The rich and silky chocolates are perfect to give as a gift, but also to share with the whole family, if you can resist the temptation to not keep them to yourself.

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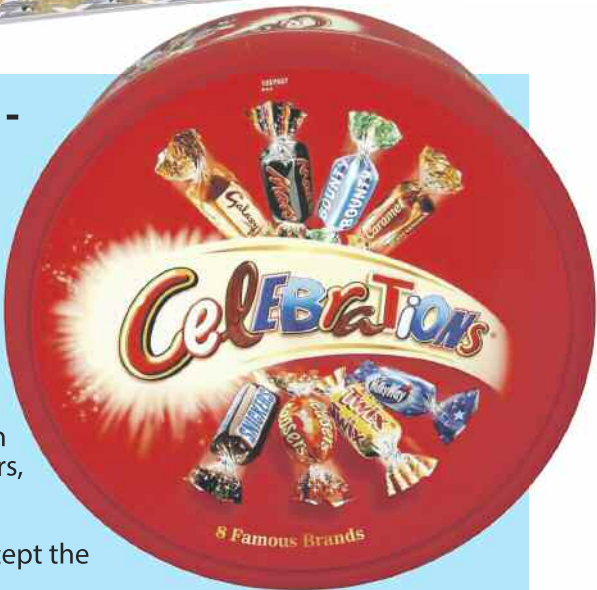


2. Ferrero Rocher - 538k monthly searches

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Starbucks boss says people protesting against the company over its stance on the Israel-Hamas war have been "influenced by misrepresentation on social media" of what the coffee chain stands for.

CEO Laxman Narasimhan, in a letter to employees, calls for peace and notes many of Starbucks' stores have experienced incidents of vandalism. He added the company has worked with local authorities to ensure the safety of its workers and customers.

Starbucks has been catapulted into debates over the Middle East when the union that works to organise baristas in the US posted a message on social media expressing "solidarity" with Palestine, shortly after the 7th October.

The post was taken down following the union saying it had not been authorised by leaders, and sparked widespread backlash against the coffee giant.

Starbucks said it disagreed with the union's statement. It has described its official position as condemning "violence in the region".

It subsequently sued the union for trademark infringement, saying use of its logo was confusing the public and it needed to protect the safety of workers and halt business damage.

The actions spurred calls for boycotts by people in both pro-Israel and pro-Palestine camps around the world.

The coffee chain is among several Western brands that have come under pressure from consumers calling for companies to take a stance in the Israel-Hamas war.

Reports of slower sales have also hit its share price. It is unclear if the CEO's message will ease tensions.

West Midlands first in UK to get new 'Growth Zones' to generate thousands of new jobs and homes

Mayor Andy Street and Cllr Patrick Harley, Leader Dudley Metropolitan Borough Council at Brierley Hill High Street, which is one of the many areas that might benefit from investment generated through Growth Zones

The West Midlands has become the first region in the UK to get ground-breaking new 'Growth Zone' powers capable of generating more than £1.7 billion for local councils to spend on levelling up their most deprived areas and driving future growth.

Government has given the green light for three Growth Zones to be set up with councils able to retain business rates for 25 years – using the money to help rebalance and grow the regional economy while also tackling long-standing issues causing deprivation, fuel poverty, jobs, skills and health.

The three zones have the potential to generate £1.7bn for regeneration investment, create 60,000 jobs and deliver 4,500 new homes.

The Growth Zone proposals were secured by the West Midlands Combined Authority (WMCA) earlier this year as part of the region's Deeper Devolution Deal with Government.

This has seen game-changing powers and financial controls transferred from Whitehall to the

West Midlands and taken together with the Chancellor's recent announcement for a West Midlands Investment Zone, means every local authority in the region will benefit from new financial powers to meet the priorities for their communities and businesses.

Andy Street, Mayor of the West Midlands and WMCA Chair, said: "The Deeper Devolution Deal agreed with Government back in March was a real vote of confidence in our region – placing trust in local leaders to deliver for local people.

"We're now starting to see the promised new powers and funding flow. Alongside the recent announcement of Investment Zone status for the West Midlands – helping us to draw in money to support major schemes across Coventry, Birmingham and Wolverhampton.

"By securing this new approach – where local authorities will be provided with greater financial certainty and control thanks to long term business rates retention – we can work together to revitalise local neighbourhoods and improve the lives of residents in the months and years ahead."

These three Investment Zone sites alone have the power to drive up to £5.5bn of growth across the region, and more than 30,000 new jobs by

2034.

This is the first time that Government has deployed 'Growth Zones' – enabling local councils in a region to retain 100% of their business rates for 25 years to support comprehensive regeneration that could include new development, job opportunities, community facilities and housing.

Cllr Sharon Thompson, the WMCA's portfolio holder for levelling up and devolution, said: "This welcome announcement demonstrates the true potential of devolution: local councils identifying their areas of greatest opportunity, proposing innovative approaches to regeneration that meet local need, and then working with the Combined Authority to draw down new powers from Government.

"Our challenge now is to harness these additional powers to truly level up for some of the most economically challenged communities in the country after a decade of hardship.

"Through these new approaches agreed with Government, we have an opportunity to improve lives and life chances, drive growth and deliver improved public services."

The ability for councils to retain business rates generated in the zones is crucial in enabling them and the WMCA to develop funding strategies



to bring forward priority infrastructure and regeneration projects across the wider region. These include better transport, housing, skills training and community facilities, and how opportunities for how public services are delivered.

The three Growth Zones will drive growth, improve the quality of life for residents and businesses and deliver better public services for those areas identified by local councils as priorities for levelling up.

Cllr Patrick Harley, leader of Dudley Council, said: "The introduction of Growth Zones is an important part of a wider devolution deal which I hugely welcome.

"I have always been clear in my

opinion that local decisions should be taken by local people.

"The Growth Zones will allow us to retain 100 per cent of business rates over a 25-year period, bringing in potentially millions of extra pounds.

"On top of that, thanks to the devolution deal, as civic leaders we will have a greater say on where that crucial extra income should be spent locally.

"We want to create new jobs and new homes, and drive investment in areas of the borough that need it."

The Growth Zones are now in the process of going through the necessary legal procedures within Government prior to formal sign-off.



Equality in University sports

The University of Wolverhampton, funded by Sport England, has been leading a research project for British Universities & Colleges Sport (BUCS) with the aim to recognise best practice and share a summary of how to improve engagement with students from different ethnicities.

British Universities & Colleges Sport (BUCS) is the national governing body for higher education (HE) sport in the UK, a membership organisation, and a company limited by guarantee with charitable status.

Dr Gavin Ward, Senior Lecturer in the University's School of Sport, led on the commissioned research project on Race and Equality which aimed to develop their understanding for student and staff experiences of university sport from a Global Majority perspective.

Dr Ward said: "It was a pleasure to lead this national research project into racialised experiences of university sport with a team of staff and student researchers from four other universities across the UK.

