile clinics, rather than people going back to their GP practice for multiple different tests.

Backed by an additional £90 million investment, the updated long Covid plan includes ambitions for all patients to have an initial assessment within six weeks to ensure they are diagnosed and treated quickly.

Latest estimates from the ONS show that around 1.6 million people in England are experiencing ongoing Covid symptoms lasting more than four weeks, with around one in five saying it has a significant impact on their daily life.

The plan, which has been developed with expert insights from patients, clinicians and partners across the health and care system, shows the NHS has already made significant progress on delivering the 10 commitments it set out for long Covid services just over one

year ago.
This includes establishing a nationwide network of 90 specialist long Covid clinics, 14 hubs for children and young people and investment in training and guidance to support GP teams in managing the condition.

A community outreach van in Mid and South Essex is already seeing patients with suspected long Covid symptoms for booked appointments and walk-ins before referring them for further assessments where needed.

The mobile service offers a range of checks including blood pressure, heart rate, oxygen saturation, spirometry and other tests for breathlessness as well as electrocardiography.

"Whilst I'm still in the process of recovery, I can't speak highly enough of the long Covid clinic, for me it's been a lifeline and has helped me both physically and mentally. I would encourage anyone who is word enough to long Covid to seek help and speak to their GP team"

Fill up at a supermarket

Identifying

statutory guidance identifying and responding to domestic abuse and its impact on victims has been published by the Home Office.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 Statutory Guidance will ensure victims are supported to access frontline support that meets the complexity of their needs, by ensuring that the police, healthcare practitioners and local authorities have the necessary tools and information to offer tailored support to victims and survivors.

The guidance, released on 8th July, supports the implementation of the wide-ranging definition of domestic abuse and provides guidance to those working vith victims, including the police and local authorities.

statutory definition introduced in the Act incorporates a range of abuse beyond physical violence, including controlling or coercive behaviour, emotional, and, for the first time, economic abuse. The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 also recognises children who see, hear or experience domestic abuse as victims in their own right.

This new statutory guidance goes further to ensure that the complexity of domestic abuse is properly understood to support a coherent 'whole system' response to supporting victims and survivors, best practice approaches and encouraging multi-agency working, a whole system response will deliver the step change needed to tackle this

abhorrent crime, recognising that experience, and organisations shared everybody has a role to play in supporting victims and survivors of

domestic abuse.

Nicole Jacobs, said: "Domestic abuse has a horrific impact on victims, children and society more broadly. I welcome the publication of the statutory guidance which gives us a detailed blueprint for how we understand domestic abuse and how we improve our response to it.



The average British family bins one third of a ton of left-over food every year a study has revealed.

Research carried out among 2,000 adults found oversize portions from Chinese takeaways account for a large chunk of the staggering 745lbs or 338kgs of

Uneaten meat and vegetables from the popular weekend meal also find their way into the bin

frequently.
Parents who over-estimate family meal quantities and fussy kids who turn their nose up at dinner time also contributes to the

In fact, the study showed as many as six in ten families regularly fail to finish everything on their plates, so end up scraping the left-overs into the food bin.

The study found the average household will throw away 6.5 kilograms of food waste every week - a total of 338 kilograms or 745lbs a year.

And of that, almost one-fifth is made up of leftovers and cooked food that has gone uneaten - the equivalent of around three full

plates of food each week. 60% of Brits admitted they don't always eat everything that is put in front of them, with another 70% saying they usually have to scrape uneaten food off their children's plates as well. When it comes to children, 41% leave something because they are too fussy to eat it.

food from each meal might not seem like a lot, but when you add that up over a week or year, it's a staggering amount.

''Not only is it horrible to see

how much food gets wasted, but if you think of how much you spend buying that food in the first place, it can be quite unsettling.

"But it's interesting to see that

The study also found that 46% of Brits admitted they worry about the amount of food they throw away, with another 56% concerned about the cost. Despite this, 55% admit they know they often cook too much food for their family.

A spokesman for food waste disposal firm InSinkErator, which commissioned the research, said: "Throwing away the odd bit of odd waste away."

Chinese takeaway is one of the main meals we throw away. Many people order too much and end up struggling to eat it all.

family find it difficult to clear their plate and your food waste bin is bulging, cooking less will not only mean you end up saving yourself money but you won't have to deal with messy job of throwing the





When three brothers decided they wanted to set up a restaurant to share the delights of Asian cuisine with the people of Bradford, little did they know that 45 years later their multi award-winning business would still be running some of the most popular eateries in Yorkshire.

It was a gamble at the start. Led by eldest brother Mr Mohammed Sabir, younger brothers Zafar Iqbal and Mohammed Aslam took the plunge at giving the food business a go.

