Man arrested in connection with fatal stabbing of 'Britain's worst paedophile'

A man has been arrested in connection with the fatal stabbing of "Britain's worst paedophile" at an

East Yorkshire prison. Richard Huckle, one of Britain's worst paedophiles who abused up to 200 Malaysian children, was stabbed to death at HMP Full Sutton, near Pocklington

on October 13, last year. The 33-year-old was serving 22 life terms for horrific crimes against Malaysian children as young as six months

Huckle, from Ashford in Kent was jailed back in June 2016 after admitting 71 charges of sex abuse against children under 12.

He was being held at Full Sutton, prison for men in categories A and B about 10 miles east of York.

Huckle, who studied IT at university in Malaysia, was arrested by National Crime Agency officials as he arrived at Gatwick Airport en route to spend Christmas with his family in 2014.

Officers seized Huckle's encrypted laptop and managed to uncover more than 20,000 indecent pictures and videos although there were other files they were unable to crack.

radford-born chief behind Reynhard Sinaga

Bradford-born Assistant Chief Constable to ensure they have any support needed. Mabs Hussain, who led a landmark investigation sending Britain's most-prolific serial rapist behind bars, talks about the sinister facade of the man who raped over 190 men.

PHD student Reynhard Sinaga, 36, who filmed himself attacking his victims after drugging them at his Manchester home, has been sentenced to life imprisonment. He was found guilty of 159 counts of sexual offences against 48 different men.

Sinaga has been linked to more than 190 potential victims – 70 of whom police have yet to identify. He will serve a minimum of 30 years before being considered for release. ACC Mabs Hussain MBE - a former

West Yorkshire Chief Superintendent who ranks as one of the country's most senior Muslim officers, says that not much was known about Reynhard Sinaga prior to his final victim telling police of his ordeal. Before this, Sinaga had never previously come to the attention of the police with regards to any criminal incidents.

Mabs explains: "He would strike up a conversation with them [victim]) before leading them back to his flat under a false premise and drugging them before subjecting them to sickening abuse, all the while recording the attacks as they took place

The true scale of Sinaga's offending may never be known, but we established 195 men were filmed by the defendant while unconscious.

Prowler

The court heard how Sinaga would prowl the streets targeting mainly heterosexual men who were alone and potentially vulnerable before approaching them. Sinaga would then strike up a conversation with his intended victim,

acting as a good samaritan and convincing them to come back to his home under false pretences, taking advantage of their trusting nature. Once inside he would offer them a which, unbeknownst to the men, would contain a substance – believed to be GHB – that would render them unconscious.

With his victim unconscious, Sinaga would rape and sexually assault the men whilst filming his horrific acts. Many left his flat unaware they'd even been attacked. Sinaga was completely unknown to

police and his offending only came to light, when one of his victims woke up during one of the sickening attacks and fought him off.

After the incident was reported to police, the scale of his offending soon became apparent and he was swiftly arrested and charged before being remanded into custody.

Although the majority of these victims have been identified, there remain around 70 who have not yet been identified and detectives are keen to speak with them Top cop led on the case

Mabs, who now works for Greater Manchester Police says: "Reynhard Sinaga is a depraved individual, who targeted potentially vulnerable men that he had spotted walking on their own after a night out

"To the rest of the world he came across as an engaged member of society who was studying for a PHD qualification and had a small circle of law-abiding friends that he would socialise with.

"However beneath that facade was a serial sex offender, who we now believe to be Britain's most prolific rapist. The fact that he was able to cover-up his true nature for so long, just serves as further evidence of his calculating criminal nature.

The ACC also paid tribute to Sinaga's victims, many of whom did not know for certain what had happened to them until they received a visit from the police, after they had been identified from the videos taken by their abuser.

"I can only imagine how devastating this news must have been for them but the bravery that these men have shown in engaging with officers and support workers in an effort to come to terms with what happened is nothing short of incredible.' comments Mr Hussain.

"Many of these men

have stood up in court and provided evidence, which detailed the significant impact these offences have had on their lives. We appreciate this can be a daunting experience and it truly does take a lot of courage to stand up in court and tell your story.

Deeply disturbing case

"Finally, I would like to thank the investigation team, led by Detective Inspector Zed Ali, for the meticulous work that they have put in since this inquiry was launched.

"They, along with colleagues from the Crown Prosecution Service, St Mary's Sexual Assault Referral Centre and made Survivors Manchester, have supporting and seeking justice for those affected by Sinaga their absolute priority.

"Even with the video evidence, this was not a straight forward case and it required round the clock work, including consulting with subject matter experts, carrying out detailed research, arranging pre-trial court visits for witnesses and other vital tasks.

"Many of the team also had to sit and watch the horrifying videos that Sinaga created, which has undoubtedly had a personal impact on them. "Without their work, there would be

more victims out there who were unaware of exactly what had happened to them and without any specialist support being provided.

"I hope the work of the investigation team sends out a clear message that Greater Manchester Police is prepared to invest time and resources into bringing those who carry out sex offences to justice as well as work alongside partner agencies to provide victims with any support they need."