"Our student researchers were very important and valued members of the research process by helping to co-create our methodology and by completing a significant amount of data collection.

"Placing the voices of staff and students at the centre of the research helped to identify key recommendations for British Universities and Colleges Sport and their membership.

"These aim to ensure that all types of abuse are not left to go cold, unchallenged and thus normalised. The recommendations aim to support systematic and localised management of sport competition, mediation, in addition to data collection and analysis, to ensure social justice in sport is served, monitored and tackled strategically.

"The research team are now working with BUCS and their members to work through the detailed process of implementing the recommendations."



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Trailblazer

Dedicated nurse helping to change the future of healthcare given international award

The Deputy Director of Research and Innovation at the University of Sheffield's School of Allied Health Professions, Nursing and Midwifery is the first British Pakistani nurse and second nurse of Pakistani origin to be awarded a fellowship.

Dedicated Professor of Nursing, Parveen Ali, from the University of Sheffield has been recognised with an international award for helping to change the future of healthcare.

Professor Ali, from the School of Allied Health Professions, Nursing and Midwifery has been inducted into the American Academy of Nursing's Class of Fellows 2023.

She is one of just five nurse leaders in the UK and 250 nurses across the world to receive the prestigious fellowship.

Professor Ali is Professor of Nursing and Gender-based Violence and Deputy Director of Research and Innovation at the University of Sheffield.

Her research focuses on gender-based violence, especially intimate partner violence, inequalities in health care experiences and health outcomes and how training of health professionals can contribute to tackling such inequalities.

Professor Ali is the first British Pakistani nurse and just the second nurse of Pakistani origin to be awarded one of the fellowships.

Professor of Nursing and Gender-based Violence at the University of Sheffield, said: "This recognition is not only a source of immense pride, but also a valuable opportunity to further contribute to the nursing profession, share knowledge, and make a lasting impact."

"It serves as a reminder of the importance of our work and fuels my commitment to advancing nursing education and practice. This fellowship is a meaningful milestone in my career, and I am excited to leverage it for the greater good of the nursing community."

The 2023 fellowships come in the academy's 50th anniversary year. There are now around 3,000 academy fellows who together represent nursing's most accomplished leaders in policy, research administration, practice and academia.

Kenneth R. White, President of the American Academy of Nursing, said: "This year's group of inductees truly represents today's thought leaders and the diversity of our profession's policy leaders, practitioners, educators and innovators."

"Each fellow of the academy is changing the future of health and health care through their support to advance equity, promote inclusion, and lift up the next generation of nurses, advancing the academy's vision of healthy lives for all people."

Rita said she met Keith Large when she cut his hair at her salon and he went on to give Reece some extra tuition during lockdown.

Wheel Gone Kid which was created after Keith was teaching Reece home-schooling in lockdown and discovered his fantastic memory for remembering lines.

He went on to develop the script and produced a short film starring Reece and his mother.

Initially, 'Wheel Gone Kid' was about Reece as

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‘Urgent action needed’ to reduce Asian stillbirths and neonatal deaths

The highest stillbirth rates continue to impact black and Asian women and those living in the most deprived communities where social inequalities are entrenched.

That’s according to the Royal College of Midwives (RCM) as it responds to the latest MBRRACE-UK State of the Nation (SoN) report on perinatal mortality.

The RCM says while it’s positive to focus on quality of care, it’s all too clear that Black and Asian babies are at greater risk of stillbirth or neonatal death compared to white babies.

The College is calling for a multi-agency approach to improve maternity outcomes for Black and Asian women as well as those living in the most deprived areas.

Commenting on the findings, RCM’s Quality and Standards Advisor Lia Brigante said: “... much more needs to be done to address health inequalities and reduce stillbirth and neonatal death among Black and Asian babies.

“Black and Asian women experiencing stillbirth or neonatal death are twice as likely to live in more deprived areas. This has an

impact on access to services, but only tells part of the story.

“Clinicians, including midwives and obstetricians, should receive better education to be aware of the increased risk for Black and Asian women.

“As well as ensuring they receive the appropriate assessment and specialist care, relatively simple measures like improvements in access to translation services and provision of personalised care and support plans could have made a positive difference in the outcomes for these women and babies.”

The key findings of the report are:

■ When care records were reviewed it found major or significant issues within antenatal care provision for 83% of Black women and 73% of Asian women compared with 69% of white women.

■ Improvements in care were needed for 59% of Asian women and 49% of white women.

■ For Asian women there was frequent inaccurate and inconsistent recording of citizenship and ethnicity which impacted the ability to undertake a needs assessment and plan personalised care.



National Crime Agency officers are issuing a warning to potential drug smugglers after a series of cannabis seizures were made from passengers flying into Birmingham International Airport.

Nine people have been arrested at the airport in the last two weeks, all carrying between 15 and 40 kilos of the drug in suitcases.

In total around 260 kilos have now been seized by Border Force, worth an estimated £750,000.

Five of the passengers had flown in on routes from Thailand, four had started their journeys in the United States.

All nine have been arrested on suspicion of smuggling class B drugs, questioned by the NCA and bailed pending further enquiries.

NCA investigators are now looking into each seizure, and looking at whether any of the cases might be

linked.

NCA Branch Commander Mick Pope said: "Following this unusual amount of seizures in such a short space of time, law enforcement will undoubtedly be paying more attention to passengers coming into Birmingham on certain routes and stepping up checks."

"We are continuing to investigate the circumstances of each, but I want to make a direct appeal to anyone considering getting involved in transporting drugs to the UK. Think

very carefully about the consequences of getting caught.

"In some of these cases passenger journeys have started in locations where cannabis may be legal, but that won't make a difference when you arrive in the UK.

"Organised criminal gangs rely on couriers to bring illicit substances into the UK, their business models rely on it. Consequently those playing such a role face stiff jail sentences. It simply isn't worth the risk."



Car cruising ban to remain

The interim ban on street racing in the Black Country is to continue, after a High Court ruling, as our focus on keeping the region's roads safe goes on.

The injunction prohibits people driving or being a passenger or rider at a gathering where there is motor racing or motor stunts or other dangerous or obstructive driving.

It covers the whole of the boroughs of Wolverhampton, Dudley, Sandwell and Walsall.

And we will also be supporting the application, led by the City of Wolverhampton Council, for a full injunction which is due to be heard early next year.

Our ultimate aim is to keep the roads safe for all and we are committed to tackling street cruising and racing in the West Midlands, under Operation Hercules.

We continue to work closely with partners on identifying, disrupting and enforcing against those taking part or observing illegal street racing, which in the past has sadly proved to have fatal consequences.

Anyone breaching the ban will be in contempt of court and could face penalties including imprisonment, a fine, or an order to have their assets seized.