None of them had a background in the food industry – instead, working in textiles and the transport industry.

Mohammed Aslam explains: "I was working for London Transport whilst my brother Sabir ran the restaurant in Shipley. From London, I advised him to sell the restaurant. I told him it was 'rubbish' or words to that effect!

"However, when Sabir bought his business partner out, Sabir and his wife worked very hard and with their hard work, Aagrah became a decent recent restaurant.

"I then came and joined him on his advice. I began to do the food prep for the chef and to watch him as he worked. This was the beginning of my passion for food.

green sauce and mixing them in with a few dried onions. I'm exaggerating of course, but the point I'm making is that the vast majority of curry houses at the time were still producing a hybrid curry for the English palate, and very few were using all fresh ingredients."

It was this commitment to high quality food that has won the company numerous accolades.

Not only that, over the years they've catered for national snooker tournaments, created curry sauces, spice blends and other products to be sold at supermarkets, held chef masterclasses as well as feeding celebrities from across the globe.

In 2007, Aagrah were the official food partners for the IIFAs (International Indian Film Academy awards) - where Bollywood royalty such as Amitabh Bachchan, Shilpa Shetty and Rai-Bachchan to Dharmedra.

He concludes: "My brothers and I


have built the business up to where it is today. I'm extremely proud of what we've done and how we've shared our passion for promoting Asian cuisine.

Sentencing of human trafficker prompts Police appeal

The jailing of a man for modern slavery and offences linked to De prostitution has led to an appeal said: from detectives at a Leeds-based

Anghel Iordache was jailed for more than 11 years at Leeds Crown Court earlier this month.

Lordache, aged 49, of Harehills, was sentenced following an investigation which began when police responded to a request for a welfare check at an address in the city in March of this year.

The investigation which followed

Iordache's arrest led to safeguarding measures being put in place for two women who were found there.

Detectives from Leeds Child Vulnerable to Exploitation Team (CVET) believe it is likely that Iordache may have trafficked other women into the country for the purpose of sexual exploitation, and are encouraging anyone who believes they were a victim to contact

Detective Inspector Al Cheyne, said: "I hope this outcome will give people confidence to report activity which could be linked to modern slavery to the police, so we can take action with partners against those who are involved in this appalling practice.

"We would like to take this opportunity, now Iordache is behind bars for a significant length of time, to appeal to women who believe they were trafficked into the country by

"Anyone coming forward should be reassured that they will be supported by our specially trained officers, who work in partnership with agencies to investigate these matters thoroughly and with discretion to bring perpetrators of this horrible crime to justice."

With the assistance of a volunteer, also a thalassemia patient, Adam set up his charity - Thalassemia Relief; which works with the Amna Jahagheer Thalassemia Centre in Kotli, Pakistan.

Bilal and Adam have worked tirelessly to create awareness

of this treatable disease and fundraise for treatment.
"As the team got bigger we had more patients volunteering, which has helped the charity grow," adds 'The last six months has been a great journey - from

starting with six patients we have now over 50+ patients receiving 100% long term blood transfusions and iron chelation medicines.

"We provide blood transfusions, blood tests, iron chelation medicine, food, transport, blood camps, medical equipment, specialist appointments and raise awareness of the condition.

"We're working with the Amna Jahangheer Thalassemia Centre (Kotli), Azad Kashmir, and almost all of the patients being treated are at this centre. They are so poor that they can not afford to pay for basic care, and we take care of this

Trying to Beat the System

he Hight Court has recently rejected an attempt by a firm of solicitors to issue multiple claims on a single Claim Form.

on a single Claim Form.

In the case of Abbott & Others v
Ministry of Defence Hugh James
Solicitors represented 3,500 Claimants
who were all seeking damages against
the Ministry of Defence for noiseinduced hearing loss which they claim
had been caused during military
service. Hugh James sought to issue all
3,500 claims on one Claim Form for
which there would be one issue fee
payable to the court rather than 3,500
separate fees for each Claim Form.
The High Court Master ruled that it

was impermissible to join multiple Claimants with widely different claims on a single Claim Form. The Master said that although the individual claims all featured a common Defendant with some common themes, they were "far too disparate" and that they consisted of "a huge variety of unitary claims".

Further, the Master noted that placing

Further, the Master noted that placing 3,500 separate claims with one Claim Form would put an impossible strain on the court's computerised case management system. He referred to an instance where the court staff had mistakenly closed an entire group action when they were informed that (only) one of the cases from the group had settled.

The Master directed that unless individual Claim Forms were issued within 6 months then the claims would be struck out.

