

Coalition challenges as India's Modi Sworn in as PM for third term

Narendra Modi was inaugurated as India's prime minister for a third term on Sunday 9th June, following an unexpected election setback that will challenge his ability to maintain policy stability within a coalition government in the world's most populous nation.

President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Modi at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi. The ceremony was attended by thousands of dignitaries, including leaders from seven regional countries, Bollywood stars, and industrialists.

Supporters celebrated enthusiastically as the 73-year-old leader, wearing a white kurta and blue half-jacket, took his oath. Following Modi, senior ministers from his previous administration - Rajnath Singh, Amit Shah, Nitin Gadkari, Nirmala Sitharaman, Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, and Piyush Goyal - were also sworn in.

Modi, originally a publicist for the Hindu nationalist Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh, the BJP's ideological parent, is only the second person after Jawaharlal Nehru to serve a third consecutive term as prime minister.

He secured this term after a multi-stage election concluding on 1st June, with the support of 14 regional parties in his BJP-led National Democratic Alliance. In contrast to his previous outright majority victories, this outcome was seen as a setback, as polls had predicted an even stronger showing.

Modi's tenure has delivered significant economic growth and elevated India's global profile, but domestic challenges like insufficient job creation, high prices, low incomes, and religious tensions have led to voter dissatisfaction.

As the former chief minister of Gujarat from 2001 to 2014, Modi enjoyed strong majorities, enabling decisive governance. His new term as prime minister, however, is expected to involve complex negotiations to build consensus on political and policy issues amid diverse regional interests and a stronger opposition.



Report: Qurbani costs and consumer concerns in the UK

Qurbani, the Islamic tradition of sacrificing an animal during the month of Dhul Hijjah, holds significant religious and cultural importance for Muslims.

Eid al-Adha, also known as the Festival of Sacrifice, is celebrated over four days, and involves the ritual sacrifice of animals (usually sheep, goats, or cattle) to mark this occasion.

Muslim consumers eagerly await this occasion, as it signifies the fulfilment of their religious obligation. The meat from animals sacrificed during Eid al-Adha holds special significance and is distributed among family, friends, and as charity to those in need.

In the UK, Qurbani practices have evolved over time, but recent concerns have arisen regarding the cost of Qurbani and its impact on Muslim consumers.

Price hikes and unfair advantage

Muslim consumers have expressed concerns about potential price hikes during Qurbani. Many fear that farmers and sellers may take unfair advantage of the increased demand during Eid al-Adha.

As the festival approaches, prices for sacrificial animals, particularly ewes, may rise significantly. This situation could disproportionately affect Muslim households, especially those with limited financial resources.

Comparing the prices charged during Easter (a Christian festival) to those during Qurbani, some halal consumers perceive the price hike as discriminatory.

They believe that such practices unfairly target Muslim communities and exploit their religious obligations. Ensuring transparency and fairness in pricing is essential to address these concerns.

FSA Regulations and Health Risks

The Food Standards Agency (FSA) plays a crucial role in ensuring the safety and quality of meat consumed during Qurbani. However, there are apprehensions that the FSA's relaxation of regulations regarding hot meat transport specifically for Qurbani could pose serious health risks to UK halal consumers.

Proper handling, storage, and hygiene practices are essential to prevent food-borne illnesses.

If the unfair price hikes continue, social media influencer Mr. Halal, a staunch supporter of British farmers, may advise Halal consumers to consider alternative solutions. One such solution could be reforming their Qurbani practices abroad in developing countries. There, they may find more cost-effective options, allowing them to perform their Qurbani at a fraction of the cost compared to the LIK

Balancing religious observance, consumer rights, and food safety remains a challenge during Qurbani. As the UK's Muslim population continues to grow, addressing these concerns becomes even more critical. Ensuring fair pricing, transparent practices, and adherence to food safety standards will contribute to a meaningful and safe Qurbani experience for all.