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Enraged parents of children placed in 'isolation' on a non-uniform fundraising day for wearing clothing and badges bearing the Palestine flag, raise their pressing concerns about safeguarding.

On Friday 24th November, Mount Pellon Primary Academy in Halifax, held a non-uniform day to raise money for children around the world.

This was similar to a fundraising day held by the primary school in support of Ukraine, where there were no objections on children donning the Ukraine flag/emblems.

Speaking about the primary school's actions following children wearing Palestine attire, Mr Zohaib Ali, uncle of three of the children that attend Mount Pellon Primary said: "Children were advised to take off the clothing and put things on from lost property or face isolation all day.

"The youngest child placed in isolation is just four-years-old, can you imagine what that child was going through?"

Mr Ali, speaking on behalf of the parents says that the children were separated from classes, and endured hours of "isolation without adequate communication".

Mrs Ali, parent of a seven-year-old who endured the disciplinary action said: "The school hesitated to label it

as 'isolating' but insisted it was 'supervision', confining her to a small, windowless library.

"They denied her [my daughter] even a water bottle, revealing a blatant breach of safeguarding protocols."

Mrs Younis, the mother of the four-year-old disciplined that day, said: "All four of my children were isolated along with one other child for wearing a hoodie containing the word

'Palestine' on it".

"My eldest son, Hussain is 11-years-old and is the head boy at the school, and my youngest Hayfa is just four-years-old.

"They were separated from lessons all day. They were only allowed a five-minute playtime separate from their peers.

"Alone and neglected. Not a school who vows to nurture and protect our children.

"I didn't, not once, ever think our school could make our children feel so little and disheartened by one non-uniform day.

"My four-year-old was so scared she kept questioning me if "will I be allowed to play with my friends".

"It's a horrible feeling to think your kids are scared in the place they spend most of the day in."

Mr Ali adds: "I speak on behalf of many parents from different race and religion from Mount Pellon Primary Academy. We are appalled and disgusted in the way that our children have been silenced and scare-mongered by the staff at this school.

"The school has been totally

unsympathetic towards the parents. The refused to meet with us a group and even the choice of wording was selective.

"They stated that a child was being anti-semitic in school, so they've collectively decided to punish all children from supporting Palestine. They stated a risk assessment was carried around wearing Palestine clothing and there was a risk to child safety.

"We are utterly ashamed and disappointed with the lack of empathy and understanding from the school. Even now the apologies have not been heart felt but out of fear of what the community can do."

Asian Express contacted Mount Pellon Primary Academy and the Northern Education Trust, of which it is part of, they issued the following statement:

"As a trust, we apologise for the hurt that some parents and children have felt over the last few weeks. This never was and never would be our intention. We understand the depth of feeling and hurt within the community surrounding the humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

"We recognise that this is a very upsetting time for many families, and our intention throughout this whole period has only been to try and maintain a settled environment in school where children can concentrate on their learning. We care passionately about our students and Mount Pellon's school community.

"During the last week, we have had some extremely positive meetings with a representative from the Calderdale Council of Mosques, parents and community representatives to discuss ways in which the school, parents and the wider community can work together more positively. We are all excited about next week's fundraising event, organised by a group of parents and a local charity to raise money for the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Gaza."





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Vaping sales more than double

The vaping category has more than doubled in size and added almost £1bn in extra sales this year, as smokers abandoned tobacco in their droves.

Now worth £1.7bn, vaping is 2023's fastest growing category in The Top Products Survey, adding £897.5m in sales and shifting 155.2 million extra packs through multiples, convenience stores and independents.

This year's growth has come despite the category's leading brands being embroiled in a compliance scandal earlier this year that saw products pulled from shelves in supermarkets.

While ElfBar remains the UK's

bestselling vape brand, sister brand Lost Mary rocketed up the ranking to second place, adding £310.7m in extra sales. Rival Chinese brand SKE grew £203m to become the third biggest brand. But sales of Geek Bar fell by £39.5m.

Five years ago the vaping category was worth £184m. Since then vaping's steal of 'share of lung' has seen combustible tobacco lose over £1bn in value. This year cigarettes and cigars have lost £849.1m, while rolling tobacco is down £393.1m in value – the two biggest absolute category losses of the year.

But the rise of vaping is not being

ignored by regulators either. After a consultation this year, restrictions on flavour descriptions, sale displays and packaging seem likely. And brands are getting ahead of potential rule changes.

ElfBar is already revising flavour names and calling for a full licensing regime – and crafting a framework akin to the one for alcohol.

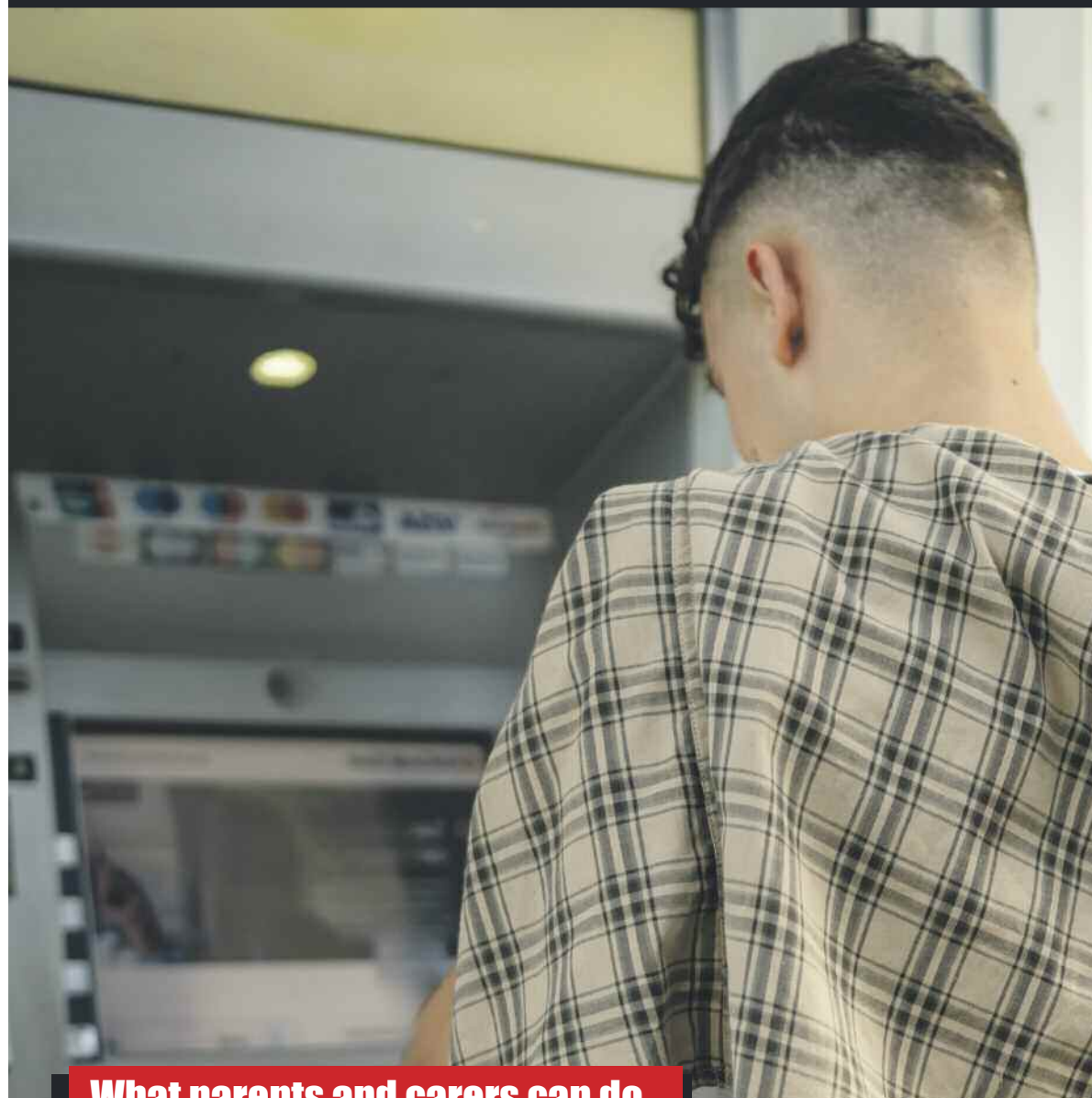
And Smoore – the world's biggest vape tech manufacturer – has vowed not to work with brands who use flavour names, packaging or product designs which are attractive to children.