Cochlear implants change the life of young boy "We were a bit anxious regarding the operation but we had to look at the long term," said Mr Ali. "The implants were switched on a month

The family of a schoolboy whose life was transformed following cochlear implant surgery are raising

funds to say 'thank you'. Swain House Primary School pupil Binyaameen Ali had the devices surgically implanted in both ears aged two at Bradford Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust's (BTHFT) Listening for Life Centre.

Three years on Binyaameen, now five, is a happy, bright schoolboy on par with his peers.

As a way of showing their gratitude, Binyaameen's parents, Muhammad and Renu Ali, of Bradford, have started fundraising to raise £3,000 for the Listening for Life Centre's Cone Beam Scanner Appeal.

The quest is now on to raise the $\pounds 190,000$ needed to buy a cone beam scanner, which will be used to scan the ears of patients and identify the best possible position for a cochlear implant's electrodes. Cutting-edge cone beam scanners provide significantly more accurate results than standard CT scanners and create less irradiation. Mr Ali, an Islamic Consultant, said:


"Having cochlear implants fitted has been life-changing for Binyaameen His hearing deteriorated from birth, but thanks to the cochlear implants he is able to hear and speak very well.

'If he had not had the cochlear implants he would be communicating via sign language. Hearing and speech are linked, and thanks to the cochlear implants, his speech and comprehension is improving on a implants, daily basis.

"Ťhe support, help and guidance we have received from the whole team at the Listening for Life Centre has been amazing. In line with our Islamic teaching of 'Like for others what you like for yourself', we just want to show our appreciation and help others benefit, like we have."

Binyaameen failed his newborn hearing screening and was referred to the ENT team at Bradford Royal Infirmary, part of BTHFT.

Initially, he was given one hearing aid as his right ear was fine, but after further testing audiologists discovered the hearing in this ear was deteriorating too, which led to him wearing hearing aids on both sides.

Soon after, however, Binyaameen was found to have enlarged vestibular aqueducts in both ears, and was referred to Professor Chris Raine MBE, a Consultant ENT Surgeon at BTHFT, to discuss having cochlear implants fitted.

Mr Ali said: "Because things kept changing it was more difficult. At one moment Binyaameen had one hearing aid, then two and then even they were no good for him. We were constantly reviewing where we were. "Discovering he could have

cochlear implants was a big relief. We were fairly anxious about whether he could have them, but then Professor Raine said they were made for kids like him. We were really grateful." Binyaameen had cochlear implants fitted in both ears at BRI in 2016.

after the operation and within about three months they were fully operational.

"Binyaameen wears them during all waking hours. We don't see not wearing them as an option.

"He goes out and meets people, talks to everyone, loves cars and is learning Arabic too! He also attends weekly football training and swimming lessons. During his swimming lessons he uses an aqua kit which allows him to hear whilst in the pool

"His confidence comes from the ability to speak which, of course, is connected to the ability to hear. The cochlear implants don't stop him from doing anything – they are there to enable him to live a normal life.

"We recently went to his parents' evening at school and were told he is performing at the same level as his peers, who are fully hearing. He is often recognised for outstanding work too.

"People think cochlear implants are restricting, but Binyaameen is developing well and thriving and there is nothing holding him back. We

are very proud of him." Mr Ali and his wife Renu, a Paediatric Diabetes Clinical Nurse Specialist at BTHFT, have now set up a JustGiving page to raise funds for the Cone Beam Scanner Appeal via the Cone Beam scaliner Appear via the Ear Trust, which funded the Listening for Life Centre and supports its work. "We are very grateful to the whole

team at the centre, including Professor Raine, audiological scientists, speech and language therapists and the technical unit, and we'd like to raise awareness of the amazing job they and cochlear implants do," says mum Renu.

"We'd like other children to benefit from the same great care that Binyaameen has had."

The hi-tech $\pounds 2.8$ million Listening for Life Centre, based in the grounds of BRI, is currently the only centre of its kind in Yorkshire, and one of only a handful throughout the UK.

Over the past 10 years it has become the home of cochlear implant technology in the north of England, which transforms the lives of patients with profound deafness.

Babies will be monitored throughout their first 12 months using specialist, non-invasive infrared (FTIR) spectroscopy technology provided by Agilent, industry partners of the collaborative study.

"Following birth our skin takes a number of years to mature before it gives us the protection we need from environment. our but without adequate protection our bodies are exposed to irritants, allergens and bacteria that can trigger a range of skin problems including eczema. "The early identification of high-risk

babies opens up the opportunity to

prevent eczema development, and could potentially prevent the development of other allergies too, the

added Dr Danby. The research learnings will also provide the opportunity for the medical community to diagnose as early as possible, to administer the right care and promote effective management of

Dr Alison Cooke, co-investigator from The University of Manchester, said: "Apart from the importance of early identification of high risk babies, the STAR study also provides a comprehensive dataset of skincare practices from birth, which will inform consistency in clinical practice for newborn skincare." West Yorkshire Police has launched brand and launched a brand new and innovative approach allowing witnesses of crime to provide their

statements over the phone. Initially being piloted across the Leeds and Bradford Districts, it will offer greater convenience and accessibility. The service requires the consent of

the witness, who must be over 18 years old. An individual's vulnerability is also taken into full consideration.

It will be available across a range of different offences and incidents, with each case individually assessed for its suitability. Those who agree will be able to

relay information about an offence 'down the line', which is then compiled by an officer directly into Force systems.