India: Modi's pledge to lead the country by consensus must not be another failed promise for human rights

Responding to the swearing in of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi for a third term and his stated promise to lead the country by consensus and uphold the values of the Indian constitution, Aakar Patel, Chair of Amnesty International India's board, said: "Over the past 10 years, the government of Narendra Modi has repeatedly trampled on dissent and discriminated against religious minorities.

"There is also not a single Muslim in his new cabinet, while laws such as the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), which was passed during his previous term, effectively sanctioned religious discrimination. "Over the past decade, however, activists, journalists, civil society organisations and political leaders from opposition parties have all been targeted for criticising the authorities.


"It is essential that the new administration respect human rights, including the rights to freedom of expression, association, and peaceful assembly".


"When Narendra Modi was sworn in as Prime Minister in 2019, he said his government would support all people and offer development for all through consensus— 'sabka ka saath, sabka vikaas'.

"But, this turned out to be a failed promise, which did not lead to an improvement of human rights in the country. Modi's new pledge of leading by consensus must not turn into yet another failed promise."

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was sworn in as prime minister on Sunday 9th April. This is his third term as Prime Minister of India. But for the first time, Narendra Modi will be leading a coalition government after his party failed to get majority in the Lok Sabha elections.

On 7th June 2024, two days before he was sworn in for a third term, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said "a majority may be needed to run a government, but consensus is needed to run the country".





The NHS has announced the 143 hospital sites that will test and roll out Martha's Rule in its first year.

The purpose of Martha's Rule is to provide a consistent and understandable way for patients and families to seek an urgent review if their or their loved one's condition deteriorates and they are concerned this is not being responded to.

The scheme is named after thirteenyear-old Martha Mills, who died from sepsis having been treated at King's College Hospital, London, in 2021, due to a failure to escalate her to intensive care, and after her family's concerns about her deteriorating condition were not responded to.

The initial target was to enrol at least 100 sites, but due to significant interest from frontline clinicians this has been expanded, meaning this first phase of the programme will be in place at 143 locations across the country by March 2025.

NHS England is working with Martha's parents to develop materials to advertise and explain the initiative in hospitals across the country, to

World university ranking success for Bradford

The University of Bradford has been placed among the top 550 universities in the world, according to a new ranking.

Bradford is 531th in the QS World University Rankings 2025, the university's highest placing since 2014. It shows a climb up the rankings from last year's classification for Bradford, which was in the 641-650 band.

The QS World University Rankings have been published since 2004 and this year's list reveals the top 1,503 global institutions, including 91 from the UK, across 106 different nations.

Nine indicators are used to compile the overall rankings, with each university scored on: Academic Reputation, Citations Per Faculty, Employer Reputation, Employment Outcomes, Faculty Student Ratio, International Faculty, International Research Network, International Students and Sustainability. The University of Bradford's overall score has improved by 4.6 points this year.

Bradford received its highest ranking in the International Students category, where it finished 75th place globally, a rise of 24 places on the previous year, with a score of 97.6 points, and sustainability where the university rose 487 places with a score of 40.7 compared to 3.4 the previous year. These results showcase the international credentials and the diversity of the university and the associated benefits it offers to our students and their employment outcomes.

Professor Shirley Congdon, Vice-Chancellor of the University of Bradford, said: "I am delighted that the hard work and dedication of our staff – as well as the achievements of our students and graduates - have been recognised by this ranking.

"This success clearly shows we are moving in the right direction among the world's universities and that we are making a difference both locally and globally."

143 Hospitals to roll out 'Martha's Rule' as part of major patient safety initiative

ensure it is something that all patients, staff, and their families can recognise.

Martha's Rule is to be made up of three components to ensure concerns about deterioration can be swiftly responded to.

Firstly, an escalation process will be available 24/7 at all the 143 sites, advertised throughout the hospitals on posters and leaflets, enabling patients and families to contact a critical care outreach team that can swiftly assess a case and escalate care if necessary.

Secondly, NHS staff will also have access to this same process if they have concerns about a patient's condition.

Finally, alongside this, clinicians at participating hospitals will also formally record daily insights and information about a patient's health directly from their families, ensuring any concerning changes in behaviour or condition noticed by the people who know the patient best are considered by staff.