Whether there will be a total ban on disposable devices is still harder to call.



MONEY MULING

What is it, and how parents can recognise the signs and help young people



Money Mule: A term given to individuals enlisted by criminals to move the proceeds of crime through their bank accounts in return for a cut of the sum.

Parents and carers are being called upon to help young people avoid being persuaded or manipulated into laundering criminal cash.

The National Crime Agency (NCA), since November has coordinated law enforcement action against money mules – a term given to individuals enlisted by criminals to move the proceeds of crime through their bank accounts in return for a cut of the sum.

Around 6 in 10 money mules are under the age of 30, with most of these recruited between the ages of 17 and 24 while attending sixth form, college or university.

At this age, young people may be struggling financially, looking to become financially independent or lack financial experience, which criminals can use to exploit them.

This makes the most effective time to raise children's awareness of the threat when they are aged 11-16.

Money mules are often targeted through seemingly legitimate job offers announced via online forums, emails, social media or pop-up ads with the promise of quick and easy earnings. Once they have established contact, recruiters will often try to develop a relationship or rapport with the young person and groom or coerce them into providing the service.

A young person may not always be aware of the consequences of being a money mule, which can be serious; and frequently end up with a criminal record and can face prison, a fine or community service for their role.

Those involved endanger themselves and those around them by communicating with dangerous criminals, and risk becoming complicit in serious and organised crime.

Nick Sharp, Deputy Director of the National Economic Crime Centre, said: "Money muling is a significant money laundering threat and allows organised criminal groups to access the profits of some of the most serious crimes in the UK."

"We are actively coordinating with policing and the private sector, as well as those based across the continent, to crack down on it."

"Our message is plain: help us spread the word and prevent children and young people from getting involved or used for money laundering."

What parents and carers can do

- The ask to parents and carers is simple: check in with those you have responsibility for, and establish regular conversations about staying safe online.
- Help them to be cautious and critical of unsolicited offers that sound too good to be true; and explain the consequences of involvement in financial crime. Reassure them that they will be supported if they speak up and seek help.
- The warning signs aren't always obvious. If you are concerned that your child is a money mule, ask your child about

new possessions, such as expensive goods, that they cannot account for, and look out for new bank accounts containing money they can't adequately explain the origin of.

• If you are concerned your child is being criminally exploited, report money muling to local police on 101. Call 999 in an emergency, for example where there is a threat to life.

Know the signs of a heart attack

Early symptoms may vary - NHS advises it's never too early to dial 999

Heart attacks account for approximately 80,000 hospital admissions in England each year, and at least 7 out of 10 people survive them. This number rises to nearly 9 out of 10 (94%) for those who get to the hospital and get the right care.

Although chest discomfort is one of the most recognised symptoms of a heart attack, other symptoms like shortness of breath, feeling lightheaded or dizzy, a sense of unease, or an overpowering feeling of anxiety may go unnoticed.

Professor Nick Linker, cardiologist and National Clinical Director for Heart Disease at NHS England says: "People who are experiencing a heart

attack often describe it as a sensation of squeezing or tightness across the chest along with other symptoms such as sweating, nausea or a sense of unease.

"It can be easy to dismiss the early signs of heart attack as they don't always feel severe, but it is never too early to dial 999 and describe your symptoms – the faster you act, the better the chance of a full recovery."

A recent survey published by NHS England, reveals a lack of confidence in the South Asian community in recognising the symptoms of a heart attack, with nearly half (44%) of South Asians saying they were not confident that they could recognise the signs.

Five-years-ago, Rifhat Malik MBE from Leeds was admitted to hospital with indigestion-like pains, nausea and chronic fatigue. "At the time it was Ramadan, and so I simply put my symptoms down to fasting," says Rifhat.

"I had a major charity fundraising event to organise, and so pushed myself to crack on with it despite not feeling quite right. However, afterwards, my friends insisted that I to go to hospital to have my symptoms checked out.

"After being driven to A&E and seen by doctors, I was told I was

having a heart attack.

"I was in shock, as was my husband. An angiogram showed a blockage in my right coronary artery, and so I was sent for heart surgery to have two stents inserted."

Rifhat realises she was exceptionally lucky to have been pushed by friends to go to the hospital: "Heart disease runs in my family, so I should have known better. However, the signs of my heart attack were not severe, so I dismissed them at the time.

"Seeking medical advice at those early stages of my heart attack, most probably saved me from a more dire situation. I strongly advise our South Asian communities to wise up on the symptoms – it could just save yours, or someone else's life."

Symptoms of a heart attack can include:

- Chest pain – a feeling of pressure, heaviness, tightness or squeezing across your chest
- Pain in other parts of the body – it can feel as if the pain is spreading from your chest to your arms (usually the left arm, but it can affect both arms), jaw, neck, back and tummy
- Feeling lightheaded or dizzy
- Sweating
- Shortness of breath
- Feeling sick (nausea) or being sick (vomiting)
- An overwhelming feeling of anxiety (similar to a panic attack)
- Coughing or wheezing



Do you know the difference between Heart Attack and Cardiac Arrest?

A **heart attack** occurs when the supply of blood to the heart becomes blocked, which can starve it of oxygen, potentially causing serious muscle damage, but the person will be conscious and breathing.