The witness will subsequently receive an online link via e-mail, which is retrievable from any computer or device.

To view and approve the content of the statement, it will require specific personal details and a security code provided by the officer

West Yorkshire Police. Assistant Chief Constable Catherine Hankinson said: "As a victim and witness focused organisation, we are doing everything we can to make the experience of engaging with the police as positive as possible

"By offering this service, it increases the convenience for witnesses and also allows them to remain in an environment, which is entirely comfortable.

"Not only does it remove the need to visit a police station to provide a statement, but similarly the journey of an officer in visiting an address.

"We are also saving thousands of pounds a year, having developed this







Body found in hidden in Batley bank identified as missing **Bradford** man

The grim discovery of a body found in a former bank in Batley has been identified as a missing man – Asghar Badshah, 39, from Bradford.

Police officers were forced to break into the disused Yorkshire Bank building on Commercial Street after being called to the scene.

His family say they have been left

devastated by his death. Two men, aged 27 and 30, and a 41-year-old woman have been arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to murder. Both men have since been released under investigation, while the woman is on bail pending further inquiries.

DCI Heather Whoriskey, from West Yorkshire police, said: "We believe he was last seen in the early hours of 30th November and I would appeal to anyone who has witnessed any suspicious activity in Commercial Street around that time or since to contact my team, so we can establish if this is linked to our investigation.

In a statement, his family said: "We as a family are deeply shocked and devastated by the loss of our dear brother Asghar Badshah. "His beautiful smile and

charisma, as well as his generosity will never be forgotten.

"We ask for privacy during our time of grief as our elderly mother is deeply upset at this time. We pray for justice for Asghar and appeal to the public for any assistance they can provide to the police in this investigation." The building on Commercial

Street had been previously occupied by Yorkshire Bank, but has been disused since the branch closed in 2016. Neighbouring shops and businesses were temporarily closed following the discovery.

Mr Badshah was last seen in the early hours of 30th November and reported missing on 4th December. Detective Chief Inspector

Heather Whoriskey, of the Homicide and Major Enquiry Team, said: "Enquiries are continuing into the death of Mr Badshah, who was reported missing on 4th December. "We believe he was last seen in

the early hours of November 30th and I would appeal to anyone who has witnessed any suspicious activity in Commercial Street around that time or since to contact my team, so we can establish if this is linked to our investigation.

Both men have been released under investigation and the woman is on bail pending further enquiries. Mr Badshah's family say they are 'devastated" after being informed of his death and they have paid tribute to the 39-year-old.



Murder investigation launched in Huddersfield

Police are appealing for witnesses following the launch of a murder investigation after two men were attacked in Huddersfield. The Homicide and Major Enquiry Team are appealing for witnesses to the incident which took place at about 11.45pm on Thursday January 16 outside a business on Manchester Road in Linthwaite. Officers were called to the location to a report that two men had been attacked outside the premises by several persons. A 53-year-old man suffered fatal injuries at the scene and a 39-year-old man suffered a serious injury. He is currently being treated in hospital. Four males and a female have been arrested on suspicion of murder and of

arrested on suspicion of murder and of attempted murder in connection with the incident and remain in police custody for questioning.

incident and remain in police custody for questioning. Assistant Chief Constable Mark Ridley of West Yorkshire Police, said: "This has clearly been an extremely serious incident and the investigation is in its early stages to determine exactly what has taken place. "We have arrested five people in connection with the attacks on both men and they remain in custody for questioning. "I wish to thank witnesses who have come forwards so far and I would appeal to anyone who has information or footage showing the incident or persons behaving suspiciously on the road just prior to it taking place to contact us." Man arrested in connection with police officer murder

A man wanted by police in connection with the murder of PC Sharon Beshenivsky has been arrested.

Piran Ditta Khan, aged 71, was arrested on Tuesday 14th January in Pakistan and has appeared at court in Islamabad where matters relating to his extradition were discussed.

He was remanded in custody to next

He was remanded in custody to next appear at court on 29th January. PC Beshenivsky was fatally shot when responding to a robbery at Universal Travel in Morley Street, Bradford on Friday, 18th November 2005. Detective Superintendent Mark Swift, said: "I would like to thank the National Crime Agency officers and partners in Pakistan who have made this arrest possible. possible.

"This is a major development in this long running investigation and their assistance in this matter cannot be understated.

"We are continuing to liaise with partners in Pakistan to process Khan's extradition with the intention of returning him to the UK to face court proceedings Six men have previously been convicted and sentenced in relation to the murder of

PC Beshenivsky.



Three men serving prison sentences for trying to derail a Leeds manslaughter trial by offering bribes to jurors have failed in a bid to get their convictions overturned.

Brothers Raja Hussain and Jonaade Hussain, and a third man Sum can Islam-Miah were part of a gang which attempted to intimidate jury members as they left Leeds Crown Court during a trial in 2017.

A fire alarm in the court building was deliberately set off and jurors were filmed by gang members as they gathered at an assembly point outside.

Another juror was also followed through Leeds city centre and ran into a bar to ask for help after being followed one

of the conspirators. The Hussain brothers were also convicted of firearms and explosives offences at a separate

trial during 2017. Raja, 33, was sentenced to a total of 30 years in jail. Jonaade, 29, was jailed for 15 years and Islam-Miah, 29, received a sixyear sentence.