Extensive campaigning by her parents Merope and Paul, supported by the cross-party think tank Demos, saw widespread support for a single system that allows patients or their families to trigger an urgent clinical review from a different team in the hospital if the patient's condition is rapidly worsening and they feel they are not getting the care they need.

Merope Mills and Paul Laity, Martha's parents, said: "We are pleased that the roll-out of Martha's Rule is off to a flying start and that the need for it has been so widely recognised.

"It will save lives and encourage better, more open, communication on hospital wards, so that patients feel they are listened to, and partners in their healthcare."

NHS national patient safety director and senior responsible officer for Martha's Rule, Dr Aidan Fowler, said: "Working closely with Martha's parents and colleagues across the NHS over the last few months on this rollout, I am in no doubt this programme will deliver clear change and it has been so encouraging to see how many hospitals have shown interest in being part of delivering these all-important patient safety measures this year.

Star of 'United 93', 'The Kite Runner' and 'The Crown', Khalid Abdalla, in his writing debut, has created an intricate and playful solo show, inspired by his involvement in the Egyptian revolution of 2011, and his experiences of the counter-revolution that followed.

Khalid Abdalla said: "When I had my first conversation about Nowhere, Egypt, where I was living, was in the heart of a counter-revolution, with a military dictatorship purging another future.

"Back in London I started writing weeks after George Floyd's murder, while the world was in lockdown. And now, as we approach opening, we live in a world in which for people in Gaza, nowhere is safe, and we live in the shadow of that everywhere.

"If you want to live another future now, where can you be? And how do you find it in yourself?

"'Nowhere' is my attempt to respond to our world of intersecting crises, tracking where they live inside me, while searching for a shared space in which to explore how we got here, and what we have to reckon with to reach beyond it.

"I could not have dreamed of a better creative team to accompany me on the journey of developing this project into the theatrical experience I hope it will be. Theatre is the home through which we encounter each other in a world increasingly atomised. I am beyond excited to bring Nowhere to audiences and find out where we take each other through its life onstage."

personal show, interrogating themes that are very close to my heart both as an artist and as an individual confronting the complex questions around identity and belonging in an increasingly polarised world."



Life Is Sad And Beautiful has since been adopted in the UK's Key Stage 3 and 4 National Curriculum.



In 2018, Prime Minister Theresa May went on to award him the Point of Light award, recognising his outstanding efforts in helping the country's mental health crisis. He was also awarded an Honorary Fellowship of King's College London in 2018.

Leeds City Council has confirmed its commitment to commemorating the inspirational life and achievements of the late Rob Burrow.

Leeds Rhinos legend Rob touched hearts worldwide with his determination to raise funds and awareness for all those affected by motor neurone disease (MND) after he was diagnosed with the condition in 2019.

His sad death earlier this month prompted an outpouring of emotion across Leeds and the rest of the country, with a sea of flowers, shirts and other mementoes being placed by fans outside the AMT Headingley Rugby Stadium home of the Rhinos

Now a meeting of the council's executive board is set to receive an update on plans to ensure that Rob's remarkable story is never forgotten.

The meeting, being held Wednesday 19th June 19, will be told that – given his hugely positive impact on Leeds - it is important for the city to find a suitable way of celebrating his achievements both on and off the field

A report being presented to the meeting makes it clear that no decision has yet been taken on how best to honour Rob

The report also stresses that the council will work closely with Rob's family and the Rhinos as it explores ideas for a lasting tribute to a man who epitomised the very best of Leeds.

Alongside this, the council will continue to give its wholehearted backing to the new Rob Burrow Centre for MND that is taking shape at Seacroft Hospital.

The report also confirms that plans are being put in place for a large-scale civic event to be held in Rob's memory in the near future.

Councillor James Lewis, leader of Leeds City Council, said: "Rob was a true Leeds hero, with his courage and relentless positivity inspiring people across the city and far beyond.

"The love, respect and admiration we have seen in the days since his death has been very moving, and illustrates how much he meant to

"We now want to help commemorate Rob's life, both as a sporting great and as someone whose struggle with MND made his name synonymous with bravery.