A **cardiac arrest** is different – it usually occurs suddenly and without warning with the person quickly losing consciousness. Their heart stops, they will have no pulse and sadly people experiencing a cardiac arrest will usually die within minutes if they do not receive treatment. A heart attack can lead to a cardiac arrest.

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West Midlands Police inadequate at investigating crime and protecting vulnerable, inspectorate says

The police inspectorate has raised concerns about how the police force investigates crime, protects vulnerable people and manages offenders and suspects, with the force found inadequate in three areas.

His Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Services (HMICFRS) said it had concerns about how the police force - the country's second-largest - investigates crime, protects vulnerable people and manages offenders and suspects.

It graded West Midlands Police's performance as adequate in two areas, requires improvement in three areas and inadequate in three areas.

Because of its concerns, HMICFRS moved the force into special measures last month - a process which will provide additional scrutiny and support from across the policing sector to help West Midlands Police make improvements.

His Majesty's Inspector of Constabulary Wendy Williams said: "I have serious concerns about how well

Serious concerns

"We have highlighted these problems in previous inspection reports, but the force's performance has declined.

"The force had a change in leadership in the year leading up to our inspection. They have

implemented a robust performance framework to help make improvements.

"Most significantly, they have reviewed the force's operating model and made rapid changes to it. I recognise the scale of the challenge senior leaders face in meeting demand and achieving sustainable improvements."

The inspectorate did recognise that the West Midlands has high levels of deprivation, and that the force's funding has been disproportionately affected compared to some other forces.

HMICFRS also noted that the force "needs to have enough resources to prevent crime and protect the public effectively".

West Midlands Police's Chief Constable Craig Guildford said: "I am pleased that HMICFRS has recognised the rapid action that we have taken and that it will take time to have the effect we want and that we are determined to deliver.

"It is also important they have acknowledged the scale of the challenge we face in securing the funding and resources we need to meet demand and prevent crime and protect the public effectively.

"We have been working very hard over the past 12 months to improve the force and we changed our operating model in April this year.

"We have already made substantial and sustained improvements and we look forward to engaging with HMICFRS in 2024."

West Midlands Police joins the Metropolitan Police in special measures. Devon and Cornwall Police were also placed in special measures last October, joining forces in Staffordshire and Wiltshire.

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Huge praise for Birmingham Festival 23

A new report has highlighted that Birmingham Festival 23 has had a positive economic and cultural impact on the city.

Presented as a free, ten-day outdoor event, the Festival included 153 individual projects and performances, created by over 800 artists, creatives and performers.

Created to mark the one year anniversary of the Commonwealth Games, the Birmingham Festival celebrated the wealth of talent and creativity that the city continues to platform, develop and nurture.

185 organisations took part and over 40 events were created from scratch or performed to audiences for the first time. There were opportunities to re-see 14 creative projects that were first shown during the 2022 Festival, and new partnerships and collaborations were formed for the Twilight Takeover strand of events.

In addition to the core team delivering the programme, two Artistic Associates - Elizabeth 'Zeddie' Lawal and Mukhtar Dar led the creation and direction of their own events as well as forming part of the programme decision-making team. This ensured representation

and inclusion from Birmingham's diverse communities.

Over 123,000 people came through the festival site on Centenary Square over the course of 10 days between 28 July and 6 August - which were engaged audiences who stayed for an average of three hours, demonstrating a high level of participation.

And audiences came back for more, with the average spending 2.2 days enjoying the free entertainment and activities, 36% of whom said they had never attended an outdoor festival before and 52% of whom came from areas of high deprivation. 96% of audiences felt that public spaces like Centenary Square should be used more frequently for cultural events.

A strong partnership with United by 2022 (the official legacy charity of Birmingham 2022) saw 74 volunteers from the original Commonwealth Collective work over 1300 hours on site, making an invaluable contribution to the overall success of the Festival with their infectious enthusiasm, energy and warmth.

A huge majority of audience

members surveyed described the festival as different to anything they'd experienced before, saying it had helped them feel more connected to the community and a shared culture, and boosted their sense of pride.

Councillor Saima Suleman, Cabinet Member Digital, Culture, Heritage and Tourism at Birmingham City Council, said: "The full evaluation results from Festival 23 demonstrate the three-sixty positive impact the free 10-day event had on the city and just how brilliant Birmingham is."

"Over 46,500 people engaged with the Festival, with many of them never having attended an event like this before, which highlights the appetite for arts, culture and entertainment in the city."

"Festival 23 showcased creativity from our diverse communities and the cultural offer throughout the programme was committed to inclusion and homegrown talent. Just like the Commonwealth Games in 2022, Festival 23 celebrated everything that is great about our wonderful city."