The Court of Appeal have confirmed applications made for leave to appeal against convictions and sentences for all three defendants were rejected

earlier this month.

The jury tampering offences took place in February 2017 during a manslaughter trial over the death of 88-year-old great grandmother Betty Laird.

Mrs Laird died during a 'crashfor-cash' scam that went disastrously wrong. She suffered fatal injuries when

the Renault Kangoo she was a passenger in was struck on Old Lane, Beeston.

A VW Passat was driven into the side of the Kangoo in order to make fraudulent injury compensation claims from

insurance companies. Mrs Laird was in the vehicle with her friend Jeff Grimshaw, 77, at the time of the incident. She suffered multiple injuries in the

collision and died that evening. The court heard there was evidence that the defendants in the trial were involved in an organised crime network specialising in making fraudulent

crash injury claims. The attempts to interfere with the jury began on February 20, 2017, with the deliberate setting off of the fire alarm on the day Mr Justice Goss summed up the case after the court heard two weeks of evidence. The following day - after the

iury had been sent out to deliberate - approaches were made to jury members as they left the court building for the day. Mr Justice Goss later took the

highly unusual step of dismissing the jury.

He then took advantage of rarely-used legal powers which allowed him to continue to hear the case without a jury.


In a separate trial, the Hussain brothers were sentenced over a 'deadly armoury' of guns and explosives which was uncovered by police at an industrial unit. The pair were found guilty of

possessing firearms and explosives. West Yorkshire Police made the discovery at Bad Boy Motors, in Hunslet.

The pair claimed throughout the trial that the weapons, ammunition and gunpowder had been planted at the premises by others.

Jonaade Hussain's barrister, Abba Lakha, QC, said his client was a former Leeds Grammar School pupil who had gone on to study law and computing at Huddersfield University.

Mr Lakha said Jonaade then obtained a contract as a trainee solicitor in Manchester but gave the profession up, in 2014, after just eight months

Presenter Samira Ahmed wins Sex Discrimination **Equal Pay Case** against **BBC**

A judge at the London Central Employment Tribunal has ruled in favour of Samira Ahmed which see her triumph in winning a sex discrimination and equal pay claim against the BBC

The Newswatch presenter highlighted a "600% pay gap" in a row over unequal fees. She had claimed she was being paid a sixth of what Jeremy Vine received for a similar show.

The presenter's case focussed on her contracts on the BBC News channel programme Newswatch, which she has presented since 2012. She compared the £440 per episode she pocketed to Jeremy Vine's salary of up to £3,000 for an episode of Points Of View. The BBC had argued it was justified due to differences in news and entertainment shows

differences in news and entertainment shows.

Samira, 51, who also hosts Radio 4's Front Row, said in a statement: "I love my job on Newswatch

"I know that it is an important part of demonstrating the BBC service to all its audiences and the licence fee payers.

"I have a sense of pride working for a public service broadcaster which seeks to represent the

diversity of Britain and its licence fee payers. "I have a sense of pride working for a public service broadcaster that seeks to represent the diversity of Britain and its licence fee payers.

"On the back of my BBC ID card are written the BBC values which include we respect each other and celebrate our diversity' and 'we take pride in delivering quality and value for money' "I just ask why the BBC thinks I am worth only a sixth of the value of the work

of a man for doing a very similar job. Ahmed has been among the female talents at the BBC to voice their concerns over pay equality following the scandal over former China editor Carrie Gracie's salary.

'Precious and Rare' Islamic artwork to go on display in Bradford

An important conection of Islamic metalwork is to go on display at Cartwright Hall in Bradford as part of an exhibition, 'Precious and Rare: Islamic Metalwork from The Courtauld Gallery'.

The collection of ten remarkable pieces of Islamic metalwork, dating from the 13th to the 16th centuries, includes some of the finest examples of this intricate craft from modern-day Iraq, Iran, Syria, Egypt and Turkey.

The objects are on loan from The Courtauld Gallery in London as part of a four-date touring exhibition whilst it is temporarily closed for a major restoration project. The exhibition will be on display at the Bradford Councilrun art gallery from 25 January until 10 May 2020.

The Courtauld Gallery's small but renowned collection of Islamic metalwork was formed by one of the great Victorian art collectors, Thomas Gambier Parry, to complement his acquisitions of precious medieval and early Renaissance paintings decorative arts. anď

Many of the best pieces in the collection have been on Cartwright Hall to provide an permanent display in The opportunity for the local

pieces have ever been on loan before outside of London. The intricate objects have now been cleaned and conserved for the first time since the bequest was made, over fifty years ago.

The most spectacular piece in the collection is the Courtauld Bag, made in Mosul, present-day northern Iraq, for a noble lady of the Persian-Mongol court, around 1300-1330. It is recognised as one of the finest pieces of Islamic inlaid metalwork in existence, and is the only surviving object of its kind.

The free exhibition explores the origin and cultural context of these extraordinary objects, and offers an opportunity for visitors to learn more about a fascinating area of the arts of Islam. The objects will be displayed alongside paintings, photography, calligraphy and glassware from Bradford Museums and Galleries own collections.