"It will be our privilege to work with Rob's family, the Rhinos and indeed the city as a whole to make sure his legacy lives on."

Rob made nearly 500 appearances for the Rhinos between 2001 and 2017, winning eight Super League titles, two Challenge Cups and three World Club Challenge trophies.

He was also a committed ambassador for club and city, giving enthusiastic support to the community-based work of the Leeds Rhinos Foundation and initiatives such as the council's Child Friendly Leeds programme.

Following his diagnosis, he spearheaded a Leeds Hospitals Charity appeal to raise funds for a specialist MND care centre, with the ground-breaking on the project taking place at Seacroft Hospital earlier this month.

Rob's friend and former Rhinos team-mate Kevin Sinfield has also raised millions of pounds for MND-related causes by completing a series of endurance challenges.

The pair's tireless work on behalf of others was recognised when they were awarded the freedom of Leeds in a ceremony at Leeds Civic Hall in 2023.

Another tribute came with the launch of the council-backed Rob Burrow Leeds Marathon, with the first two stagings of the event attracting thousands of runners and raising more than £7m for charity.

A mural depicting Rob in his all-conquering playing days has also taken pride of place on the Leeds Beckett University student union building on Woodhouse Lane since 2020.

"Running down your past jobs and companies will not do you any favours. So if you left a job because you resented it, or you don't get along with your boss or colleagues, it's probably better to

"No one gets on with everyone, and there's bound to be a few awkward characters in any office. However, talking bad about your ex-boss, ex-colleagues, or companies can give an impression that you're difficult to work with," explains Amelia.

Future plans

"Where do you see yourself in five years?" is still a common interview question. "Steer clear of mentioning future plans unrelated to the company," explains Amelia.

"Companies seek top talent to grow alongside them. Hinting that you're only after a shortterm position will likely hurt your chances."

Hobbies

"If you decide to include your hobbies and interests in your CV, it is likely better to avoid listing Netflix & Chill, unless, of course, you're applying for a job at Netflix," says Amelia.

"Best keep your hobbies relevant to the role or company culture, otherwise leave them out altogether."

Revealing your biggest weakness might not be the best move. "You should answer this question with a bit of finesse," says Amelia.

"Instead of mentioning your actual weaknesses, mention one that doesn't hold you back in the job at hand. Additionally, explaining how you're working to improve it might help you score extra points if your answer is logical and coherent." concludes Amelia.









- All housing legal aid providers in the sample were loss-making from their civil legal aid work, including all private sector solicitors offering housing legal aid * *
- 47% of providers sampled working in family legal aid were also loss making
- All not-for-profit providers sampled in both areas of law were making a loss

Civil legal aid providers at breaking point

Civil legal aid work is lossmaking for the majority of providers*, according to new research by the Law Society of England and Wales.

A study commissioned by the Law Society from Frontier Economics has worked with providers of housing and family legal aid, who are a mix of not-for-profit organisations and private solicitor practices, to understand in-depth their operating model and financial situation.

Law Society president Nick Emmerson said: "This research reveals an untenable situation where reductions in fee levels by successive governments mean fee-earning staff cannot even recover the costs of providing legal aid, let alone generate a profit to make the organisation sustainable.

"Those who remain in the market are only able to do so by cross-subsidising from other areas and relying on the goodwill of staff to regularly work overtime, leading to real difficulties with recruitment and retention – especially at senior levels of the profession.

"Others are taking the decision that legal aid work is simply no longer viable and exiting the market, leaving areas of the country with no legal aid provision at all. "This is just not sustainable and is resulting in massive market exit, with advice deserts growing across the country. It is a significant concern when a city the size of Liverpool struggles to sustain housing provision and the family courts are flooded with litigants in person. These figures provide clear evidence of the reasons why."


Nick Emmerson concluded: "This vital research cannot be ignored if the UK government is serious about meeting its obligations to provide legal aid services. With the Civil Legal Aid Review now in its final stages, this research provides a model for future analysis and

setting of fee rates at a realistic and sustainable level that is fair to both providers and taxpayers.