Under English Law, it is possible to bring group actions where multiple Claimants issue one Claim Form. For example, the Claimants seeking compensation against car manufacturers in the diesel emissions litigation is being pursued as a group action. The ability to issue a group claim under a single Claim Form undoubtedly increases access to justice as, currently, Claimants need to pay a court issue fee equivalent to 5% of the value of their claim up to a maximum of £10,000 and this could be unaffordable to many Claimants who do not qualify for a fee remission, particularly

economic climate. However, given that it is the Government's

aim to make the courts self-sufficient and less reliant on public funds, it is understandable that judges may view attempts to avoid paying court fees as an abuse of process. But therein lies the dilemma; affordability over access to justice even if it is at the expense of the taxpayer. Is the think-tank in Whitehall watching the tide ebb closer to further privatising parts of Her Majesty's court system?

Consider a family 'tech agreement'

One way to set ground rules with your child is to create a Family Tech Agreement. A family tech agreement answers as many questions as possible about internet and device use so boundaries are clear to all family members. It's a good way for the whole family to talk about safe and responsible online behaviours.

Using these programs, parents can also set up regular virus checks and deep system scans to make sure there is no harmful activity happening under your nose.

A VPN hides users' internet activity from snoops and spoofs your location. This protects your kids by making sure hackers or predators can't detect their actual location. You can install a VPN on your router so that the location is spoofed on all connected devices.

Set parental controls

It may seem obvious, but parental controls are crucial to your child's safety online. Parent controls are built-in features included on devices and apps. With these features, parents customise their child's online experience. 

BFI Expanded presents an animated Virtual Reality journey through the largest forced migration in human history - the 1947 Partition of India and Pakistan



Child of Empire

Taking audiences through a deeply personal perspective of this epic historical event, the free installation at BFI Southbank is presented by BFI Expanded, the BFI's year-round programme strand dedicated to immersive art and extended realities (XR).

August 2022 marks the 75th anniversary of the Partition of the Indian subcontinent and the emergence of India and Pakistan as independent nation-states. British colonialism came to an end and the confrontation between the two nations led to the displacement of some 15 million people and the tragic death of more than one

Child of Empire takes audiences through this critical moment in history, following the stories of two men from the Partition generation; Ishar Das Arora (voiced by Adil Hussain), an Indian Hindu who migrated from Pakistan to India, and Iqbal-ud-din Ahmed (voiced by Salman Shahid), a Pakistani Muslim who made the opposite journey -who each share childhood memories of their experiences while playing a board game.

As the two men unpack their memories, audiences embody the experience of a seven year old child

at key points in the migration.
Child of Empire places viewers at the heart of the experience, offering a powerful counter-narrative and a fresh perspective on the devastating

effects of forced migration on everyday individuals.

The world premiere of Lost Migrations, a powerful three-part animation that ruminates on the impact of the Partition, also premieres at BFI Southbank on 1 August 2022. Shining a light on stories from communities that have been excluded from South Asian literature and historiography: women, the Chettiar diaspora and stateless, the animation showcases the diverse voices of the subcontinent and celebrates the individuality of each community.

By highlighting the similarities of migration journeys on either side of the border, Child of Empire is a reminder that it is ordinary people that suffer the most when nationalisms are created and torn apart by political elites.

Sparsh Ahuja, Child of Empire co-creator, said: "75 years after their migrations, Partition remains a deeply personal experience for my two grandfathers (Ishar and Jagdish) who directly inspired this

"By highlighting the similarities of migration journeys on either side of the border, Child of Empire is a reminder that it is ordinary people that suffer the most when nationalisms are created and torn

apart by political elites.
"This film is a challenge to the divisive communalism that unfortunately plagues the subcontinent today. As a child of diaspora, I have come to understand that the important stories of migration are not those of the politics that dictate it, but the

people it uproots."

Both Child of Empire and Lost
Migrations form part of Project Dastaan - a peace-building initiative which examines the human impact of global migration through the lens of the 1947 Partition of India and Pakistan.

Child of Empire had its world premiere at the 2022 Sundance Film Festival as part of the 'New Frontier' programming slate. It was presented in the Alternate Realities strand at the 2022 Sheffield Doc/Fest and was previously selected for the Venice Film Festival's Gap Financing Market, hosted as part of the 2020 Biennale.