Dr. Alexandra Gerstein, The Courtauld Gallery's curator of sculpture and decorative arts, said: "We are thrilled to partner with art works from The Courtauld Gallery.'

'Islamophobia a bogus label'

The Jewish Chronicle has come under criticism from Jewish groups after it published an article by Melanie Phillips claiming that Islamophobia is a bogus term that is used to silence criticism of the Islamic world'.

Philips wrote in the newspaper that the entire concept of Islamophobia was "profoundly anti-Jew" and had been invented to mimic antisemitism, adding: "To equate it with the dehumanising, insane and essentially murderous outpourings of Jew-hatred is obscene." obscene.

She said "the taunt of Islamophobia is used to silence any criticism of the Islamic world, including Islamic extremism" and "facilitates" antisemitism.

The Board of Deputies of British Jews said the publication of this piece was an error: "Anti-Muslim prejudice is very real and it is on the rise. Our community must stand as allies to all facing racism

The Jewish Chronicle's editor Stephen Pollard acknowledged that the article had been divisive. He said: "The Jewish Chronicle does not seek

to provoke but to inform and prompt sensible debate. So when there is such a reaction I take it very seriously and I apologise to any reader who is angered or upset by the piece." In November 2019, the newspaper was forced by the press regulator IPSO to issue a correction

after it could not substantiate claims made in an article about alleged bullying of Jewish MP Louise Ellman, then with Labour, in Liverpool by a party activist.

The regulator concluded the Jewish Chronicle "had not been able to demonstrate that it had taken care over the accuracy of the article" on certain points, and its conduct during the subsequent investigation had been 'unacceptable".

Leaked video shows police officers kicking and punching man during arrest



Lancashire police force has referred itself to the complaints watchdog after a leaked cctv video was posted online, showing officers using

officers using disproportionate force being used on a man during his arrest.

The video clip shows officers from Lancashire Police approaching the man who immediately puts his hands in the air and lies on the floor after an officer asks him to do so. The man being arrested has been identified as 34-

year-old Adeel Ashraf. As he lies face down on the pavement and officers

pavement and officers attempt to arrest him, one of the officers is showing repeatedly kicking Ashraf, while another punches him. Ashraf is surrounded by up to five officers, with a police dog also being held a just a few feet away. The arrested man has been charged with aggravated vehicle taking and dangerous driving. He has also been recalled to prison. Lancashire Police confirmed that the incident

confirmed that the incident

took place at 11am on 8th January on Lonsdale Street in Accrington.

A police spokesperson said: "The circumstances are that at around 11am on January 8th police received a report of a burglary at an address in Blackburn during which a

Blackburn during which a Nissan Juke car was stolen. "The car was later spotted by police in the Church area and pursued by officers to the Lonsdale Street area of Accrington where a stinger was deployed to bring the vehicle to a stop. "A man got out of the car

and was then detained by officers and his arrest is what is seen in the footage which has been widely shared. "We appreciate the concern that perceptions of the officer actions in this video have caused and we would like to reassure people that the incident is being fully reviewed by our Professional Standards Department. "In the interests of

openness and transparency we are also voluntarily referring the incident to the Independent Office for Police Conduct."

Breast cancer survivor marks her recovery

When 45-year-old Shamilla Mirza found a pea-shaped lump in her breast, she was shocked to be diagnosed with breast cancer.

It was a particularly difficult time for her family as Shamilla's dad had only died three months earlier from a brain haemorrhage. Shamilla from Manchester, had a

The campaign aims to help meet the cost of a new £150m cancer research facility. The new building will bring together the largest concentration of scientists, doctors and nurses in Europe to collaborate and accelerate progress for cancer patients. The world-class facility is due to

open in 2022. Adjoining The Christie NHS Foundation Trust, it has been purposefully designed to foster collaboration and speed up progress on behalf of cancer patients in the North West and across the world. Shamilla's bench will be installed in

Heaton Park where she enjoyed spending time during her recovery from cancer.

Shamilla, who works at a Tesco store, credits her family for their unparalleled support which gave her the strength to face the disease. Her mother Arshad Mirza and sister Nabila Mirza still attend every follow-

up medical appointment with her. Her two sons Zakir Baig Mirza, 16, and Zain Baig Mirza, 18, have also proved to be a great source of comfort.

She said: "I can not thank my family the enough for giving me the courage to face the disease and get on with the

treatment. "Plans for the new research building sound exciting and it's amazing that such a world-leading facility will be built on my doorstep in the North West. Research into cancer is the key to changing lives now and in future. Without it I simply wouldn't be standing – or sitting here today.

The new purpose-built biomedical facility will house several hundred in cancer research, including the first



Trustees Of A Charity Found To Be In Contempt Of Court

he High Court has found two former trustees of the Charity based in Bristol known as the Darren Wright Foundation which raises funds to support families of people with disabilities and life limiting illnesses to be in contempt of Court. In the case of Charity Commission v

In the case of Charity Commission v Wright & Another the Charity Commission (the independent regulator of charities in England and Wales) had made an application to the High Court seeking a ruling that Susan and Raymond Wright had acted in contempt of court by failing to comply with an order to supply them with evidence and documentation.