"Moving money around within the existing fee structures or between areas of law will not work and will only make other parts of the system even less sustainable.

"The Law Society's work with Frontier has created a framework that government can use going forward to analyse the costs of providing a civil legal aid contract and the associated profits (or losses) from this work.

"Without a recommendation for a significant fee increase in all areas, the Review will not have been fit for purpose."

Huddersfield named Most Improved University in UK in 2025 QS World Rankings

The University of Huddersfield has surged in the 2025 QS World University Rankings making it the Most Improved University in the UK.

The University's reputation with employers and among academics around the world has seen it make significant progress in the latest overall rankings compiled annually by QS.

It is now on the brink of the top 500, having placed in 501st position and among the very best institutions worldwide. This constitutes a 66-place rise from last year's 567th ranking position.

3USINESS ROUND-UP

Supreme Court Eradicates Japanese Knotweed Claim

Readers of this publication may recall the case of Davies v Bridgend County Borough Council regarding Japanese knotweed which has featured in previous articles.

In that case, Mr Davies bought land in South Wales that was next to land belonging to the Council which had suffered from Japanese knotweed. The Council had treated the knotweed, but Mr Davies claimed that the value of his land had been reduced because of the ongoing plight caused by the Knotweed and the stigma attached to it. The Court of Appeal agreed and ruled that the diminution in value of a property following encroachment of Japanese knotweed from neighbouring land was a recoverable loss and allowed Mr Davies' claim. The Council appealed that decision.

Prior to Mr Davies purchasing his land in 2004, the knotweed had already spread from the Council's land. In 2004, the encroachment of Japanese knotweed onto neighbouring land was not an actionable private nuisance but it was in 2013 by which



to succeed in establishing the tort of private nuisance he had to establish that the Council's breach of duty did in fact cause the loss suffered. The question which the Court had to address was, would the diminution in value of Mr Davies' land have occurred "but for" the breach of duty by the Council between 2013 and 2018? If the diminution in value would have occurred in any event, then the Council's breach of duty was not the cause of the diminution in value so there would be no causal link between the Council's breach of duty and the diminution in value of Mr Davies' land


The Court found that the diminution in value in Mr Davies' land had occurred long before any breach by the Council of its duty which first occurred in 2013. Accordingly, the application of the "but for" test eliminated the Council's subsequent breach of duty as a causative factor as the diminution in value would have occurred anyway. No evidence was put forward by Mr Davies to show that the Council's breach of duty between 2013 and 2018 had materially contributed to the diminution in the value of his land. Instead, the encroachment and resultant diminution had occurred long before any breach by the Council. The Council's subsequent breach was therefore of no consequence and it was not a causative factor. Accordingly, the Supreme Court ruled that the diminution in value of Mr Davies' land was not caused by the Council's tortious conduct and therefore no damages should be awarded.

This decision will make it more difficult for property owners to pursue claims against neighbouring owners whose properties suffer from Japanese knotweed if the knotweed was already present before they purchased their property. From a practical perspective, purchasers are advised when acquiring properties at risk to seek full and specific disclosure on the existence (or not) of Japanese knotweed and to undertake professional inspections from a suitable expert (horticultural consultant) as the findings may impact on the purchase price. Strengthen your phone's security in 10 minutes



Things every smartphone owner should do to keep their data safe

It's important to keep your personal data hidden from prying eyes, and for many of us, our smartphone is an essential part of daily life — it helps us communicate, make payments on the move and store sensitive data. As a result, learning how to secure your device against threats is crucial.

Taking additional steps to keep your private information safe doesn't need to take long. You can make tweaks to your device settings in minutes that have a huge impact.

1. Check for security updates

Before we start our list of actions, it's worth ensuring that your phone is running the latest security update. This protects you against vulnerabilities in the operating system (OS) that hackers could take advantage of to steal your data (including passwords).