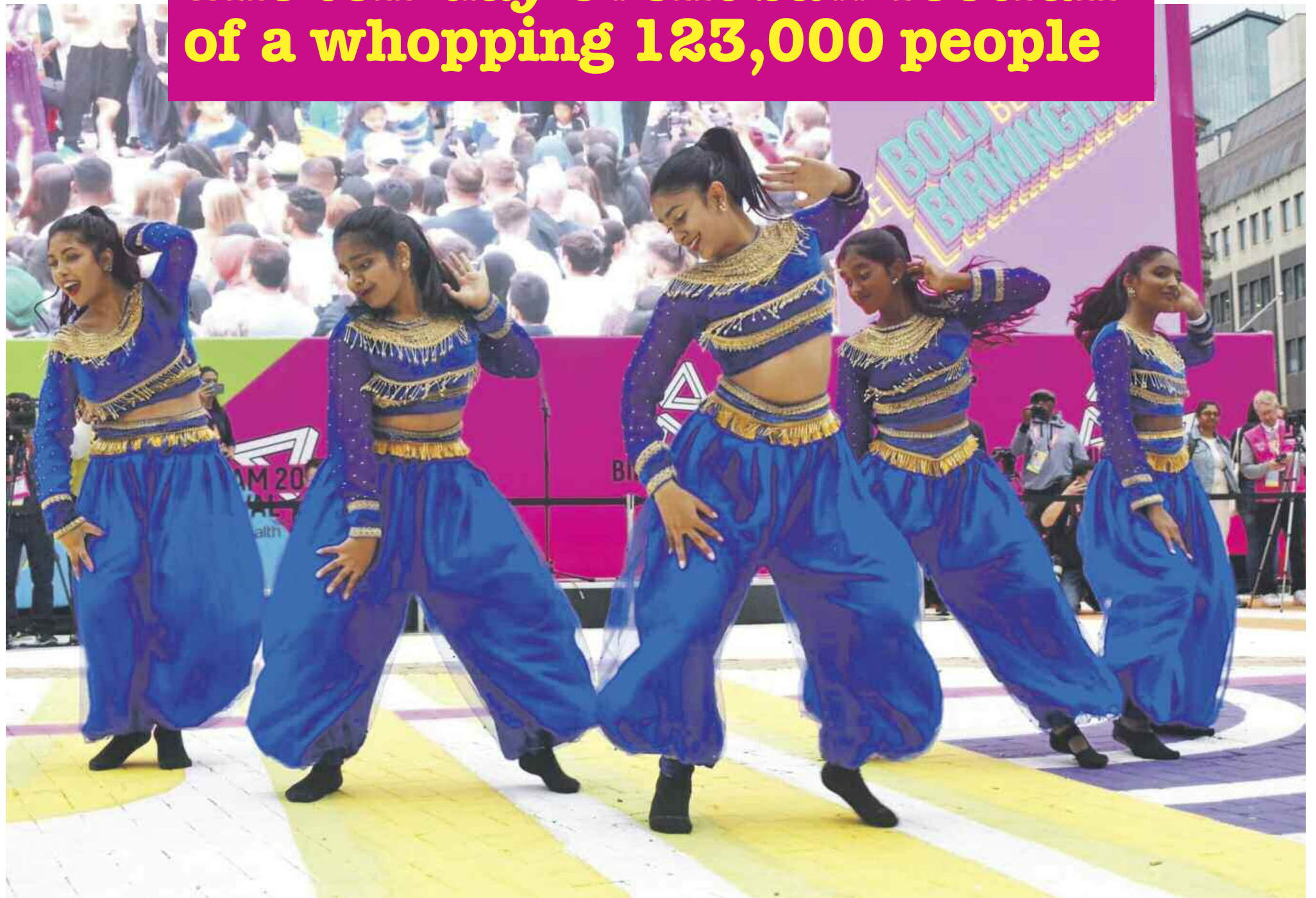

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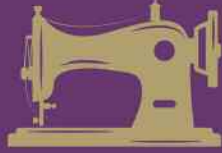

The game was initially released on the 20th of October as a PS5 exclusive and has an average game time of around 18 hours for the main story line. This makes it a great choice for Christmas presents.

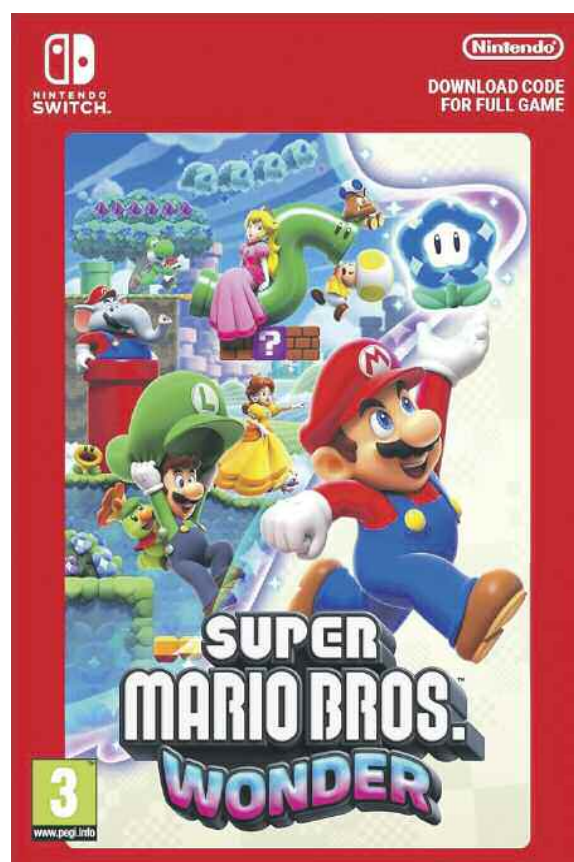

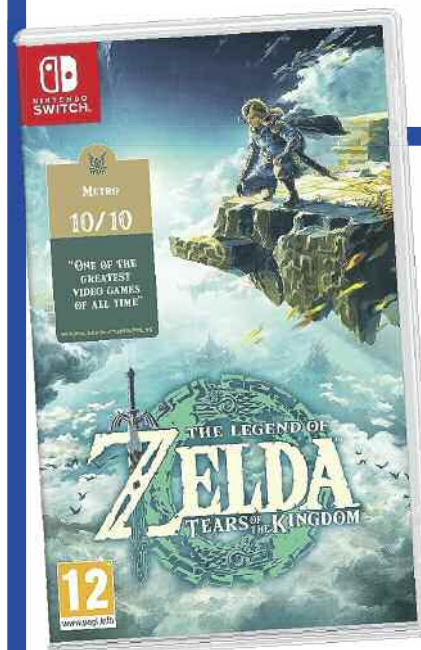
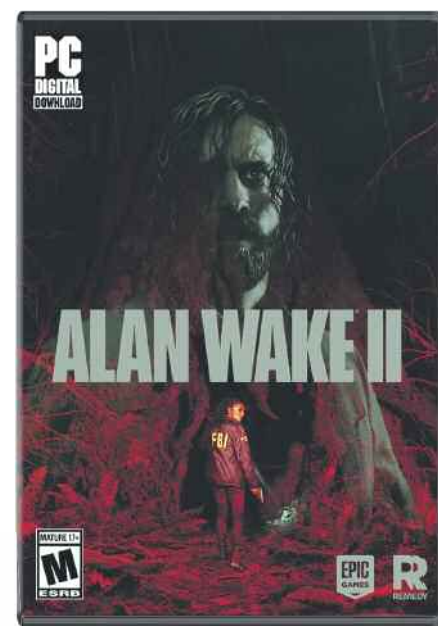


Super Mario Bros Wonder

2. Keep a diary or journal

Keeping a diary is a great tool that can highlight any patterns and SAD symptoms you are experiencing. Using a notepad or even your notes app on your phone, note down key moments of your day that you think are affecting you. This can help you understand what makes you feel better or worse and creates a sense of mindfulness.

3. Increase your Vitamin D and light exposure intake

Less sunlight exposure and time spent outdoors in the winter months can result in a lack of vitamin D, a primary cause of SAD, as vitamin deficiency is associated with depressive symptoms. Vitamin D supplements are great to take during the winter months, though if in doubt, consult your GP.



Other natural ways to increase vitamin D are by incorporating mushrooms, egg yolks, and yoghurt into your meals, as these are naturally high in the vitamin. However, light exposure outdoors is the quickest way to increase vitamin D levels. Try keeping curtains open and allow natural light and UV rays to penetrate windows or increase your time outside.

Those with SAD frequently use light therapy through the use of a 'Light Box', which works by simulating sunlight. It helps reduce the production of melatonin, which can make you sleepy and is often used in the mornings to help you wake up and get out of bed. These are inexpensive and are a great tool to implement into your morning routine.

4. Include tryptophan and protein-rich foods in your diet

The colder months call for more comfort food, as eating what you crave can reduce stress hormones. Although this can make you feel good, it can have a negative long-term affect if you are not consuming a healthy, balanced diet.