Following complaints by members of the public, including from families of beneficiaries of the charity, that they faced difficulties in communicating with the charity and accessing funds which had been raised on behalf of their family members, the Commission opened a statutory enquiry into the charity in November 2017 and began

investigating: • The

administration, governance and management of the charity by the trustees and specifically whether the trustees had: - acted in the charity's best interests in accordance with their duties and responsibilities;

- responsibly managed the charity's finances; and

- worked to avoid or manage conflicts of interest.

The extent to which the charity had operated in furtherance of its charitable purposes for the public benefit.
Whether any issues or weaknesses in

• Whether any issues or weaknesses in the administration of the charity were as a result of misconduct and/or mismanagement by the trustees.

As part of that investigation the Commission served Directions on the trustees requiring them to provide information and documentation about the charity and those Directions were endorsed with a penal notice. However, the trustees failed to comply and the Commission therefore brought proceedings against the trustees for acting in contempt of court.

acting in contempt of court. The High Court has powers to deal with an individual found to be disobeying a Direction of the Commission as if they had disobeyed a High Court Order and they can be found to be in contempt of court and the same criminal penalties would apply (the Court can impose a custodial sentence of up to two years).

The Judge found that the trustees had failed to comply with most of the Commission's Directions and he also concluded that it was proper to hear the application in the trustees' absence (they had failed to attend the hearing) although he did adjourn the decision on

the penalty to be imposed on the trustees to a further hearing thereby giving them another opportunity to comply with the Commission's Directions. The Judge also ordered that the trustees to be arrested and brought to court if they failed to attend at the further hearing. This is the first time the Commission has pursued such a case

through the courts. By pursuing contempt of court proceedings against the trustees, the Commission has shown that it is prepared to fully investigate wrongdoing by charities and their trustees.

Half of UK business owners feel 'overwhelmed' with the amount of paperwork they need to deal with.

One in five believe this has led to a slowing in the growth of their business, and 29 per cent have suffered a personal financial loss from not filing all the paperwork they can with the taxman. Another fifth feel so bamboozled by mountains of forms they haven't cloimed tay relief as a result

Another fifth feel so bamboozled by mountains of forms they haven't claimed tax relief as a result, potentially costing their businesses thousands.

Directors of UK companies believe their businesses have lost an average of $\pounds 17,907$ each due to tax relief confusion.

While fifteen per cent haven't claimed in the past due to a complete lack of understanding of financial jargon.

The research of 500 businesses also found just under half of those polled don't believe they have made all the claims their business is entitled to.

And a quarter were unaware claiming business expenses could reduce their Corporation Tax bills. The study found more than half

of those running a limited company (1.3 million limited companies in the UK) didn't realise they could claim back money if their office was based in their home.

Six in 10 owners didn't know they could claim for relief on medical insurance or pension payments for employees.

employees. While a further 47 per cent didn't realise they could claim for staff training, and 68 per cent wouldn't know to put through staff events. More than 50 per cent also didn't

realise charity donations, mileage or legal fees are also tax deductible

However, 18 per cent have mistakenly tried to put through everyday work clothes as tax relief – genuinely believing they were allowed.

While a further one in 20 cheeky owners polled via OnePoll have attempted to claim for home furniture, dental work – and even vet fees for the office pet.







How two women have formed an unusual bond due to a shared vision to help the needy

Ine Bradford based businesswoman recently partnered up with Pathway Kitchen in Leeds, following a campaign on social media to donate bag of essentials for vulnerable and homeless women. Prity has established a successful

Prity has established a successful award-winning salon called Prity Skincare located within the heart of Bradford community. However, getting here hasn't been an easy ride. Prity who came to the UK from India in the 90's worked hard to raise her family. Doing double shifts and working all hours, she saved enough money to open her own flagship salon in 2005.

Prior to opening her salon, Prity revisited family in India in 2005 and an experience there really changed her outlook on life. During her travels she met an old woman in a nearby village. The woman approached Prity as she was passing by, with tears in her eyes pleaded with Prity if she could help her. The lady who was probably in her 70's or 80's had highly severe and inflamed skin on her head and was in need of medical care which she clearly didn't have the money for.

"I remember I couldn't sleep that night; I just couldn't stop thinking about the old lady, wondering how many others were going through similar hardships and struggles." Said Prity

"The next day I got in touch with an old friend who was doctor in the area. I told her what was on my mind and that I wanted to help those who was less fortune than me for something as essential as medical treatment. From then on till today I have been fortunate and blessed to be able to donate money for the treatment of needy and poor patients in the downtrodden areas of India and Pakistan."

The patients in dire need of financial support for medical treatments are looked after with the help of contributions through a medical camp that is organised by the hospital. There are a couple of families in Pakistan who Prity and her husband support financially too and have taken the financial responsibility of the children from both families and a water pump is fitted in different villages each year.



Learning from her own struggles she knew more needed to be done, especially as she began to learn that here at home in the UK more and more people are beginning to rely on foodbanks or are yulnerable below the poyerty line.

vulnerable below the poverty line. Things really hit home recently when Prity's husband was admitted to Leeds General Hospital for an operation. While visiting her husband Prity would meet and interact with many homeless people.