To check if your smartphone is up to date, run through these steps:

- On iPhone— Load up Settings and choose General. Tap About to see your iOS version. You can also choose Software update to check for updates. The iPhone XR and newer models receive security updates, while earlier models do not.
- On Android Open the Settings app and look for an option that says About phone or similar. Tap it and look for Android version remember that Android 10 and earlier are no longer supported. From the main

Settings screen, you can also find an Update option. On a Google Pixel, for example, the steps would be Settings > System > Software updates.

2. Set up Face Unlock / Fingerprint Unlock

You can technically set up a new smartphone without implementing any security measures to unlock it. That's a very risky decision, though, as anybody with access to your phone could load up apps, make calls and transfer files to other devices.

If your phone doesn't have any additional unlock protection at the moment, get it added right away.

Here's how to do it:

• On iPhone – To use Face ID (available on iPhone models without a Home button), you must set a password – so let's start there. Go to Settings, then Face ID & Passcode or Touch ID & Passcode.

• On Android – Go to Settings > Security and privacy > Device unlock. Tap Face and Fingerprint Unlock.

3. Lock your online accounts with two-factor authentication

Setting up two-factor authentication (2FA) only takes a few minutes, but it's a brilliant and simple way to make your online accounts extra secure.

When you attempt to access an account from a new device - for example, a Gmail or Outlook inbox - the associated website or app will send a code to your smartphone. You then have to enter the time-sensitive code before you can continue using the service.

We strongly suggest activating 2FA for every service you log in to. Doing so can stop hackers who might have

obtained your password via a data breach or phishing scam from logging

To enable 2FA, open the app you're looking to secure and search through the account security settings. Typically, you'll be asked to enter your mobile number, and then the service will send you a code, which you type in to confirm you want to go ahead and set it up.

4. Enable the 'Find my' service

Both iOS and Android come with free 'Find my' services pre-installed – when enabled, you can virtually locate and control your phone to stop data from falling into the wrong hands. Setting it up now will give you some peace of mind moving forward.

To set up 'Find my' on your mobile, follow these steps:

- On iPhone Go to Settings >
 [your name] > Find My > Find My
 iPhone. Activate Find My iPhone
 to locate, lock or erase the gadget
 remotely. To use Find My iPhone from
 your computer, head to icloud.com/
 find.
- On Android Navigate to Settings > Security or Security & location or Google > Security. You can also try typing 'Find my' in the Settings search bar. Select Find My Device and activate it. Go to Settings > Location and enable it. You can use this service from android.com/find.
- Samsung handsets use SmartThings Find, which can be accessed through Settings > Samsung account > Find my Mobile. The web app is found at smartthingsfind. samsung.com.

5. Manage your notifications (and keep some

iPhone and Android mobiles will let you stop text from appearing within a lockscreen notification. You'll still know that you've received a text, but you won't be able to read the contents until you unlock your phone. In other words, people looking over at your screen won't be able to read incoming messages.

Before you enable this feature, think of the pros and cons. It's a plus in terms of security, but you won't be able to see certain information at a glance.

To adjust notification settings for your default messaging app, follow these steps:

- On iPhone Go to Settings > Notifications > Messages. Select Show Previews and pick between When Unlocked or Never.
- On Android Open your Settings page, then select Display > Lock screen > Privacy. Enabling Show sensitive content only when unlocked will display an app icon instead of the full message.
- Both iOS and Android also offer support for Focus mode, which silences distracting apps so you can stay productive. On iPhone, try Settings > Focus. On Android, manually search for Focus in your Settings menu or try Settings > Digital wellbeing and parental controls > Focus mode.

6. Back up your important dataIf your smartphone is crammed with treasured pictures and videos or important documents, it makes sense to back them up to the cloud in case you lose or break your smartphone.

There are a variety of cloud storage services to choose from, and the best option will vary depending on how much space you need. Once set up, you can access your most-used files from a computer or transfer pictures from one gadget to another.

. Choose how long it takes for your phone to lock By default, your phone display will eventually turn off when you

stop using the device.