Ms Marvel:

First Pakistani Muslim superhero refreshingly bats misconceptions



The release of Ms Marvel. Disney's first on-screen Muslim superhero story, has been described as a "joyful" slice of "pop culture history", with a storyline as much about Pakistani heritage as battling evil. The Marvel series centres

around a geeky teenager 'Kamala Khan', played by the brilliant Pakistani-Canadian newcomer Iman Vellani.
'Kamala', who's a raving

Avengers comic book fangirl with an oversized imagination, struggles to fit in at school, and sometimes even at home. However, that soon changes when she happens to stumble upon an old bracelet that belonged to her reputedly mystical great-grandmother. The bangle has links to Kamala's Pakistani heritage and the trauma of the 1947

The series so far on Disney+ hasn't disappointed. Fans of Marvel, and even those who are not, have left positive raving Subtle corrections on everyday

misdemeanours Pakistanis and Muslims face in the Western world have cleverly been interwoven into the fabric of the storyline.

'Kamala' wistfully mentioning how 'superheroes' can't be 'brown girls from New Jersey', to correcting a teacher at school for the first time (after she discovers her superpowers) on the pronunciation of her name, is an applaudable distinct commitment from Marvel to engage with its

diverse audiences.

And it doesn't stop there,
Marvel embraced Nisha K Ali as head writer for the series, as well empowering Muslim directors to create the episodes, namely Adil El Arbi, Bilall Fallah (the duo behind 'Bad Boys for Life'), Meera Menon, and Oscar-winning celebrated documentarian Sharmeen Obaid-Chinoy.

Marvel's superheroes have made the transition from the pages of comic books and onto TV and film screens since the 1970s. More recently there have been attempts made to diversify its characters with mega productions such as 'Black Panther' and 'Shang-Chi and The Legend of The Ten Rings'

Ms Marvel is proving equally on-point. The series reflects the love of South Asian cultures, and humorously but sensitively reflects the cultural gap of families living in the West - that being between parents rooted to tradition, and their children caught between their sense of identity and the

desire to assimilate.

Iman Vellani first appeared in a solo comic book series in 2014, and Rolling Stone magazine described the character as "a

genuinely great addition to the Marvel superhero ranks in print".

The actress, who secured the role after her aunt (by chance) sent her a Whatsapp with details of the casting call, said she first thought it was a scam.

Iman noted how her Pakistani heritage was something she had been "very dismissive about" and "disconnected from" before making the show. "I think Ms. Marvel, you know,

always understood fan culture on such a cellular level, and it just really elevated the storytelling in a really unique way," says Iman.
"She's a 16-year-old kid with super powers, fine, we've seen that

before. But she's also a fan of every other hero within the Marvel Cinematic Universe canon.

"And you know, that fascination and excitement is so shared with real-life Marvel fans, so that's why we relate to her. She reacts how we would when she gets powers. And so yeah, I love that part of her, and that's why I fell in love with her.

"Culture and religion were never the main thing of her personality, it was just some part of her life... how it was for me...

"We didn't wanna make the show just about a Pakistani Muslim, it was about, you know this Avengers loving, fanfic writing dork, which just so happens to be a Pakistani Muslim. I think we were balanced it quite well."





Over the next few days, more than 5,000 athletes from a total of 72 nations will compete across 19

It will also be the first major multi-sport games to award more medals to women than men. England, Australia and Canada will be joined by lesser-known

will be joined by lesser-known federations such as Norfolk Island, which will be represented in the second city by 14 lawn bowlers.

Bearing the flag for Team England during the ceremony was diver Jack Laugher and weightlifter Emily Campbell.

Throughout the performance, a video played showing a star falling to earth and various people, known as Stella and the Dreamers, collecting pieces of it.

The ceremony aimed to tell the

story of the group as they discover Birmingham, meeting historical people from the city, who are depicted with bizarre giant figures, and learning about its past as they

go.

The first part of the show concluded with 72 houses appearing in the stadium, representing each of the nations competing this year.

A tribute was also paid to the

Commonwealth, with a combination of clips played showing various appearances and speeches during her role as the head of state.

While she was not at the opening ceremony, Charles and Camilla were there to represent the Royal Family - making quite the entrance by driving into the stadium in an Aston Martin.

In a perhaps unexpected appearance, Pakistani activist Malala Yousafzai took to the stage to deliver an inspirational speech about her experience in the city.

"Over the next few weeks, as we watch the incredible athletes of the Commonwealth Games, remember that every child deserves the chance to reach her full potential and pursue her wildest dreams, she said.

The world's youngest Nobel Prize laureate was taken to the Queen Elizabeth hospital in Birmingham in 2012 after she was shot in the head in Pakistan for

demanding the right to education. CGF President Dame Louise Martin DBE said: "Our 72 nations and territories are all here - and Birmingham looks magnificent.

"The city and wider region will provide the perfect stage for our athletes to compete. I believe this event will be one of the greatest and most important editions of the Commonwealth Games in our 92-