"I saw many people who were homeless it was very saddening. It upset me." Said Prity "I felt a need that I should do

"I felt a need that I should do something, make a difference somehow even though at that moment in time I had no idea how. Whilst interacting with the homeless people the most common concerns I heard from them was the feeling of being invisible to the world is what really drags them down. For some a bit of human interaction with a stranger on the streets can give them





The female entrepreneur returned to her salon that day and discussed her experience with her team, who then suggested to gift the vulnerable and homeless with a bag of essentials. Immediately with the help of her team 50 packs were made which consisted of; sanitary pads, soap, lip gloss, tissue pack, sweets and a toothbrush. A social media post was then created to ask anyone who is struggling or for any organisations who work with the vulnerable to get in touch and take these packs as a starting point to help the needy.

Prity was inundated with responses, and out of the many replies, she chose to work with Candy Nicholson who runs Pathway Kitchen in Leeds for the homeless and unfortunate.

The salon owner chose Candy because she herself had a remarkable story and as a result of her adversity is today helping the less fortunate. Prity feels Candy is an inspiration

Prity feels Candy is an inspiration in what she is going through and how she deals with her adversities. In 2012 Candy met with a serious brain condition where there was no cure. Candy has had extensive brain surgery with huge risks. Candy is herself living on borrowed time, as the surgery was completed but the illness remains. So, Candy decided to put her efforts into giving back. In 2013 Candy climbed Kilimanjaro

where she raised more than $\pounds7,500$ for research of her condition which is called Chiari.

In 2014 Candy was to trek the Alps, three countries in three days but sadly it was cancelled, she did eventually achieve this in 2015 and raised more than £2,500 for Fanconi Anaemia, a life limiting condition which her neurosurgeon's son suffers from as a thank-you.

However, before achieving her goal trekking the Alps, Candy was disheartened when it was initially cancelled and felt useless. This gave her an urge to get back out there and do something else to help people. So, she took off on her own, driving from Wakefield into Leeds city centre, with a trolley full of food, flasks of hot coffee and hot tea, clothes and sleeping bags tied on her to try and make a difference.

She was inundated with messages after posting on social media warning her it wasn't safe out on the streets by herself this is when she encouraged others to come out and help. Candy built an amazing team of volunteers who come out week in week out no matter what the weather is like and that's how Pathway Kitchen was born.

Candy said: "Helping the homeless doesn't just mean handing out hot food sandwiches, clothes, tents and etc. It's about gaining their trust enough to get them off the streets. We've been lucky; we have been able

to get quite a few off the streets. One has moved away, lives in a flat and works full time, he's very happy."

Candy found her purpose in life and that is to help, inspire and encourage others to do the same, according to Prity Candy is an angel in disguise and has inspired her to want to do more.

The two women have now collaborated to do more with Pathway Kitchen, which kick started during the festive period where Prity was able to donate another 30 bags of essentials which were distributed on New Years Eve on the streets of Leeds. In addition, Prity made a cash donation which has been spent on socks, bras and boxer shorts, with some money left over which went towards buying bottles of water, snacks and biscuits to put in outreach packs that each homeless person takes.

Prity says that on reflection she has realised after meeting these individuals was that, homelessness can affect anybody, it's not just people that we believe may have fallen off the edge of the society. It can be you or me, or someone we once knew. She advises: "Please do not look away. There can be no greater cruelty."

Prity and Candy have formed a great friendship from their joint vision to help the needy and together they hope to continue working to support the work of Pathway Kitchen and are urging others to do the same.

The University has recently spent £115,000 on a major refurbishment of the swimming pool at The Edge sports centre, on the main campus, and £250,000 on resurfacing and renewing the shock pad on one of the Astroturf pitches in addition to improving dupouts and dugouts improving and scoreboards. Tackling youth violence

A joint initiative launched by the Hamara Centre and the Osmondthorpe Community Centre in Leeds will deliver a boxing project to tackle youth violence.

The government's response to England's knife crime surge has so far been to increase the use of stop-and-search without reasonable suspicion, introduce knife crime prevention orders and most recently to announce legislation requiring schools, hospitals and youth groups to report those young people at risk of being drawn into knife crime.

Academic research shows that punitive

approaches such as these can actually alienate young people and make the problem worse. Boxing, in particular, can provide an opportunity for young men in particular to escape a life of crime. The model has successfully been used in many cities across the country to tackle youth violence. Speaking to the hamara Centre, one young

person reported that Boxing gave them a break

from feeling angry. The Leeds project will consist of a boxing coach and a youth worker to support engagement

and well-being.

The Boxing coach will focus on the boxing element whereas the youth worker will focus on building relationships, managing emotions and exploring young people's attitudes and beliefs, as well as the opportunity to talk about goals and aspirations.

Volunteers from the community who are currently supporting youth sessions will also be involved in the delivery and support in engaging young people.

A spokesperson from Hamara Centre sau. "With our boxing project, a youth worker will conduct one-to-one's - giving each young person the opportunity to build a positive relationship and speak confidentially. "Relevant referrals and sign posting will be conducted for any additional support needs.

The full routes for the 2020 Tour de Yorkshire and Asda Tour de Yorkshire Women's Race have been unveiled at Leeds Civic Hall.

Both routes will be the toughest in the history of the race and feature more climbing than ever before, including the Côtes de Buttertubs and Grinton Moor – both making their first appearances since the 2014 Tour de France – and the return of the infamous Shibden Wall.