If you want to reduce the time it takes for this to happen, you can make adjustments in your settings menu. Just follow these steps:

- On iPhone Head to Settings > Display & Brightness > Auto-Lock. Choose a length of time.
- On Android Choose Settings > Display > Screen timeout.

8. Check permissions (and learn how to spot potentially dangerous apps) When you download a new app, you give it access to certain parts

of your mobile. For example, if you install a third-party map app, it needs permission to track your location.

However, you might find that some apps ask for a few too many privileges. For example, if you download a calculator app and it requests access to your photos or microphone, that's obviously a red flag.

Thankfully, you can manually control which apps access your data. To review your apps, follow these steps:

- \bullet On iPhone From the Settings menu, select Privacy & Security > App Privacy Report. Here, you'll see how apps use the permissions you granted them. You can also go back a step and select Location Services to see which apps are keeping an eye on you.
- On Android Go to Settings > Security and privacy > Privacy > Permission manager. You can see, at a glance, which apps are using your camera, location, microphone and more.

Be aware that malicious apps do occasionally make their way to the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. To keep yourself safe, stick to apps from reputable developers that have lots of positive reviews.

9. Try a mobile antivirus app

By installing an antivirus app, you can level up your defences against phishing scams designed to trick you into clicking malicious links. Malware aimed at iOS is exceptionally rare, but Android handsets are commonly targeted by scammers.


10. Use strong passwords to protect your dataEnsure you use unique passwords for every account that manages your data. Don't use a base password and then tweak it for particular sites or apps that you use - attackers have a better chance of accessing your details if they find out your base password.

When coming up with a secure password, remember that a passphrase is better than a single password. Don't use any personal information as a password, either.

If you struggle to remember your login details, you might benefit from installing a trusted password manager – they can create an encrypted vault that stores all your passwords. Popular options include Bitwarden, Dashlane and 1Password.

You can check if one of your passwords has been compromised by putting your email address into the web form at haveibeenpwned.com.

The average person finds happiness in the "little things" about eight times per day - adding up to just under 60 per week according to new research.

To improve their mood throughout the day - and give themselves something to smile about - respondents make an effort to stay hydrated, eat enough that they avoid getting "hangry" and take walks.

And it seems many aim to start their day off on the right foot, as results revealed that after reaching for their phone (40%) as soon as they wake up, 20% look for a glass of water.

Conducted by OnePoll, the survey delved further into the idea of hydration - and looked to uncover the correlation between hydration and happiness.

The survey split respondents by the number of glasses of water they drink per day (less than one, one to three, four to six, seven to nine and 10 or more), then asked a variety of questions related to their overall happiness and mood.

The majority of the respondents drank between four and six glasses of water a day (37%) followed by 36% saying they drank between one and three glasses of water a day.

Among those who drank the most water (10+ glasses a day), 80% said it was very important to find happiness in the little things, compared to 48% among those who drank less than one glass of water a day.

Forty-six percent of those who drank the most water also said they were very happy compared to only 22% among those who drank the least water.

Those who upped their water intake were also increasingly likely to call themselves a "glass half full" type of person.

When they don't drink enough water, respondents experience low energy (35%), headaches (29%) and muscle cramps (23%).

And that's not to mention the emotional symptoms: respondents report low mood, irritability, frustration and anxiety when they're dehydrated

In order to stay hydrated throughout the day, 39% said they take water with them wherever they go and drink water first thing in the morning, followed by 25% who said they make a goal for the amount of water they drink throughout the day.

Sixty-one percent of those who drank more than 10 glasses of water a day said they used water additives such as drink mixes and powders, while 59% of those who drank the least water said they did not.

This random double-opt-in survey of 2,000 peope was commissioned by True Lemon.

It was Petrov who knocked out Thompson in the fifth round with a devastating uppercut, despite Thompson seemingly winning on the score cards and being the stronger boxer. 

"It was wonderful how excited they became, because they didn't realise what they were researching because it was hidden.

"Now it is out in the public, and not only that but it's in the Long Room here at Headingley where all the members come in.

"I have often been asked whether Yorkshire have played women's cricket for very long, so now I don't have to answer that because everything they need is here."