When experiencing SAD, it can be beneficial to consume foods high in the amino acid Tryptophan. Studies have suggested that there is a direct link between this amino acid and the production of serotonin, the hormone related to happiness, memory, sexual desire and sleep. Tryptophan-rich foods include salmon, chicken and turkey. Vegetarian and vegan sources

1. Incorporate aromatherapy into your morning or bedtime routine

Aromatherapy is the use of essential oils to help promote well-being. Though this is not a treatment, aromatherapy can be a therapeutic and holistic option to help alleviate symptoms of anxiety and generally make you feel good. The best way to start aromatherapy at home is by using a diffuser that disperses scented vapour into the atmosphere.

Scents can elicit specific emotions and memories, making you feel better, so finding a scent that makes you feel good or reminds you of a fun or fond memory is best.

Try adding an aromatherapy diffuser to your morning or night-time routine. Lemon or peppermint essential oils are great for the morning and can create an uplifting atmosphere. Lavender essential oils are great if you are having trouble sleeping, as this can help increase melatonin production. Other essential oils such as ylang-ylang, orange and clary sage also help decrease anxiety and can be used at any time of day.



include pumpkin seeds, tofu (and other soya-based foods) and spinach.

Finally, your gut biome is also directly linked to the production of serotonin, and poor gut health is linked to depression and hormone imbalances. It is important to ensure you include enough water, fruits, vegetables, and fibre in your diet to maintain gut health. Challenge yourself to have at least five to seven fruits and vegetables a day.

5. Ensure you're doing 75 minutes or 3 x 25-minute exercises a week

Physical exercise is essential for all adults and should be done every week. This does not mean high-intensity workouts; it can be moderate to light activity that can help get your blood pumping. This can even significantly reduce the chance of a stroke or heart disease.

According to the NHS, adults should do at least 150 minutes of moderate to light physical activity a week; this equates to 21 minutes of exercise daily.

That said, a more vigorous exercise routine is better as this can release the neurotransmitter dopamine, more commonly known as the 'happy hormone'. A minimum of 75 minutes of vigorous/high-intensity exercise should be done per week, and this can

be broken down into three 25-minute exercises. This is recommended, as this can naturally alleviate your SAD symptoms, and if you do this outdoors, you can also increase your vitamin D intake.

6. Introduce more greenery in your living spaces through houseplants

Surprisingly, plants can help create a calm, peaceful environment that alleviates anxiety.

Some species of plants can help purify the air around you; plants such as Chrysanthemums, Monstera plants and Spider plants are great to keep in bedrooms or living rooms and can remove indoor pollutants. This clean, fresh air helps raise oxygen levels in your brain and can impact your serotonin levels.

Furthermore, caring for plants is a common practice for those who want to improve their mental health, and successfully caring for a plant in the winter months can create a feeling of accomplishment and well-being.

7. Meal prep for the winter months

Being prepared, especially if you know you suffer from SAD, can reduce the impact of symptoms

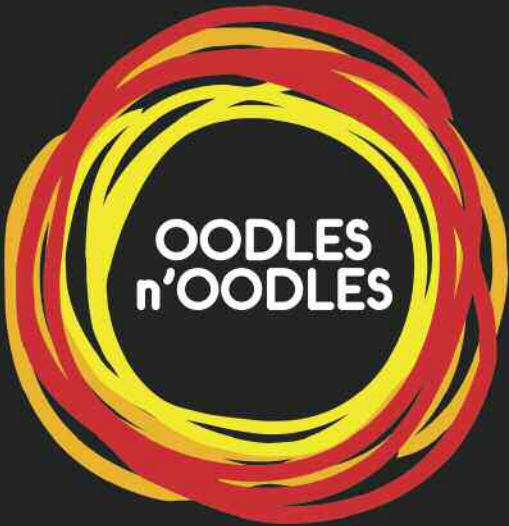


severely. If your symptoms follow a pattern, you will be able to know when they start and can get ahead of them.

One way you could prepare is by cooking and freezing meals in advance for when you have little to no energy; this ensures you have a balanced and healthy meal ready without effort. It also works out more cost-effectively, as batch cooking is cheaper, and you will always have a meal prepared, so you can avoid

ordering an unhealthy takeaway.

Meal prepping is one way to prepare for the winter months, but preparing for other things, such as events or social gatherings, in advance is a great way to reduce stress and anxiety. You can also plan for some spare time, where you do not have activities planned, but have a day to yourself where you can recuperate or re-arrange stressful activities or events for a later date.

1. Flat-faced alloys

A growing trend in America and slowly filtering onto UK roads, flat-faced forged alloy wheels are a style option that signal a move towards more retro-inspired builds.

Platinum Motorsport, a modification and styling garage based on Melrose Avenue, LA, has fitted these distinct alloys to modified cars for high-profile clients including Kim Kardashian, who opted for 24" custom forged Cactus Jack x Forgiato wheels for her new Urban Automotive Range Rover.

The unique wheel divides opinion but certainly stands out, while the flat-face design also aids aerodynamics.

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Mercedes-AMG SL 63 S E Performance



Mercedes-AMG has just crowned the iconic SL series with the new SL 63 S E Performance.

The 4.0-litre V8 biturbo engine and the AMG Electric Drive Unit together generate a system output of 600 kW (816 hp) and a maximum system torque of up to 1,420 Nm. This makes the new model the most powerful SL of all time. And it is already the fifth series with the AMG-specific E Performance hybrid technology.

The immediate response of the electric drive, the rapid build-up of torque and the linear power delivery enable an impressive driving experience. The acceleration to 100 km/h in 2.9 seconds and the top speed of 317 km/h underline the confident appearance.

In the SL 63 S E Performance, the AMG 4.0-litre V8 biturbo engine on the front axle is also combined with an electric drive unit on the rear axle.

It integrates a 150 kW (204 hp), permanently excited synchronous electric motor with an electrically switched two-speed transmission and a mechanical rear axle limited-slip differential.

The development of the lithium-ion energy storage is inspired by technologies proven in the Formula 1™ hybrid racing cars of the Mercedes-AMG Petronas F1 Team. The high-performance battery offers a capacity of 6.1 kWh, 70 kW continuous power and 150 kW peak power.

The most innovative and powerful SL of all time

Charging takes place via the installed 3.7 kW on-board charger with alternating current at a charging station, wallbox or household socket.

The AMG 400-volt battery has direct cooling via a high-tech coolant flows around all 560 cells and cools them individually. A uniform temperature control of the battery therefore has a decisive influence on its performance, service life and safety.

The basic operating strategy is derived from the hybrid power pack of the Mercedes-AMG Petronas Formula 1 racing car. The eight AMG DYNAMIC SELECT driving programmes “Electric”, “Battery Hold”, “Comfort”, “Smoothness”, “Sport”, “Sport+”, “RACE”, and “Individual” are precisely tailored to the new drive technology.