The sixth edition of the men's race will take place between 30 April – 3 May and form part of the inaugural UCI ProSeries. Its new 2.Pro classification remains the highest-possible status for a multi-day race outside of the UCI WorldTour. It encompasses all four corners of the county and takes in 160 villages, towns and cities along

the way. The Asda Tour de Yorkshire Women's Race meanwhile, runs between 1-2 May and will once again be one of the most lucrative races in the sport. James Mason, Chief

James Mason, Chief Executive of Welcome to Yorkshire, said: "It's exciting for me to be involved with the Tour de Yorkshire for the very first time and this year's routes look fantastic. Many of our county's iconic climbs are included, and we're particularly pleased to see Buttertubs and Grinton Moor making appearances after they were unfortunately cut from the World Championships route on account of the weather last September.

⁴Seeing the men and women tackle Shibden Wall will also be special, and we're delighted to be bringing the race to so many new places as well. We're lucky to have such a diversity of landscapes here in Yorkshire and these races will have something for every type of rider. I'm really looking forward to it and I'm sure we're in for some really exciting action."

Christian Prudhomme, ASO's Tour de France Director, said: "Once again, the team at Welcome to Yorkshire have done a tremendous job in designing such a beautiful, challenging and varied route and I am looking forward to seeing how both races play out. "They are both harder than

"They are both harder than ever before, and when you factor in the millions of fans that will be lining the route, we know that the 2020 edition will be one to remember."

Thursday 30 April – Stage One Men (176.5km): The Yorkshire Coast Stage –

Beverley to Redcar The men's race gets going in Beverley and proceeds to Hornsea before following the coastline in a northerly direction. The first intermediate sprint will be contested in Flamborough, and Filey and Robin Hood's Bay both make welcome returns before the first mountains classification points are up for grabs on the Côte de Hooks House Farm. With those in the bag, a second intermediate sprint will take place at Whitby Abbey, and once the riders have passed through Sandsend they'll be faced with the second climb of the day – the Côte de Lythe Bank. Any riders that fall off the pace on there will have to work hard to get themselves back into contention before the action reaches a gripping conclusion in Redcar – the most northerly location the Tour has ever visited. Friday 1 May – Stage Two Men, Stage One Women (both 124.5km) The Three Peaks Stage – Skipton to Leyburn

The world's top female riders join the action in Skipton and start in the morning with the men following in the afternoon. Both routes are identical and feature two intermediate sprints in the opening 35km. The first comes in Settle with the other following in Horton in Ribblesdale. The route then heads past the Three Peaks and Ribblehead Viaduct, and once the riders have exited Hawes, the Côte de Buttertubs will be immediately upon them. This rises to the highest point of the race and is one of two climbs that have not been visited since the 2014 Tour de France. The other is the Côte de Grinton Moor, and that fearsome double-header could see a few stragglers distanced before a fiercely contested finale in Leyburn.

Saturday 2 May – Stage Three Men (134km), Stage Two Women (114.5km)

The Heritage Stage – Barnsley to Huddersfield

The riders will loop around Barnsley Town Hall before heading out of town and the pace is likely to ramp up for the first intermediate sprint in Oxspring. Penistone and Holmfirth then both feature before the first categorised climb comes on the Côte de Netherthong. The Côte de Scapegoat Hill is next up, and once that's been crested the route continues towards Hebden Bridge. Here the two routes split. The women will immediately tackle the Côte de Hebden Bridge while the men commence an 18.6km loop which takes them into Todmorden and up a brutal climb bearing the town's name. They'll then drop back into Hebden Bridge and re-join the women's route before following it all the way to the finish. The Côte de Leeming's presence will prove taxing, but it's the Côte de Shibden Wall where the fireworks are most likely to be seen. This cobbled behemoth strikes fear into all those

who attempt it, and the fact it comes just 18km from the finish means it could prove a springboard for late attacks. Any sprinters still in contention will fancy their chances in the second intermediate sprint at Bank Top, but there's only likely to be a select bunch of stars who'll still be in contention when the race reaches Huddersfield. It is here that the winner of the Asda Tour de Yorkshire Women's Race will be crowned before the male riders battle it out for stage success.

battle it out for stage success. Sunday 3 May – Stage Four Men (177.5km) The Yorkshire Classic – Halifax to Leeds

Halifax's Piece Hall is a spectacular location for the start of this decisive stage for the men before they head into Brontë Country. Haworth's quaint cobbled Main Street will feature prior to the opening intermediate sprint in Oakworth. The first of seven categorised climbs is then looming large, and the Côte de Goose Eye could catch a few riders unaware coming so early in the stage. The action then returns to Skipton before the next climb comes on the Côte de Barden Moor. Once that has been scaled it's on to Burnsall where the riders hit the Côte de Skyreholme. In Greenhow the route commences a 64km loop which includes the Côte de Lofthouse. Anv stragglers that slip back on there will seek to regain parity on the subsequent descent into Masham, and then it's back to Pateley Bridge before the riders head back up the Côte de Greenhow Hill. A second intermediate sprint will be contested in llkley before the race hits the infamous Côte de Cow and Calf. The final climb will then be fought out on Otley Chevin and the race then sweeps into the outskirts of Leeds via Kirkstall Abbey. All the while the pace will be rising and the action promises to reach a riproaring conclusion once again along The Headrow