The exhibition project was developed by YCF - YCCC's charity and community arm, in partnership with the University through Prof Rob Ellis, of the History Department. It builds on his long track record of innovative public history outputs that have included co-produced collaborations involving student researchers.

Charlotte, Head of Heritage for YCF, said: "We have had a fantastic exhibition launch on the history of women's cricket. The students have

done a great job, chosen many brilliant objects, and pulled out wonderful stories.

"The involvement that Jane Powell has had, has been key to this exhibition and we have some wonderful things that belong to Jane including her England blazer with her Yorkshire emblem. The story behind that, with her having to pay for it and it being all part of one blazer, is a fantastic story that tells the changing times of women's history within the sport and that is a key piece of this exhibition.

"We have a fantastic running theme here of unlocking hidden histories and I think we want to keep delving into that and keep curating with different communities and helping to do that through the brilliant partnership with students from The University of Huddersfield.

who helped to put together a women's hall of fame for the exhibition, said: "Cricket is not a sport dominated by women, so the project was very intriguing when Rob mentioned it to us.

"To get to give voices to women, who have often been ignored in cricket, was great and my grandma plays cricket, so I love that too.

"Jane Powell was a massive help to us. She gave us a lot of material from her time as a player, there is not a lot of in existence, so much has been lost but Jane told us that there's a need for other former players to donate.

"We have found the majority of the

Tilly discovered a snippet about a women's game from 1745, but it was not until the 20th Century that a more formal structure led to more information becoming available. The women's game thrived in parallel to men's, but it remained very much hidden and marginalised, despite England's women being the first national cricket side to win a World Cup in 1973.

Progress in promoting the game was slow, with women only being allowed to enter the Long Room in the pavilion at Lord's, the sport's headquarters, in 1999.

"Hopefully the exhibition will open the door to better inclusivity, and to more projects as well," said Tilly. "We found a lot of material and information about women's cricket in India and Pakistan that we could not include that in this research as much as we would have liked to. Hopefully it will spark more people into more research that looks into the other amazing women that were able to play."

Millie added: "I think it will spark conversation, especially among older cricket fans and the members here. It might answer a few questions, open the door for us and make women feel as included in cricket as men are."

The students were joined by friends and family at the unveiling during lunch of the Northern Diamonds match against Western Storm, and Cerys was thrilled that so many more people will be finding out more about women's cricket during the rest of the season.

She said: "It is exciting, and a really big thing for us. To be able to come here and see it after spending the year by a computer, reading, researching and writing, and to know how many people are going to see it as a first piece of public history as a student is almost overwhelming."

Exhibition celebrates women's cricket in partnership with The University of Huddersfield

Thousands of cricket fans can discover the hidden histories of women's cricket played in Yorkshire in a new exhibition at Yorkshire County Cricket Club (YCCC), thanks to four enterprising University of Huddersfield history students.

Cerys Auty, Laura Sharp, Millie Denton and Tilly Olphin unearthed a wealth of information about the progress of women's cricket in Yorkshire stretching back to the 1700s

Mentored and supported by Charlotte Hughes, Head of Heritage for the Yorkshire Cricket Foundation (YCF), the fruits of the students' research over a sixmonth period are on show in the Long Room in the East Stand at Headingley Cricket Ground, and was officially launched by Dr Jane Powell, President of YCCC, and former England women's cricket captain and Yorkshire cricketer.

The exhibition entitled:
'Unlocking the histories of cricket:
The Women's Game', showcases a
number of rare and unique objects
and artefacts including items from
Jane's career, including her England
and Yorkshire blazer – which Jane
paid for.

With both blazers being blue, the cricketer, who also worked full time as a teacher, used to have two pockets which she sewed the badges onto depending on who she was representing.

The collection also represents Yorkshire's modern women with a Yorkshire Diamonds shirt belonging to the domestic women's cricket's all-time leading wicket-taker the Queen of spin – Katie Levick.

Jane said: "These girls have done a fantastic job of researching women's cricket in Yorkshire.