They offer a wide range of driving experiences – from efficient to dynamic. The driving programmes adapt important parameters such as the response of the drive and transmission, the steering characteristic, the chassis damping or the sound.

The exclusive identifying feature of the new top model in the SL series is the rear section. What's new here is the integrated plug-in loading flap and the model name highlighted in red.

There are also grooved trapezoidal twin tailpipe trims on the outside. The “E Performance” fender badge on the side indicates the exclusive drive. As with the entire series, numerous paints from the MANUFAKTUR programme are also available for the hybrid version.

The interior serves the sporty target group as well as customers who value maximum comfort. The cockpit design right down to the portrait format display in the centre console is focused on the driver and impresses with a harmonious overall impression. The practical dimensional concept with 2+2 seats offers generous space in the interior.

One of many highlights in the interior is the electrically adjustable AMG sports seats. They combine good lateral support with high long-distance comfort. The optional AMG Performance seats with integrated

headrests and ventilation openings in the seat backs are even sportier.

The MBUX multimedia system (Mercedes-Benz User Experience) is intuitive to use and capable of learning. The SL 63 S E Performance contains numerous AMG and hybrid-specific displays and functions. Exclusive menu items such as “AMG Performance” underline the sporty character.

The active aerodynamics were also fine-tuned, and is hidden in the underbody in front of the engine, contributes to balanced driving behaviour. It is standard on the SL top model.

This carbon profile is an exclusive AMG development and protected by patents. It reacts to the position of the AMG driving programmes and automatically extends downwards by around 40 millimetres at a speed of 80 km/h. This creates the so-called Venturi effect, which additionally sucks the car onto the road and reduces the lift on the front axle.

Another active component is the extendable rear spoiler seamlessly

integrated into the boot lid. It changes its position depending on the driving condition.

The AMG Active Ride Control suspension with semi-active roll stabilisation can be adjusted in rebound and compression, also have semi-active, interconnected hydraulic elements.

It's also equipped with active rear-axle steering as standard. Depending on the speed, the rear wheels steer either in the opposite direction (up to 100 km/h) or in the same direction (faster than 100 km/h) as the front wheels. The system therefore enables both agile and stable driving behaviour.

In keeping with the extreme performance values and the associated performance, the AMG ceramic high-Performance composite brake system, with bronze-coloured 6-piston fixed calipers at the front and 1-piston floating calipers at the rear, comes as standard.

Compared to AMG models with a pure combustion engine, it is larger in size: the carbon ceramic brake discs on the front axle measure 420 x 40 millimetres and on the rear axle 380 x 32 millimetres.

The braking system impresses with very short braking distances as well as maximum stability and fading stability under heavy use. It also scores points with its long service life. The lightweight material saves additional weight and reduces unsprung masses.

Whilst satin black may still be the most popular vehicle vinyl wrap colour, fashion trends are shifting. For the early adopters, 2024 is all about the pastel aesthetic.

Yiannimize, the leading vehicle personalisation specialist and associate of Urban Automotive, recently transformed Premier League footballer Jack Grealish's Lamborghini Performante Urus from its original black to a new Tiffany Blue shade.

Yianni Charalambous, chief executive officer at Yiannimize commented "We've seen wrap trends develop over time. A few years ago, it was the crazy chrome, iridescent and bright colours that celebrities and footballers wanted, but as wrapping becomes the norm,

it's the more subtle shades like satin black and matte metallic grey that have taken over.

Recently though we've seen customers opt for more adventurous colours, especially pastel tones which are gaining in popularity. No doubt we'll still have the mainstay of dark, matte colours that are 'classics', but it's nice to see our clientele experimenting with new ideas too and we expect this to continue into 2024."

Modifiers are not the only ones picking up on the trend. Both Rolls-Royce and Bentley have recently latched on, with the launch of Rolls-Royce's striking optional Sagano Green paint, and the Bentley Continental's new Jetstream Blue colourway.

3. Bright interiors

As pastel exterior colours grow more popular, bright and bold interiors are also predicted to be hot property in 2024.

Urban Automotive recently worked with European partners Absolute Motors to transform kick-boxing champion Rico Verhoeven's Mercedes G-Class Widetrack with a custom teal blue interior retrim, contrasting beautifully with an understated exterior colour. A future Urban Automotive project will aim to take this approach even further upon reveal in 2024...

4. Heritage-inspired builds

Restomod-style modifications have grown hugely popular over the last five years, often combining iconic designs with contemporary underpinnings. Urban Automotive's Signature Series often includes a heritage-inspired project or two, with demand for this type of vehicle set to continue in 2024.

In March 2023, the company launched its own take on Land Rover's 75th Anniversary Edition Defender. With a carbon fibre vented bonnet, Urban Cast 'UC-4' wheels with Grasmere Green pin striping, and its signature spoiler and light bar, Urban Automotive's classic twist on the New Defender has been popular with customers in both 90 and 110 bodystyles.

5. Visual Carbon Fibre

Urban Automotive kits are centred around the use of carbon fibre, but this year's SEMA show in Las Vegas reflected how the material continues to grow in popularity – with many vehicles effectively showcasing exposed naked carbon body panels to create serious impact.

Though visual carbon fibre has been in the automotive industry for decades, Urban Automotive is continuing to push the boundaries into 2024 with new finishes and techniques. Its in-house carbon fibre production facility also allows customers to create a completely customisable look that is unique to their tastes.

Five-time winner of the Dakar Rally, Nasser Al-Attiyah, is joining the Dacia rally-raid team as an official driver

Dacia officially welcomed Nasser Al-Attiyah to its rally-raid team. Nasser, aged 52, is a two-time FIA World Rally Champion in WRC-2 and a 19-time winner of the FIA Middle East Rally Championship between 2003 and 2015.

He is a frequent competitor in rally, rally-raid and circuit events. His record in rally-raiding is second to none. He is five-time winner of the World Cup for Cross-Country Rallies and two-time winner of the World Rally-Raid Championship.

In the world of Dakar, Nasser is something of a legend. In 2010, he finished second place, 2 minutes and 12 seconds behind Carlos Sainz. In 2011, he won his first Dakar, ahead of Giniel de Villiers and Carlos Sainz.

He then went on to win the Dakar again in 2015, 2019, 2022 and 2023, with co-driver Mathieu Baumel, who will also be at his side on the Dacia team. Aged 47, Mathieu is one of France’s most successful co-drivers, with 4 victories in the Dakar and 12 World Championship titles (two in rally-raiding, 1 in WRC2 and 9 in the MERC).

Nasser Al-Attiyah and Mathieu Baumel will be the third crew lining up with Team Dacia for its rally-raid adventures, alongside Sébastien Loeb and Fabian Lurquin as well as Cristina Gutiérrez Herrero and Pablo Moreno Huete.

From 2024, the three crews will test the brand’s prototype, running on synthetic fuel, at the Morocco Rally. Their shared goal is to win the Dakar!
